It's officially 2026! We've enjoyed a wonderful winter so far and are welcoming the New Year with joy. As the news continues to unfold, WAMC remains your source for informative and engaging programming. Person Place Thing rings in the New Year with conversations featuring architects discussing light and the MoMA, insights from Jane Austen experts, discussions on economic development and preservation, and a conversation with a celebrated composer. [Person Place Thing](#) airs Fridays at 10:30 p.m. and Saturdays at 7:30 a.m.

This month on Earth Wise: Ammonia is produced on a massive global scale—more than 250 million tons in 2023—primarily for fertilizer and industrial uses, but it may also serve as a promising carbon-free fuel due to its high energy density and ease of storage and transport compared to hydrogen. A startup called Amogy claims to have overcome major technical hurdles by developing a catalyst that efficiently splits ammonia into hydrogen and nitrogen, opening new possibilities for ammonia-powered vehicles and the decarbonization of heavy, energy-intensive industries. Meanwhile, sand—second only to water in human use and mined at roughly 40 billion tons per year—is becoming increasingly scarce. Limited supplies of usable sand and soaring demand have fueled a violent global black market, making sand crime a growing environmental and social concern.
