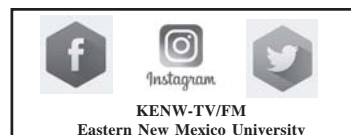

THE U.S. AND THE HOLOCAUST A HISTORY TO BE RECKONED WITH

The U.S. and the Holocaust, a new three-part documentary directed and produced by Ken Burns, Lynn Novick and Sarah Botstein, explores America's response to one of the greatest humanitarian crises in history.

Inspired in part by the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum's "Americans and the Holocaust" exhibition, the film examines the rise of Hitler and Nazism in Germany in the context of global antisemitism and racism, the eugenics movement in the United States and race laws in the American south. The film sheds light on what the U.S. government and American people knew and did as the catastrophe unfolded in Europe.

The documentary dispels competing myths that Americans either were ignorant of the unspeakable persecution that Jews and other targeted minorities faced in Europe or that they looked on with callous indifference. It tackles a range of questions that remain essential to our society today, including how racism influences policies related to immigration and refugees as well as how governments and people respond to the rise of authoritarian states that manipulate history and facts to consolidate power.

"History cannot be looked at in isolation," said Ken Burns. "While we rightly celebrate American ideals of democracy and our history as a nation of immigrants, we must also grapple with the fact that American institutions and policies, like segrega-

tion and the brutal treatment of indigenous populations, were influential in Hitler's Germany. And it cannot be denied that, although we accepted more refugees than any other sovereign nation, America could have done so much more to help the millions of desperate people fleeing Nazi persecution."

Witnesses who were children in the 1930s "...share wrenching memories of the persecution, violence and flight that they and their families experienced as they escaped Nazi Europe and somehow made it to America," said Sarah Botstein, a longtime producing partner of Burns and Novick. "Their survival attests to the truth of the remark made by journalist Dorothy Thompson that 'for thousands and thousands of people a piece of paper with a stamp on it is the difference between life and death.'"

The film features a fascinating array of historical figures that includes Franklin D. Roosevelt, Charles Lindbergh, Dorothy Thompson, Rabbi Stephen Wise, and Henry Ford, as well as Anne Frank and her family, who applied for but failed to obtain visas to the U.S. before they went into hiding. This unexpected aspect of the Franks' story underscores an American connection to the Holocaust that will be new to many viewers.

The film also looks at American policy on topics ranging from Calvin Coolidge's staunch anti-immigration ideology to FDR's Lend-Lease bill and how these fights took shape on the home front, including the emergence of Nazi sympathizers.

Some of America's most well-known leaders, such as Lindbergh and Ford, were also among the most vocal antisemites. Similarly, new light is shed on many of the well-known controversies surrounding the American response to the Holocaust, including the dreadful story of the more than 900 Jewish refugees aboard the MS *St. Louis*, who were denied entry to Cuba and the U.S. in 1939 and forced to return to an uncertain fate in Europe, and the enduring debate over whether the Allies should have bombed Auschwitz.

Americans had heard about Nazi persecution on their radios and read about it in the press. Many responded by denouncing the Nazis, marching in protest and boycotting German goods. Individual Americans performed heroic acts to save individual Jews and stood up to Nazism at home and abroad.

Some 200,000 Jews eventually found refuge in the United States, but many more were denied entry. As the Nazi terror escalated, the U.S. responded by tightening, not opening, its borders to refugees. "If I had my way," said Senator Robert Reynolds of North Carolina at the time, "I would today build a wall about the United States so high and so secure that not a single alien or foreign refugee from any country upon the face of this earth could possibly scale or ascend it."



Ultimately, **The U.S. and the Holocaust** offers little consolation to those who believe that the challenges posed by nativism, antisemitism, xenophobia and racism are buried deeply and permanently in the past. "The institutions of our civilization [are] under tremendous stress," warns writer Daniel Mendelsohn, who shares his family's story in the film. "The fragility of civilized behavior is the one thing you really learn, because these people, who we now see in these sepiatone photographs, they're no different from us. You look at your neighbors, the people at the dry cleaner, the waiters in the restaurant. That's who these people were. Don't kid yourself."

The U.S. and the Holocaust will be broadcast on 3-2 Sunday thru Tuesday, the 18th to the 20th at 7:00 p.m. and Sundays at 10:00 p.m. beginning the 25th. Watch it on 3-1 Sunday thru Tuesday, the 18th to the 20th at 8:00 p.m.

