Experience one of America’s most extraordinary waterways from an entirely new perspective in Chesapeake Bay By Air. Filmed from above, the program travels across the Chesapeake’s expansive waters, winding shorelines, historic communities and remarkable natural landscapes, revealing patterns

The aerial journey captures the bay’s wild beauty and quiet serenity while also reflecting on the history that has unfolded along its shores. Viewers follow routes that recall the explorations of Captain John Smith and his companions in 1608, while seeing how the region has developed over the centuries. From open water and marshlands to working communities and familiar landmarks, each view illustrates the scale and variety of the Chesapeake Bay watershed. Reba McEntire: Live from Madison Square Garden

Reba McEntire: Live from Madison Square Garden documents a concert by one of country music's most established performers. Recorded on April 15, 2023, the program marked McEntire's first time headlining Madison Square Garden and concluded a tour that visited more than 50 cities during 2022 and 2023.

The concert features music from across McEntire's career, including "Turn On the Radio" and "Fancy." The selections reflect the range of her work, from energetic country arrangements to songs built around storytelling, character and personal experience. The program also includes appearances by The Isaacs and Terri Clark.

Along with presenting a performance at one of the country's best-known venues, the program examines the stage presence and musical style that have shaped McEntire's career. Through familiar songs, live arrangements and interaction with the audience, Reba McEntire: Live from Madison Square Garden provides a record of an artist whose work has remained part of country music for several decades.

Elvis '56

The year 1956 transformed Elvis Presley from a promising regional performer into one of the most recognizable figures in American popular culture. *Elvis '56* focuses closely on that pivotal year, when his recordings, television appearances and electrifying performances introduced a new sound—and a new kind of performer—to audiences across the country.

Using archival footage, photographs and music from the period, the documentary follows the rapid rise of a young artist navigating unprecedented attention. Viewers see the energy and confidence that made Presley immediately compelling, along with the growing pressures that accompanied his sudden fame. The film places his performances within a larger cultural moment, when rock and roll was beginning to challenge established expectations surrounding music, youth and entertainment. Produced with cooperation from Elvis Presley's estate and RCA, the program allows the sights and sounds of 1956 to tell much of the story. *Elvis '56* captures a performer at the beginning of an extraordinary career and the unforgettable year in which popular music changed around him.

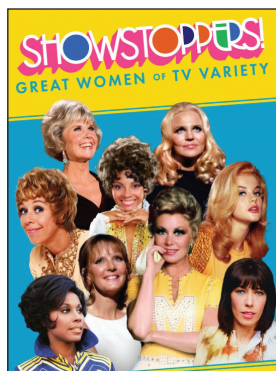
