BENJAMIN FRANKLIN



Benjamin Franklin, a two-part documentary directed by filmmaker Ken Burns, explores the life and work of one of the most consequential figures in American history—a prolific writer and publisher, a groundbreaking scientist and inventor, a renowned diplomat and a signer of both the Declaration of Independence and the United States Constitution.

Franklin's 84 years spanned nearly the entirety of the 18th century, an epoch of revolutionary change in science, technology, literature, politics and government—change that Franklin himself helped to advance. He launched the first public library in America, organized a volunteer fire company, and founded an academy that eventually became the University of Pennsylvania. His annual publication, "Poor Richard's Almanack," [sic] set a model for future humorists such as Mark Twain, and his famous experiments with electricity led to one of his most important inventions—the lightning rod.

While Franklin was always looking to improve himself, his community, and humanity at large, he was also full of contradictions. He could be whimsical yet philosophical, folksy yet unforgiving, generous yet shrewdly calculating, and broadminded yet deeply prejudiced. Critically, especially for a man so associated with independence and individual liberty, Franklin enslaved people and did not become an abolitionist until very late in life. The Franklin household had at least six enslaved individuals.

In 1706, Franklin was born in Boston, then a small seaport outpost of the British Empire. At age 12, he entered an apprenticeship with his older brother James, a printer in Boston. It was in James' newspaper *The New-England Courant* that Benjamin was first published—under the pseudonym Silence Dogood.

In 1723, 17-year-old Franklin ran away from his apprenticeship and his home. He continued to work as a printer, and before long began a newspaper of his own, *The Pennsylvania Gazette*.

At age 42, Franklin retired from the printing business and devoted himself to science and innovation. Among his many inven-

tions were the Franklin stove and bifocal glasses, but it was his observations and experiments about lightning's electrical properties that drew him international acclaim in his own time.

In the wake of his scientific success, Franklin entered the world of politics, the field in which he would cement his legacy in American history. He served as an elected member in the Pennsylvania Assembly, which sent him to London in 1757. He would spend the majority of the next two decades in England, trying to solidify Pennsylvania's place within the British Empire. His work as an intermediary between the colonies and the king and Parliament would begin full of promise and end in frustration.

When Franklin returned home in 1775, he found America already at war. On his arrival in Philadelphia, he joined the revolutionaries and was named a delegate to the Second Continental Congress. Soon after declaring its independence, the new nation sent Franklin as its emissary to France and in early 1778, he was able to secure France's entry into the American Revolutionary War. It was one of his greatest achievements and critical to winning the Revolution.

In 1785, Franklin returned to Philadelphia and two years later, at 81, he was named a Pennsylvania delegate to the Constitutional Convention of 1787. On the final day, he made the motion for the Constitution's adoption. After it passed, Franklin's neighbor Elizabeth Willing Powel asked, "What have we got, a republic or a monarchy?" "A republic," Franklin answered, "if you can keep it."

In the last year of his life, Franklin took up one final political cause—to try and undo what he and the other delegates had done to protect slavery in the United States. Franklin presented a formal abolition petition to Congress. "From a persuasion that equal liberty... is still the Birthright of all Men," he wrote, Congress should grant "liberty to those unhappy men who alone in this land of freedom are degraded into perpetual bondage." The House of Representatives voted it had "no authority to interfere" on the issue. Two months later, Benjamin Franklin died on April 17, 1790.

The third anniversary of the tragic fire at Notre Dame Cathedral in April 2019 is a reminder of the strong emotional and historical connection that many people have with sacred buildings.

Secrets of Sacred Architecture unlocks the elements of design that make these structures so fascinating. Narrated by LeVar Burton, the film looks specifically at American sacred buildings.

Embedded in the architecture of these churches, synagogues, mosques, and temples is a secret language of sorts that influences both the faithful inside, and the broader culture outside. The film looks at the mystery of gargoyles, the psychology behind stained glass, the hidden meaning built into Frank Lloyd Wright's churches,

the influence of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein* on gothic architecture and the curious gargoyle on the Washington National Cathedral—that looks remarkably similar to Darth Vader.

Secrets of Sacred Architecture includes buildings from all across the United States, from the striking modernist chapel at the Air Force Academy in Colorado to the gothic St. Patrick's cathedral in New York—which was long the tallest structure in the city.

A full range of fascinating architectural styles are represented, including the "Moorish revival" synagogues in places like Cincinnati, the simple "carpenter gothic" churches of the upper Midwest, and the distinctive "megachurch" style of suburbs everywhere.

On the engineering side, the film looks at the tallest steeples ever built, and why some collapsed—like the spire at Tenth Presbyterian in Philadelphia. The largest church dome is also examined; the film explains why the Mormon tabernacle in Salt Lake City deserves that honor.

Secrets of Sacred Architecture will be broadcast on 3-2 Tuesday, the 5th at 10:00 p.m., Thursday, the 7th at 7:00 p.m. and Sunday, the 17th at 6:00 p.m. On 3-1 it airs Sunday, the 17th at 3:00 p.m. and Monday, the 18th at 8:00 p.m.

