

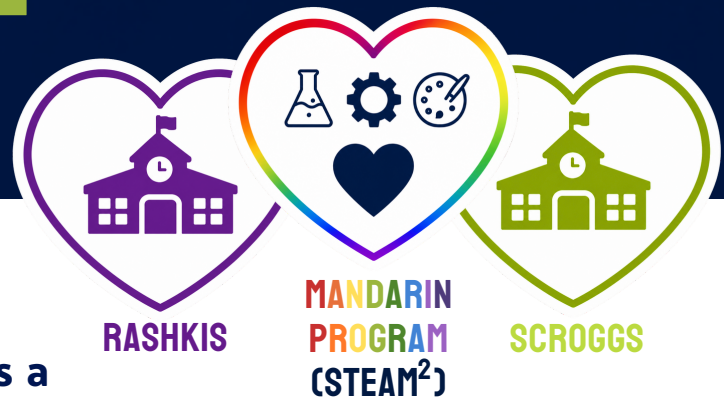

WHY OPTION 2

OVERALL IMPACT	 STEAM ² still exists  The board closes a Title 1 neighborhood school	 STEAM ² still exists  The board preserves a Title 1 neighborhood school



Both options involve changes for teachers, students, and families.
Option 2 preserves neighborhood schools and expands opportunities for language, culture, and community connection.
