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

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








2018 Hurricane Lane

If Category 2 hits Oahu, 52,000 households displaced – \$27 billion in damages – 2018 Pacific Disaster Center Study using FEMA HAZUS Tool.



To Prevent This



Tie Roof to Wall – Hurricane Ties/Clips



2 Saturdays and \$300 in material costs (seek advice of licensed architect or structural engineer first)

Or \$2,100 with licensed contractor








Almost every house in the State can be relatively easily retrofitted.







Average SST Anomalies 17 APR 2022 - 14 MAY 2022

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
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
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La Nina conditions likely through 2022.

Persistent strong vertical wind shear over the central Pacific



NOAA's National Weather Service Climate Prediction Center predicts:

2-4 Tropical Cyclones (includes tropical depressions, storms and hurricanes) forming or moving into the central Pacific

- 60% chance of below normal season
- 30% chance of near normal season
- 10% chance of above normal season

This is NOT a forecast of hurricane landfalls in Hawaii.



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
