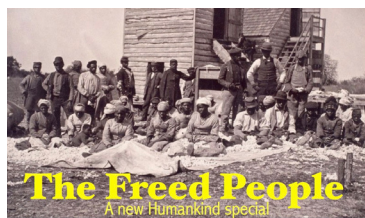

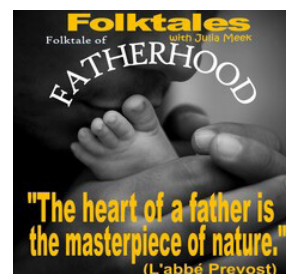

Dear Public Radio 90 Friends,

Thank you for your continued support of WNMU, Pubic Radio 90.

I am happy to report that we ended our Spring Fundraiser just over our goal of \$50,000! Thank you to each of you for being so generous and matching the \$25,000 pledge challenge from our very special anonymous Marquette donor. I hope that you will also share the value of Public Radio 90 with those around you. We continue to need to build up our membership base – the more members we have giving at various levels, the more stable we will be.

While we are beyond grateful to every single person who has contributed to our operations, WNMU Public Media is still facing a significant shortfall due to the loss of funding through the congressional rescission last July. A federal judge did indeed strike down parts of the president’s executive order that sought to prohibit federal funding from going to NPR and PBS because that action violated the First Amendment. The constitution does not allow the government to restrict funding based on a viewpoint, or retaliate against organizations in this way. This is a very important decision, but does not change the fact that Congress rescinded all federal funding for local public media stations. We continue to work with all of our national and local partners in an effort to restore all, or part of that funding. We also continue to investigate internal procedures and work with our state-wide partners in an effort to minimize any operating costs that we can.

June 4<sup>th</sup> is **Protect My Public Media Day**, which offers an opportunity to remind the public and congress that local public media stations are still here, still serving our communities in unmatched ways and still need federal investment to serve everyone, everywhere. Beginning on June 5<sup>th</sup>, the House Appropriations subcommittees and full Committee are scheduled to consider the Fiscal Year 2027 House Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education and Homeland Security bills. This is a key moment to remind our elected representatives how important WNMU Public Media is for our very rural region.

Finally, we are coming to the end of a very challenging fiscal year 26 and heading right into what may be our most challenging year ever - our first full year without any federal funding. This is why I am asking you to make your contributions right now, so that we have a budget that we can rely on this next year.

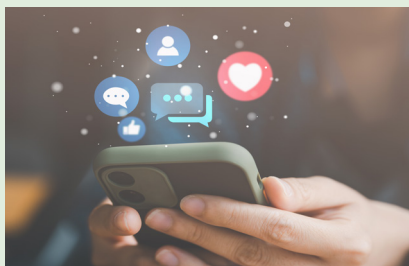

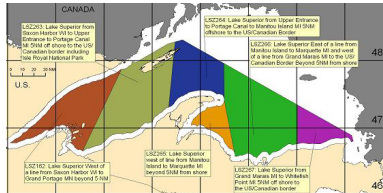

Marine Forecasts can be heard **week days (Mon-Fri) at 8:49 am, 11:59 am and 5:18 pm; and weekends (Sat-Sun) at 8:18 am, 11:59 am and 5:19 pm** (all times Eastern).

Please note that forecasts may be pre-empted during times when WNMU is using computer automated programming.

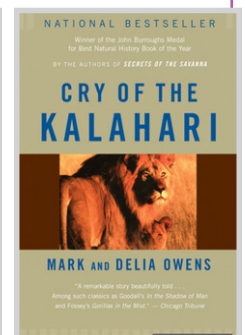
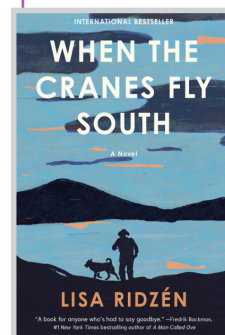

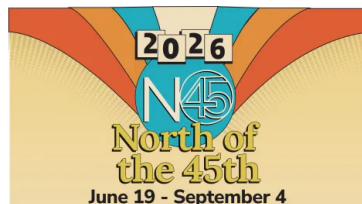

Carrying little more than a change of clothes and a pair of binoculars, two young Americans, Mark and Delia Owens, caught a plane to Africa, bought a third-hand Land Rover, and drove deep into the Kalahari Desert. This engrossing survival memoir details how they lived for seven years, in an unexplored area with no roads, no people, and no source of water for thousands of square miles. In this vast wilderness the Owens began their zoology research, a landmark study of animal behavior with creatures that had never before been exposed to humans.

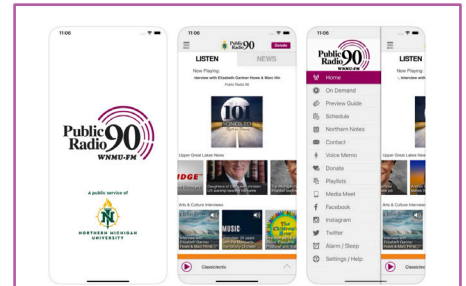
