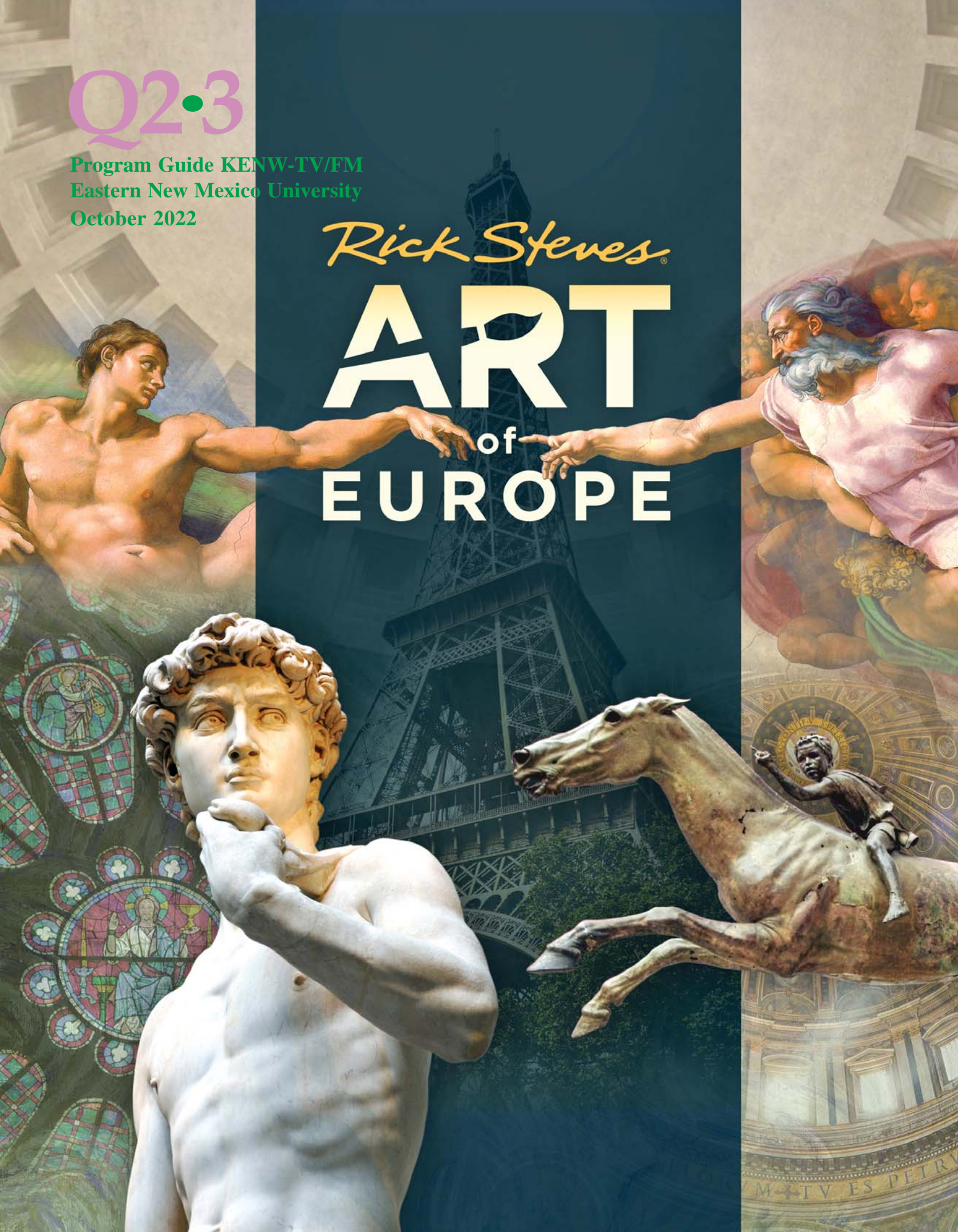

Miss Scarlet and The Duke



Victorian London's dueling detectives return for a second season of **Masterpiece's** "Miss Scarlet and The Duke," starring Kate Phillips as private eye Eliza Scarlet (shown) and Stuart Martin as her hot-tempered friend, Inspector William "The Duke" Wellington of Scotland Yard.

