Thank you for your letter dated June 5, 2025, responding to the document requests sent by the Department of Justice ("Department") in this matter. Based on your responses and other information we have gathered, it appears that Community Capital Partners ("CCP") has purchased the 402-acre undeveloped pasture in Collin and Hunt Counties, but has not yet sought any permits to develop the property, which is still in the planning stage. You also state that you expect to begin the permitting process for a residential development in July or August of this year but believe that full development may take several years. Finally, CCP has affirmed that all will be welcome in any future development, and that you plan to revise and develop marketing materials to reinforce that message consistent with your obligations under the Fair Housing Act.

Based on this information, the Department is closing its investigation at this time. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
