
Right or Wrong Track

Overall, would you say that the City of Akron is on the right track or the wrong track?




Following Election

Overall, how satisfied are you with the quality of the candidates running for mayor this year?













Undecided and Leaning











Mind Can Be Changed by Candidate Support








Right or Wrong Track by Candidate Support




Importance of Issues

How important are each of the following issues to your choice of candidate for mayor?




Ranked Importance of Issues

Which one would you say is MOST important to you personally? Which one is NEXT most important?




Importance of Traits

How important are each of the following traits to your choice of candidates for mayor?





Which candidate do you think is best described by each statement?




Main Information Source

Where do you get MOST of your local news in Akron, including information about the 2023 mayoral candidates?






How Often Vote

How often would you say you vote?




Vote Intention


How do you plan to vote in the May primary election?








Race of Respondent