In an era of corsets, bonnets, and rigid patriarchy, Eliza Scarlet is England's pioneer female private detective, and a credit to her sex since she is arguably the nation's finest sleuth.

The new season opens a few months after the conclusion of season one. Eliza has solved her father's murder, her relationship with William continues to slowly simmer, and she continues to face the challenges of being a female private detective in male-dominated Victorian London.

Season two features six intriguing investigations, among them the search for a missing drawing by Charles Darwin, a murder that Eliza realizes mimics the plot of a mystery novel, a product-poisoning scheme, and a grave-robbing conspiracy.

Magpie Murders

"Magpie Murders" is a devilishly clever six-part mystery based on the bestselling novel of the same name written by Anthony Horowitz (*Foyle's War*, *Midsomer Murders*) and adapted by the author himself. Topping many best-seller lists including the *New York Times* and *Los Angeles Times*, *Magpie Murders* was also awarded the prestigious international Macavity Award for Best Novel 2018.

A whodunit without the ending? That's

what book editor Susan Ryeland (Lesley Manville) is faced with when she is given an unfinished manuscript by best-selling mystery writer Alan Conway (Conleth Hill), featuring Conway's longtime main character, detective Atticus Pünd (Tim McMullan). When Susan attempts to find the missing final chapters, she's plunged into a shocking mystery of her own, but has little idea that it will change her life. Annika

Set on a scenic river amid stunning Scottish lochs, the new crime series "Annika" on **Masterpiece** follows Nicole Walker as DI Annika Stranded (shown), the sharp, witty and speedboat-driving head of the city's newly-formed Marine Homicide Unit. MHU is tasked with investigating the unexplained, brutal, and seemingly unfathomable murders that wash up in the waterways of Scotland.



Throughout the six suspenseful episodes, Annika makes the audience her confidante by sharing her wry observations on the case and her life. Her effective M.O. is to link the crime under investigation to her obsessive reading of literature and mythology. For example, the harpoon manner of death in episode one starts her mus-

ing about Herman Melville's *Moby Dick* and its ruinous quest for a white whale, which provides an oblique clue to the murderer's motive. Another episode features the discovery of a corpse on the boat *Valkyrie*, linking the crime—in Annika's mind—to the female warrior deities who gave the vessel its name.

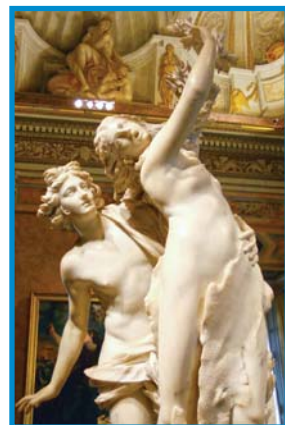

Downwinders and the Radioactive West

Downwinders and the Radioactive West chronicles the history of the US nuclear testing program, and shares the stories of those who lived downwind from the Nevada site.

In July 1945, nuclear testing by the U.S. government started in New Mexico with the Trinity site in Los Alamos, followed by three tests in the Pacific in 1946. The bulk of the nation's testing occurred at the Nevada Test Site in the 1950s, about 144 miles west of St. George, Utah. Residents of small-town Utah welcomed any opportunity to do their part for America's national security. "They would actually let us out of school, take us out on the lawn so we could watch the mushroom cloud come across us," said Mel Clark, Utah sheep rancher.

The first signs of trouble came from the sheep. Utah ranchers observed sheep with severe defects and were convinced radiation from nuclear testing was the cause. In 1956, the ranchers took the federal government to court, alleging the loss of more than 4,000 animals. They lost. Within years, communities in Southern Utah began to notice that friends, neighbors, and relatives were being diagnosed with various cancers and immune disorders.

In 1979, then-lawyer Stewart Udall agreed to take the case. In a landmark ruling in a Salt Lake City courtroom, the judge ruled in favor of the downwinders. In 1990, the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act (RECA) was signed by President H.W. Bush. The act provided a means for downwinders to file claims to receive compensatory damages. It has been extended through May of 2024.