Unsettled History:

America, China and the Doolittle Tokyo Raid

The “Doolittle Raiders” were one of the most famous American aviation units of World War II. **Unsettled History: America, China and the Doolittle Tokyo Raid** examines a key moment in American/Chinese history, exploring how the two sides recall a daring 1942 raid on Tokyo, and how this shared event is remembered in different ways. April 18, 2022 marks the 80th anniversary of this pivotal World War II mission, which was America’s answer to Japan’s attack on Pearl Harbor.

On April 18, 1942, sixteen U.S. Army aircrews embarked on their first combat mission. They had enough fuel to reach their targets—military and industrial sites in Tokyo and five other cities—but not enough to go much farther. Even if they somehow made their way to the relative safety of China, no one knew they were coming.

In the film, the memory of the Raiders is kept alive by their children and grandchildren, as well as by descendants of the courageous Chinese men and women who rescued many of them from likely capture, torture, or even death at the hands of the Japanese military.

Unsettled History: America, China and the Doolittle Tokyo Raid will be broadcast on 3-2 Monday, the 18th at 8:00 p.m. and Friday, the 22nd at 11:00 p.m. It can be seen on 3-1 Monday, the 18th at 7:00 p.m.



Following their successful mission, 15 out of the 16 Doolittle Raiders aircraft flew to the relative safety of China. Crews either crash landed or bailed out. Most were rescued by ordinary Chinese farmers, fishermen and local militia members.

Determined: Fighting Alzheimer’s

“Determined: Fighting Alzheimer’s” on **Nova** follows three women at risk of developing Alzheimer’s as they join a groundbreaking study to try to prevent the disease. After losing their mothers to the disease, these daughters are determined to contribute to the search for a cure. Meanwhile, they share their ups and downs, anxiously watch for symptoms, and hope they can make a difference.

Filmed over five years, the film intimately shows what happens when human test subjects—who are at high risk for developing Alzheimer’s disease—offer their blood, brains and hearts to conquer it.

Since Dr. Mark Sager took the initiative in 2001, medical research scientists at the Wisconsin Alzheimer’s Institute have been on a mission—to figure out how to prevent, and eventually cure, Alzheimer’s disease. Their method is to track the characteristics and habits of people at high risk for the disease, and to observe them in biological detail as they age. Some convert to Alzheimer’s disease and some do not. Why?

At the heart of the Alzheimer’s study are the test group participants—middle-aged adults with a deceased or living parent with Alzheimer’s disease. Parental history makes the test group 2.5x more likely to get the disease than those without a history of it in their families.

The human research subjects are followed by the scientists for a minimum of 15 to 20 years and undergo periodic and rigorous cognitive tests. The test group also shares one of life’s most difficult trials—a parent’s decline from Alzheimer’s disease.

Marx was referred to by *The New York Times* as “America’s most gifted funny man.”

Rise of the Nazis Season II

Season one of the three-part **Rise of the Nazis** premiered in November of 2020. It offered an intimate analysis of how Germany’s liberal democracy was transformed into a violent dictatorship in four short years.

Season two of the **Rise of the Nazis**, also a three-part series, is the story of why dictatorships fail, and of the hubris that nearly destroyed freedom, but ultimately destroyed itself. Facing defeat on the Eastern Front, resistance builds as Hitler pushes Germany to untold destruction.

Barbarossa – The battles on the Eastern Front, a campaign that saw some of the most brutal and inhumane warfare in all of history, are viewed by many as the defining conflict of the Second World War.

Stalingrad – It’s 1942, and Hitler has just lost the Battle of Moscow. Now winter in Russia, German troops are in desperate need of fuel and resources. Hitler and Stalin take

charge of their armies, with no-one to hold them back. In Stalin, Hitler has met his match and it’s now a fight to the death.

The Home Front – After Stalingrad, Hitler’s stress intensifies. Deep rifts emerge, and his inner circle vies for power. The resistance gets a student voice, and an enemy with-in plots to kill Hitler. For once, there is no master plan, and Hitler leaves it to the men around



him to pull Germany back from the abyss.

A Wild Idea: The Birth of the APA

New York's Adirondack Park is larger than Yellowstone, Yosemite, Glacier, Grand Canyon, and Great Smokies National Parks combined. It is one of the largest unbroken deciduous forests on earth, with a thousand miles of streams and rivers, hundreds of lakes, and lofty peaks. Even more amazing, most of the land within the park is privately owned, and 85 million people live within a day's drive. Yet the Adirondacks remain largely undeveloped.

A Wild Idea: The Birth of the APA explores the creation of the Adirondack Park Agency 50 years ago, and the strident opposition to it from many residents of the park.

The APA was the first agency of its kind, transferring the rights of over a hundred cities and towns in the park to set their own zoning rules, to a state agency. Many residents of the park oppose these new restrictions imposed by the state, insisting that privately owned land is just that, private.

