On Saturday, August 8, great music showcases legendary singers!

7:00 pm | Reba McEntire Live From Madison Square Garden

HAVING SOLD MORE THAN 75 MILLION RECORDS worldwide, winner of the Country Music Artist Female Vocalist of the Year four times and three Grammy Awards, Reba McEntire has had an incredible career! A celebration of her decades-long success in the music business, this concert, filmed in April 2023, marked Reba's first-time headlining the iconic Madison Square Garden venue in New York City. Featuring some of Reba's biggest hits like "Turn on the Radio," "Can't Even Get the Blues," "Going Out Like That" and "Fancy," she is also joined on stage by Canadian singer Terri Clark for a Linda Ronstadt medley. This event was the final night of the Reba: Live in Concert tour which visited over 50 cities throughout 2022 and 2023.

8:30 pm | Dolly Parton: Here I Am

THE UNDISPUTED QUEEN OF COUNTRY MUSIC, living legend Dolly Parton has had one of the most stellar careers of any musician. In this documentary film, Dolly herself lets viewers in on her fondest memories, her influences and her legendary talent that has made her astonishingly successful and well-loved. With unprecedented access to Dolly, along with archival footage from concerts and interviews spanning her career, it's a captivating look at the spirit, soul and hard work of an artist who has inspired countless others. Dolly talks about her humble beginnings, her rise to fame and the crossover from country to pop, and her movie career, plus the singers and songwriters who inspired her. This moving, musical journey portrays an outstanding performer through the people and places that shaped her iconic career. 10:30 pm | Elvis '56

IN 1956, ELVIS PRESLEY WAS A 21-YEAR-OLD new singing sensation, and both he and his rockabilly sound were unknown outside of the South. Narrated by Levon Helm (The Band), **Elvis '56** opens a time capsule to reveal the legendary performer at the very beginning of his meteoric career. It captures the sights and sounds of that pivotal year using exclusive tour photographs, kinescopes of Presley's controversial appearances on TV, newsreel clips, and radio interviews. Footage of performances captures the young, explosively talented Presley on the brink of his soon-to-be superstardom. Just one year later, he achieved widespread fame, selling a billion records worldwide and becoming the highest-paid star in Hollywood. With a sound and style that uniquely combined his diverse musical influences and challenged the social and racial barriers of the time, he ushered in a whole new era of American music and popular culture. (**Elvis '56** also airs Wednesday, August 12, at 11:00 p.m., Friday, August 14, at 9:00 p.m., and Saturday, August 15, at 10:30 a.m.) ■

Nevelson: Awareness in the Fourth Dimension

A leading sculptor of the twentieth century, Louise Nevelson pioneered installation art with her monochromatic sculptures made of salvaged wood. She was born in Ukraine but mainly grew up in Rockland, Maine. She extended her art studies in New York, despite disapproval from her husband and his family, and later in Germany. This film examines the artist's work through Nevelson's own words and those of individuals who knew her intimately. It gives viewers a window to understanding the work of this artist whose unyielding dedication allowed her to achieve the artistic success she knew was her destiny.

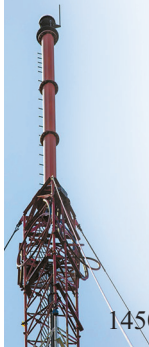

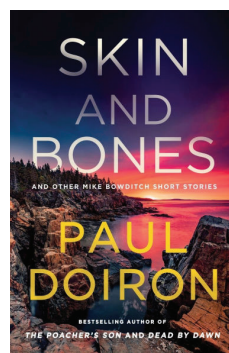


Skin and Bones and Other Mike Bowditch Short Stories this August

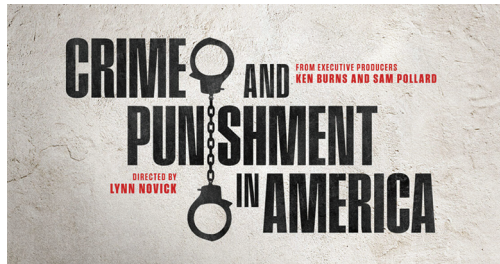
We encourage you to scroll through all of our Maine Public Book Club events from previous years on our website to catch up with some of your favorite authors and their works!

Crime and Punishment in America special screening in Bangor

Crime and Punishment in America, a new 4-part film spearheaded by Lynn Novick, is the first documentary series to tell the story of criminal justice in America from the colonial era to today and explores how for more than 250 years, Americans have wrestled with the problem of crime, the purpose of punishment and the meaning of justice. The series, directed by Lynn, (also known for her work on *The Vietnam War*, *Hemingway*, and *The Holocaust*), executive produced by Ken Burns and Sam Pollard, produced by Lucas Frank, Vanessa González-Block, Lynn Novick, and Prisca Pointdujour, will air over four consecutive nights on Maine Public Television beginning on Monday, November 16.

“We’ve grappled with crime and punishment since before our founding,” observed Ken Burns. “While this is not a uniquely American issue, it is unfortunately one we’ve struggled with largely unsuccessfully. It is also completely woven into the fabric of American life, a place where violence has often been glorified and racism too often tolerated. Lynn’s film asks all of us to try to understand why this has been such a challenging topic for our country and invites us to come together in conversation about what we can do going forward.”

Maine Public is very excited to bring to Maine a special preview of the series created specifically for our audience! This sneak peek will take place at the Gracie Theatre in Bangor in late August.

The special screening will be hosted by Jennifer Rooks with special remarks by Lynn. Lynn will join a panel including Maine Commissioner of Corrections Randall Liberty to discuss the series and answer questions and comments from audience members. This special event is free and open to the public, but tickets must be reserved in advance. Go to mainepublic.org and click on the Community tab to learn more. We hope to see you there! ■

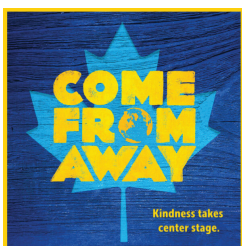