Downwinders and the Radioactive West airs on 3-2 Tuesday, the 4th at 10:00 p.m. and Thursday, the 6th at 7:00 p.m. It can be seen on 3-1 Friday, the 14th at 9:00 p.m. and Monday, the 24th at 7:00 p.m.

TikTok, Boom.

How does a teenage dance app become an issue of national security? "TikTok, Boom." on **Independent Lens** explores the history-making app's journey from its early origins as a music app to its explosion into the global public consciousness.

"TikTok, Boom." explores the app's many layers by centering on three well-known Gen Z influencers and content creators on the platform. Intertwined with the stories of these creators are interviews with numerous experts across the fields of technology, policy, and media. Taken together, these expert interviews provide deeper insight into questions of security, privacy, data collection, and racial biases surrounding TikTok.

The film also delves into issues of teen mental health, the geopolitical tensions between the U.S. and China, and the effect that President Trump's proposed ban of the app in the U.S. would have had on creators and their careers.

Ricochet: An American Trauma

Ricochet: An American Trauma is a PBS NewsHour documentary examining the US gun violence crisis and the people it impacts most. The film shares the deeply personal stories of shooting victims and their loved ones, community leaders, gun owners and frontline health workers, among others. Suicide is still the leading cause of gun deaths in America.

A recent poll finds that 71 percent of Americans believe gun laws should be stricter, and one in five indicate a family member or a close friend has experienced gun violence or been threatened by it in the past five years. That number jumps to more than 50 percent among Black Americans.

At the same time, 60 percent of those polled still consider it important that people can own guns for personal protection.

Accepted



In "Accepted," high school seniors in rural Louisiana attend T.M. Landry, an unconventional K-12 prep school housed in a warehouse and known for sending 100% of its graduates to elite universities like Harvard, Yale and Stanford. The film follows students as they navigate daunting school days that begin at 8:20 a.m. and conclude at 8:00 p.m.

The T.M. Landry College Preparatory School first garnered attention in 2016 with a series of viral videos showing students huddling around a computer and erupting in joy over their college acceptance reveals.

It was a modern-day Cinderella story: in a community where the average annual household income was \$32,000, a school for underprivileged children boasted 100 percent college acceptance, with 32 percent headed to Ivy League institutions.

Then everything unraveled on November 30, 2018, when *The New York Times* published a 4,770-word exposé on its front page detailing T.M. Landry's history of abuse and doctored transcripts.

The Last Out

Three Cuban baseball players leave their families and risk exile to chase their dreams of playing in the United States. At the shadowy nexus of the migrant trail and pro sports, "The Last Out" chronicles their harrowing journey, from immigration obstacles to the broken promises of dubious agents. Against all odds, these young athletes try to hold onto their hope while fighting for a better life for their families.

An Act of Worship

Muslim Americans recount the past 30 years of pivotal moments in U.S. history and policy from their own perspective, in "An Act of Worship." Weaving together observational footage of activists who came of age after 9/11, community-sourced home videos and evocative recollections from individuals impacted by incidents of Islamophobia, the film opens a window into their world.

He has brought together election deniers, mask and vaccine opponents, insurrectionists, Proud Boys, and elected officials and leaders in state and local Republican parties. In the process, Flynn and his companies have earned hundreds of thousands of dollars.

THE WITCH HUNTS

Four hundred years ago, thousands of ordinary people, mostly women, were hunted down, tortured, and killed in witch hunts across Scotland and England. What started Britain's century of bloody witch hunts? LUCY WORSLEY INVESTIGATES "The Witch Hunts" uncovers the story of one supposed witch, whose case lit the fuse for the state-sanctioned killing of thousands.



The story goes that in 1590 a coven of witches gathered in North Berwick, a seaside town near Edinburgh, to cast a spell to try to kill the King of Scotland, James VI. Lucy uncovers a web of political intrigue that led to a woman called Agnes Sampson, a faith healer and midwife, being accused of witchcraft. Sampson was interrogated by King James himself, before being tortured and executed.

Under torture, Agnes gave the names of her supposed accomplices, some 59 other innocent people, leading to the first successful large-scale witch hunt in Scotland. Its brutal success became the model for witch trials rolled out across Scotland and England for the next 100 years.
