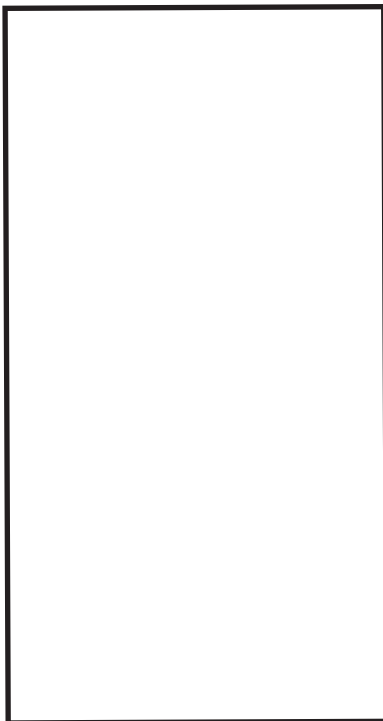

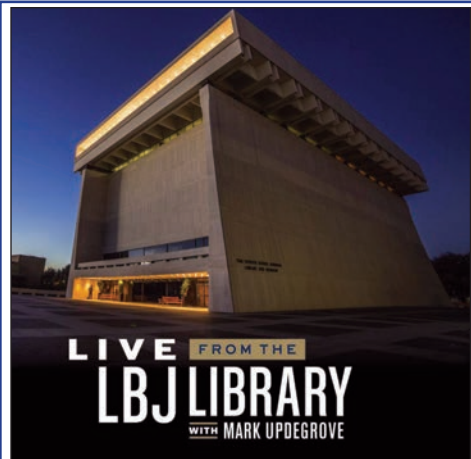

The series features interviews with Bryan Cranston, Andrew Young, a two-part episode with Doris Kearns Goodwin, Gretchen Whitmer, a two-part episode with Lawrence Wright, and others.

The Real Wild West

The Real Wild West is a four-part series focusing on little-known stories from America's Wild West. Beyond gunslingers and lawmen, we meet the diverse pioneers who shaped the country, including Black and Hispanic cowboys, female homesteaders, immigrants, and tribal leaders. From a range of perspectives, historians tell the story of the West from the beginning, starting with the history of Native Americans and the famous Lewis and Clark expedition. The frontier burst open to settlers looking for a new start with the prospect of furs, gold, and a free homestead. Political tensions led to conflicts, including a war with Mexico, a battle over allowing slavery in new territories, and the forced removal of Native Americans from their ancestral lands. The transcontinental railroad changed everything, and the West became a land of unprecedented opportunity, giving birth to the myth of the mountain man, outlaw, lawman, Native Americans versus cowboys, and an enduring fascination that continues to captivate Hollywood. Wisdom Keepers: Healing a Divided People

Thirty years after the acclaimed Bill Moyers series, **Joseph Campbell and the Power of Myth, Wisdom Keepers: Healing a Divided People** revisits the timeless questions that help us make sense of who we are and where we are going. These questions feel more urgent in today's world of rapid scientific advances, moral dilemmas, and political unrest. The program features intimate interviews with leading thinkers, mystics, historians, ethicists, faith leaders, and scientists as they address life's most fundamental questions that few of us have time to ponder. The program invites viewers into a space of deep introspection rarely found in our fast-paced lives.

An optician pursues deep brain stimulation surgery; a mother raising a pre-teen daughter becomes a boxing coach and an advocate for exercise; and a cartoonist contemplates how he will continue to draw as his motor control declines. Parkinson's disease (PD) develops when nerve cells in the brain stop making dopamine. PD strips away motor abilities, causing a wide range of symptoms, from tremors and falling to dementia and depression. "Matter of Mind: My Parkinson's" presents the poignant stories of individuals as they manage symptoms and treatments, along the way to living fulfilling lives. Each is a tale of determination where, through ingenuity and adaptation, they offer insight into what it means to live with a degenerative illness.

