Around the World in 80 Days

Literature's most famous race against the calendar comes to **Masterpiece** with an innovative adaptation of Jules Verne's classic novel *Around The World In Eighty Days*, airing in eight thrilling episodes.

David Tennant (*Doctor Who*) stars as literature's greatest explorer, Phileas Fogg, the Englishman who bets a fortune that he can circumnavigate the planet in a mere eighty days—quite a feat in 1872.

Fogg is joined on his remarkable journey by his irrepressible valet, Jean Passepartout, and by a determined and headstrong journalist, Abigail "Fix" Fortescue.

The miniseries follows our heroes as they head east from London on October 5, 1872, intending to make it back to the reading room of the city's snobbish Reform Club no later than one o'clock on Christmas Eve. En route, they take ships, trains, balloons, camels, stagecoaches, and other conveyances, while meeting increasingly dangerous obstacles. At stake is a wager of 20,000 British pounds, equal to over \$3 million today.

Vienna Blood II

Season 2 of **Vienna Blood** promises to be just as gripping as the first. Once again world-weary Austrian police detective Oskar Rheinhardt (Juergen Maurer) and young doctor of psychology Max Liebermann (Matthew Beard) team up to solve crimes in 1900s Vienna. Based on the best-selling novels by Frank Tallis, they've been adapted by acclaimed Sherlock screenwriter Steve Thompson.

Max, who studied under Sigmund Freud, uses the psychology of criminal minds

to crack cases. Oskar has more old school methods but began to recognise in the first series how brilliant Max is.

The new season features three feature-length episodes beginning with "The Melancholy Countess," that opens in the autumn of 1907 with a depressed Hungarian Countess being found drowned in a bath. It's a deeply personal case for Max, who asked the Countess to stop taking her prescribed medicine and instead, to start participating in a course of Freud's talking cure.

With his reputation in tatters, Max and Oskar set about cracking the case which takes a new twist when they discover the Countess was poisoned.

PURSING A MORE PERFECT UNION

The domestic assault on the Capitol complex on January 6, 2021, stands out as one of the most shocking moments in American history. The riot caused the deaths of five people; 140 Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia officers and numerous civilians were injured; and a hole was torn in the democratic system the nation has nurtured for nearly 250 years.

As the country continues to grapple with the activities of the insurrectionists and considers the lasting impact of this event, **Preserving Democracy: Pursuing a More Perfect Union**, a new two-hour documentary, examines the pursuit of democracy, within our nation and others, on the anniversary of the 2021 Capitol riot.

Providing robust historical context, **Preserving Democracy** chronicles changes in American ideas of democracy, from the American Revolution and the earliest days of the Republic through Reconstruction to the Civil Rights Movement and the suppression of the Black and Mexican Ameri-

can vote in the 1960s and 1970s. The film tracks former President Barack Obama’s path to the presidency. It also explores how identity politics and changing ideologies across the country helped pave the way to the election of former President Donald Trump and the events that followed.

Moving beyond the 2021 Capitol riot, the program surveys the formation of the U.S. House Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the U.S. Capitol, and what the committee is seeking to uncover.

The film looks to the present and future, including the push to educate voters on shifting voting rights rules and the role of a civics curriculum in education to engage and foster an informed citizenry. It features interviews with a wide range of political experts, activists, journalists and historians.

Preserving Democracy: Pursuing a More Perfect Union airs on 3-2 Thursday, the 6th at 7:00 p.m. and Monday, the 10th at 8:00 p.m. It airs on 3-1 Sunday, the 9th at 9:00 p.m. and Tuesday, the 11th at 7:00 p.m.

Medicating Normal

Fifty million Americans are dependent on, not heroin or cocaine, but on commonly prescribed psychiatric drugs. While the dangers of illegal drugs and opioids are well known, few are fully informed of the dangers of antidepressants, anti-anxiety meds, and stimulants before becoming physiologically dependent on them. These medications often provide effective short-term relief for emotional distress and other problems, but pharmaceutical companies have hidden common side effects and long-term harm from both patients and doctors.

Multinational drug companies spend billions of dollars promoting these drugs. Not surprisingly, the narratives extolling their benefits are often the only ones presented in the mainstream media. The other side of the story is not being reported, and it is a story of harm done.

Medicating Normal is the untold story of what happens when profit-driven medicine intersects with human beings in distress. The film follows the journeys of a newly married couple, a female combat veteran, a waitress and a teenager whose doctors prescribed psychiatric drugs for stress, mild de-

pression, sleeplessness, focus and trauma. Our subjects struggle with serious physical and mental side effects as well as neurological damage which resulted from taking the drugs as prescribed and also from attempting to withdraw.



Says one psychiatrist, “There’s not a chemical on the planet, to my knowledge, that can require years to taper—not Oxycontin, not crack cocaine, not heroin, and not alcohol. But psychiatric medications, any tapered patient will tell you, can take sometimes years if possible, at all.”

During the course of the film, prominent psychiatrists and scientific experts explain how it came to pass that—shockingly—one in five Americans take these drugs daily, and often for many years. Most people imagine dinosaurs lurking in warm locales with swamps and jungles, dining on vegetation and each other. But "Alaskan Dinosaurs" reveals that many species also thrived in the unlikeliest of places—the cold and dark Arctic Circle.

Nova follows two high-stakes expeditions and the paleontologists who push the limits of science to unearth 70 million-year-old fossils buried in the vast Alaskan tundra.

The ancient ancestors of today's Maya people thrived in large sophisticated cities across Central America for centuries. Why, around 750 CE, did they begin to abandon many of their magnificent cities?

He wanted to explore how engagement with the humanities could transform the lives of adults facing economic hardship and adverse circumstances.

But after spending years among these students, Rutenbeck is forced to come to terms with a flawed film premise and his own complicity in racist structures. In time, the film narrative shifts and his subjects become his producing partners. He finds out that when it comes to exploring the city's history of racism and gentrification, it's his own education he needs to reckon with.

Missing in Brooks County

Located 70 miles north of the border with Mexico, Brooks County, Texas is the site of an estimated 3000 deaths since 2008, as migrants try to circumvent the state's busiest interior immigration checkpoint and find themselves lost in the vast private ranch lands that surround it.

"Missing in Brooks County" on **Independent Lens** follows the journey of two families who have come to Brooks County to look for their loved ones who went missing. As they search, they find a haunted land where death is a part of everyday life. A gripping documentary mystery, it is also a deeply humane portrait of the law enforcement agents, human rights workers, and activists who come face to face with the life and death consequences of a broken system.