Ancient Sites of the World

Top Ten Sacred Sites

Many of the world’s most famous, impressive and amazing archaeological sites were pre-eminent sacred locations and structures to their builders. **Ancient Sites of the World** “Top Ten Sacred Sites” travels back ten thousand years to visit the world’s greatest sacred sites, relating the stories attached to the sites and exploring how and why they were sacred.

Starting with site number 10, the program goes back to 2000 BC Ancient Egypt with a visit to Karnak Temple, the largest religious structure ever built by human kind. At two hundred and forty acres, it was more than twice the size of Vatican City and represented the work of countless generations of Egyptian laborers.

For site number 7, we travel back about 400 years to Cahokia, a huge Native American sacred city just 10 miles east of St. Louis. The city flourished between about 900 AD and 1250. It was home to about thirty thousand people known as Mississippians and was ruled by the chief called the Great Sun.

Site number 5 takes us back to 300 BC to the Nazca Desert in Peru. In 1926, the first commercial flights over the area led to the discovery of enormous geometric designs unknown to the modern world and too vast to be appreciated from the ground. Thought to be evidence of extraterrestrial life, it was later theorized that the designs were part of a religious ritual to draw water from the distant mountains, the home of the Gods.

Other sites include Knossos in Crete, the Aztec capital of Templo Mayor, the Parthenon in Greece, Stonehenge, and the city of Amarna in Egypt, site of a religious cult formed by pharaoh Akhenaten, father of King Tut.

Must See Ancient Burial Sites

For more than seventy thousand years human kind has been burying and caring for the dead, from simple holes in the ground to monumental structures like pyramids, earth mounds and exquisite marble tombs. **Ancient Sites of the World** “Must See Ancient Burial Sites” goes back six thousand years in time to see the final resting places of some of history’s most powerful men and most loved women—tombs with sacrificial victims, beautiful decorations and golden treasure.

A thousand miles south of the Egyptian pyramids is Africa’s largest country, Sudan. Two and a half thousand years ago this was the land of Nubia, a black African kingdom, with more than 180 pyramids, almost twice the number built by Egyptians, though much smaller. They too were the burial places of kings and queens. Before they copied the Egyptian pyramids, Nubian kings were buried in huge burial mounds, along with as many as 300 sacrificed servants who were buried alive to accompany their king to the after-life.

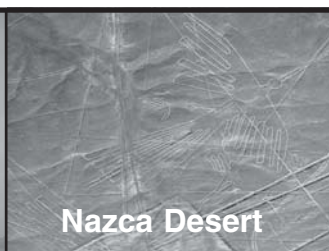
In the jungles of Mexico is the famous Mayan city of Palenque, re-discovered around 1750, and known for its Temple of Inscriptions, an eighty foot high pyramid with a temple on top. In 1952, a hidden staircase was discovered that descends right through the core of the pyramid leading to a secret burial chamber and the sarcophagus of Mayan King Kinich Hanab Pakal. Wearing an exquisite jade mask, Pakal’s body had been undisturbed for 1,250 years.

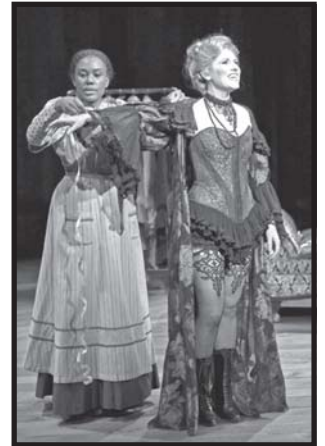
Intimate Apparel

Lucy Worsley Investigates The Black Death

In this new episode of **Lucy Worsley Investigates**, Lucy examines Britain’s deadliest pandemic, the Black Death, which struck in 1348 and killed an astonishing three million people—half of the country’s population. Scientists, historians and other experts help Lucy explore the wide-ranging effects of this unprecedented calamity on British society.

For centuries, no one could be certain what caused the 1348 plague. Then, in the 1980s, a vast mass grave containing the skeletons of 600 victims was uncovered in London. Lucy learns how DNA extracted from the teeth of these skeletons enabled scientists to finally identify the cause of the Black Death, a bacteria called *Yersinia pestis*—a pathogen to which the population had no immunity.

Lucy then travels to a small Suffolk village where rare court rolls reveal how the plague affected the lives of ordinary people. These fragile documents provide a unique window into the epidemic’s social, political and psychological impacts, revealing how the enormous death toll transformed religious beliefs, class structure, work and women.

Facing Suicide is part of a national initiative that draws attention to the country's growing rates of suicide—one of America's most urgent health crises. This ambitious project hopes to provide insight on the 10th leading cause of death that takes 45,000 lives in the U.S. each year.