GENE HACKMAN STAR OF THE SILVER SCREEN



The biography *Gene Hackman: Star of the Silver Screen* delves into the extraordinary on-screen journey of the two-time Academy Award winner Gene Hackman (1930-2025). Hackman, who received Oscars for his iconic roles in the action thriller *The French Connection* (1971) and the Western *Unforgiven* (1992), remained a prominent and influential figure in American cinema for more than five decades. The biography offers a comprehensive look at his diverse filmography, featuring clips and discussions of his breakout performance as Buck Barrow in *Bonnie and Clyde* (1967), as well as his powerful dramatic work in films such as *The Conversation* (1974), *The Poseidon Adventure* (1972), *Hoosiers* (1986) and *Mississippi Burning* (1988). Beyond his dramatic talent, the biography also highlights Hackman's often-underappreciated comedic talents, showcasing his memorable performances in beloved films like *Get Shorty* (1995), *The Birdcage* (1996), and heart-warming *The Royal Tenenbaums* (2001). Samuel Habib's goals are pretty typical for a 21-year-old. Moving out of his family's New Hampshire home. College. Establishing his career. Dating. Yet every rite of passage is fraught with challenges. Unexpected seizures and uncontrollable movements caused by his rare genetic disorder. Friends' homes that are inaccessible to his wheelchair. His labored speech and use of a communication device are barriers to a social life. He craves more independence and a family of his own one day. "But no one tells you how to be an adult," he says, "let alone an adult with a disability." Samuel is determined to avoid the statistical realities: unemployment, isolation, institutionalization. A turning point comes when he starts talking to disabled adults who have been through all he is going through now. And when he begins to channel their insights, a roadmap for himself, and for other young adults like him, begins to take shape.

RENAISSANCE

THE BLOOD AND THE BEAUTY



Experience Michelangelo and Leonardo clash and compete in the fierce world of Renaissance Italy.

The Renaissance was a time of unparalleled creativity, artistic rivalry, and human ambition, and the first episode of **Renaissance** dives deep into this turbulent period. Picture Florence at the cusp of the 15th century—a city alive with the hum of merchants, the jingle of coins, and the stroke of artists’ brushes. Amidst its famed banking and trade, Florence bustled with the promise of innovation. Yet, for those aspiring to shape the future with paint and stone, the road was fraught with struggle and uncertainty.

Michelangelo Buonarroti and Leonardo da Vinci struggle to find work and navigate the whims of patrons in Renaissance Florence. But being an artist is still a lowly trade. The young Michelangelo is nonetheless determined to become an artist, defying the wishes of his father, and is lucky enough to catch the eye of the de facto ruler of Florence, Lorenzo de’ Medici. But Leonardo da Vinci is less fortunate. Struggling to find sufficient commissions in Florence, he instead offers his services to Ludovico Sforza, the Duke of Milan, a violent and dangerous man whom Leonardo approaches not as an artist but as an engineer, able to design weapons of war.

In the second episode, we return to the thriving heart of Florence, where the city is on the cusp of transformation once more. It is 1501, and two familiar faces are making their way back—Leonardo da Vinci and Michelangelo Buonarroti. Both are older, wiser, and more ambitious than ever, riding high on the waves of their recent successes. Each of them is determined to claim the title of Florence’s greatest artist. This is not just about art; it is about legacy, about leaving a mark so deep that time itself cannot erase it. Meanwhile, a third contender emerges: Raphael Santi, a young prodigy from Urbino, who has arrived in Florence to learn all he can from the two master artists. But it isn’t long before he starts to win work, taking commissions from the two older men. Michelangelo, in particular, sees Raphael as a direct threat and angrily criticizes him as a plagiarist. The artistic rivalry in Florence is set to become even more intense.

Michelangelo’s rivalry with Raphael reaches new heights while a violent religious schism engulfs Europe. The final episode plunges us into the heart of this fierce rivalry that shaped the artistic legacy of the Vatican. Michelangelo and Raphael find themselves working mere steps from one another in an unwitting competition that would define their careers and captivate the ages. Their shared battleground: the very walls of the Apostolic Palace in Vatican City. Michelangelo sets to work on the Sistine Chapel; his rival Raphael is working on the pope’s private apartments just a few hundred meters away. Each man is determined to outdo the other and win the favor of the pontiff. Meanwhile, Raphael unveils *The School of Athens*: a work of iconic beauty that casts Julius II as the inheritor of the wisdom of the classical world, with the figures of Plato and Aristotle surrounded by great thinkers.

SLUMLORD MILLIONAIRE

“Slumlord Millionaire” on **VOCES** explores the rapid gentrification of New York City neighborhoods and the housing crisis sweeping not only New York but the nation. Median rents nationwide are higher than ever, and, in Manhattan, the average rent is now almost \$5,000 per month. As rents increase, some landlords have become aggressive in getting long-term tenants to leave: ignoring repairs, turning off heat and gas, and doing nothing to eliminate mold and vermin infestations. The landlord’s goal is to make the apartment so uninhabitable that residents are forced out, allowing them to deregulate the apartment and turn it over to market rate for a high profit. These actions drive up costs in the already unaffordable housing market and displace families who make up the fabric of these neighborhoods, changing communities forever.
