The Untold Story of the Mother Road

The “Mother Road” as it was coined by John Steinbeck has struck a chord with Americans and an ever growing international audience since its inception in 1926. Its roughly 2,400 miles from Chicago to Los Angeles still represent the ultimate American experience, and almost 100 years later it still beckons the traveler. However, the narrative of the road, as conveyed by popular culture and historical works, has primarily focused on men and often overlooked the experiences of women and girls.

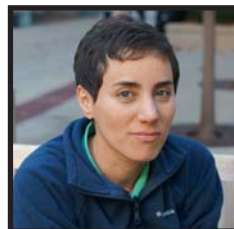
Route 66 Women: The Untold Story of the Mother Road, a three-part documentary film, uncovers the extraordinary lives and achievements of women who overcame gender discrimination and segregation to build fulfilling lives for themselves and generations to come on America’s most iconic highway. From entrepreneurs to waitresses, from anthropologists to politicians, from artists to military sergeants, these women transformed their communities and the American West for the better through their hard work, perseverance and ingenuity.

Route 66 Women airs on 3-2 Sundays at 10:00 a.m. beginning the 6th, Mondays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 14th and Sundays at 6:00 p.m. beginning the 20th. It will be broadcast on 3-1 Tuesdays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 15th and Wednesdays at 8:00 a.m. beginning the 16th.

The Mathematical Vision of Maryam Mirzakhani

Secrets of the Surface: The Mathematical Vision of Maryam Mirzakhani examines the life and mathematical work of an Iranian immigrant to the United States who became a superstar in her field. Dr. Mirzakhani was the first woman and first Iranian to be awarded the Fields Medal, the most prestigious award in mathematics, often equated in stature with the Nobel Prize. Then just 39, Maryam had “already solved enough of pure math’s Insoluble Enigmas to fill two careers.” Sadly, just a few months later, Mirzakhani died from



breast cancer at the age of 40. She left behind a legacy of passion and accomplishments.

Mirzakhani’s contributions are explained in the film by leading mathematicians and illustrated by animated sequences.

Her mathematical colleagues from around the world, as well as former teachers, classmates, and students convey the deep impact of her achievements. The path of her education, success on Iran’s Math Olympiad team, and her brilliant work make Mirzakhani an ideal role model for girls looking toward careers in science and mathematics.

New Season of Call the Midwife

Following an eventful Christmas special, the multi-award-winning drama **Call the Midwife** returns for season 11. It’s Easter 1967, and celebrations are underway for a colorful Easter bonnet parade outside Nonnatus House.

Sister Monica Joan and Reggie are excited about the Eurovision song contest, while Cyril and Lucille settle into blissful married life. Nancy, having just passed her midwifery examinations, is about to don her red cardigan for the first time. And Derek and Audrey Fleming return to Poplar with good news.



Also in 1967, The Abortion Act was passed, legalizing abortion in a wide range of cases. This has a big impact on the women of Poplar, and on the work of the midwives at Nonnatus House.

Call the Midwife has already been confirmed by the BBC for season 12 (2023) and season 13 (2024). This means that the story will continue until at least the end of 1969, and potentially into the 1970s.

Call the Midwife airs on 3-2 Sundays at 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. beginning the 20th. It airs on 3-1 Sundays at 6:00 p.m. beginning the 20th and Mondays at 12:00 noon beginning the 21st.

Sanditon II on Masterpiece

The plot thickens and romance resumes as **Masterpiece** premieres the second season of “Sanditon,” its fan-favorite drama expanding on Jane Austen’s unfinished final novel.

Its high-spirited heroine, Charlotte Heywood (Rose Williams, shown at right), returns to the picturesque coastal resort of Sanditon, along with the independent West Indian heiress, Georgiana Lambe (Crystal Clarke). A company of Army Officers descend on the town, offering romantic opportunities for Charlotte and her sister and business opportunities for others.



The returning cast also includes Anne Reid as Lady Denham, the chief investor in a scheme to turn sleepy Sanditon into a fashionable holiday getaway; Kris Marshall as Tom Parker, the visionary behind the venture; Kate Ashfield as Tom’s levelheaded wife, Mary; and Turlough Convery as Tom’s amiable brother, Arthur.

Marie Suize Pantalon: Itinerary of a Pioneer came from France in 1850 during the Gold Rush in California. In a cosmopolitan and essentially masculine universe, she became a successful gold miner and wine maker. She was arrested many times for wearing men's clothes. She decided to appropriate this as part of her identity and claimed the nickname: Marie Pantalon.

Marie was extremely famous and much talked about in the newspapers, but fell into oblivion. She was forgotten until 2004, when California's Amador County—known as the "The Heart of the Mother Lode"—celebrated its 150th anniversary, and decided to honor the memory of Marie Pantalon by naming her Sesquicentennial Woman of the Year. Historians and researchers describe the outstanding and entertaining life of this daughter of both France and California.

Phoebe Anne Moses, called Annie, first picked up a gun in 1875 at age 15 not to become a superstar, but to save her family from destitution. Thanks to her prowess with a shotgun, Annie became the family's primary breadwinner and paid off the mortgage on the family farm.