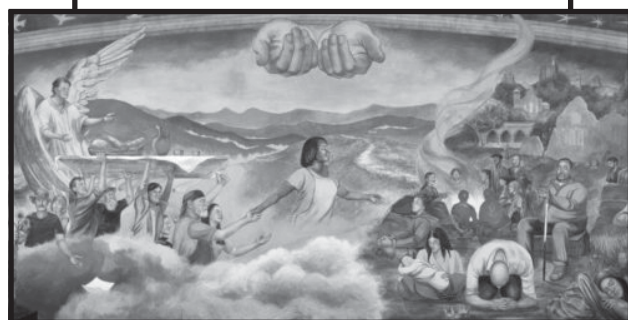

THE DIVIDE

McAllen, Texas, located at the southern tip of the state within the Rio Grande Valley, is the largest city in Hidalgo County. A true bi-national city, it is home to Whole Woman's Health of McAllen—the last abortion clinic on the U.S./Mexico border.

Since there is only one abortion clinic in the entire Rio Grande Valley, if this clinic were to close, its patients—both US citizens and undocumented people—would have to travel over 250 miles to access a full range of reproductive services.



"The Divide" on **POV** follows the stories of three Latinx people living in McAllen, Texas who, despite their views, are connected by the most unexpected of places: the last abortion clinic on the U.S./Mexico border. As threats to the clinic and their personal safety mount, these three are forced to make decisions they never could have imagined.

"AWARE: Glimpses of Consciousness" on **Independent Lens** begins as a science film but emerges far beyond the explicable.

"AWARE" follows six brilliant researchers approaching consciousness, all from radically different perspectives: through Eastern meditation, with high-tech brain research, by methodically exploring inner space through psychedelic substances, and by investigating the consciousness of plants. Scientists are coming to new insights, some of which have been integral to Indigenous knowledge for millennia.

The networks of consciousness are reflected in grand cinematographic imagery that reflects the vast interconnectedness of Nature – from the smallest organisms, to the world of plants and animals, and on to the cosmos. It invites audiences to review their long-held beliefs and assumptions and initiate their own consciousness journey, ultimately bringing awareness to awareness.

THE TRICK

The Trick tells the true story of the "Climategate Scandal" from 2009 by following world-renowned Professor Philip Jones, Director of Climate Research at the University of East Anglia, who found himself at the centre of an international media storm and the victim of cyberterrorism.

The 90-minute drama looks at the devastating consequences some hacked and leaked emails from climate change scientists had on those trying to prevent the crisis. Climate change deniers falsely used these as evidence that Professor Jones and his fellow researchers were faking the evidence that the planet was heating up to dangerous levels.

Jones faced a barrage of hate, including death threats, and it set back attempts to halt climate change for around a decade. The impact on Professor Jones himself was huge.

"Within a day or two reporters were gathered outside my house, knocking on my neighbors' doors, digging for dirt," he recalls. "I got hundreds of abusive and threatening emails. I knew the accusations were nonsense."

Jason Watkins stars as Professor Philip Jones and Victoria Hamilton plays his wife Ruth in this conspiracy thriller about an individual and a family being put through the mill by forces beyond their control.

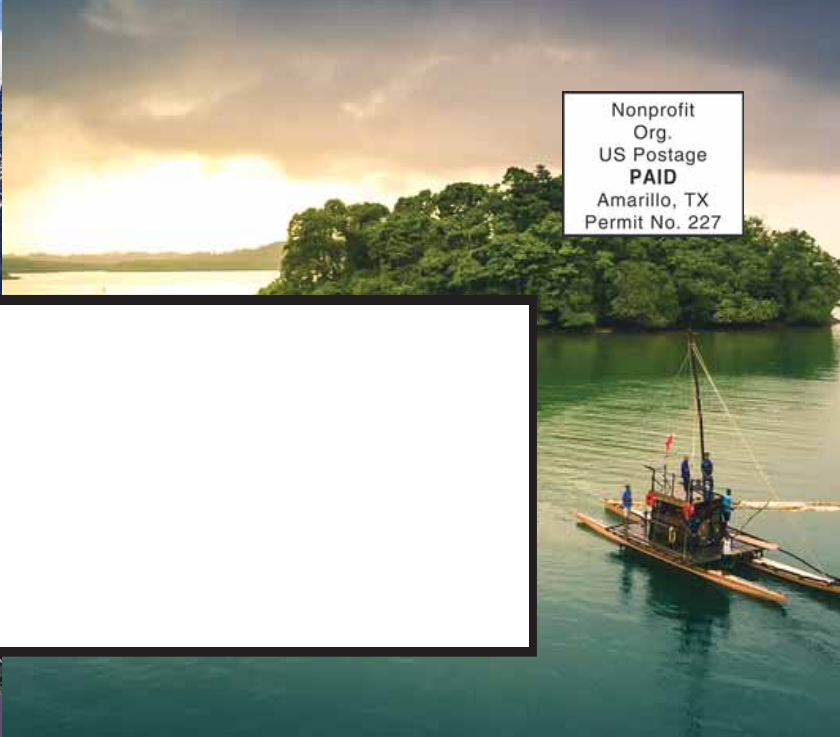
