With 22 #1 career singles, 30 top 10 singles, nearly two dozen gold and platinum awards, a Grammy Award, and numerous other awards, Clint Black has had one of the most storied careers in modern

music. It has been three decades since the release of his debut album, *Killin' Time*, which cemented the country music icon as one of the truest traditionalists in the game.

In early 2022, the seemingly unstoppable legend was out on tour with his wife, Lisa Hartman Black, and his daughter, Lily Pearl, for the "Mostly Hits & the Mrs." Tour. Their appearance at the Johnny Mercer Theatre in Savannah, Georgia, was recorded on February 12, 2022.

On March 30, 1985, Syracuse, New York's Carrier Dome was the site of Prince's Purple Rain Tour performance that was beamed to millions live via satellite and captured for posterity as a Grammy Award-nominated concert film. It has since gone down in history as one of the most iconic live recordings in pop and rock history.

Now, for the first time, this powerful performance by **Prince and the Revolution** has been entirely remixed from the original 2" multi-track master reels. The program features smash hits from the seminal Prince albums *Purple Rain* and *1999*, including "Let's Go Crazy," "1999," "Little Red Corvette," "When Doves Cry," and a mindbending version of "Purple Rain."

Over the course of several weeks in the summer of 1926, Bella will discover exactly how far he's prepared to go to secure his wealth and status.

Brian Wilson: Long Promised Road

The principal originator of the "California sound," musician, singer, songwriter, record producer and co-founder of The Beach Boys, Brian Wilson is known for his novel approach to composition and recording, and is widely acknowledged as one of the most innovative and significant musicians of the 20th century.

American Masters "Brian Wilson: Long Promised Road" follows Wilson on a drive through Los Angeles with his longtime friend and *Rolling Stone* editor Jason Fine as they revisit the places that helped to shape his career. The filmed road trip features memorable concert and studio footage as well as interviews with Bruce Springsteen, Elton John, Nick Jonas, Jakob Dylan, and others.



Wilson's professional career began in 1961 and by the mid-1960s, he had written or co-written more than two dozen U.S. Top 40 hits, including the number-ones "Surf City" (1963), "I Get Around" (1964), "Help Me, Rhonda" (1965), and "Good Vibrations" (1966).

Wilson also shares intensely personal glimpses into his struggles with mental illness and drug abuse.

Paul Anka: His Hits and a Tribute to Frank Sinatra

Paul Anka burst on the American music scene in the late 1950s with a string of hits



that almost instantly made him internationally famous. As a teen in the 1960s, Anka became Las Vegas' youngest headliner and found acceptance with the Rat Pack. He honed his work ethic

following Sinatra's perfectionism and commitment to rehearsal. Sinatra tasked Anka with writing a song for Sinatra's final album before he retired, which led Anka to pen "My Way."

In March 2022, Anka returned to the stage to croon tunes honoring his greatest mentor and also songs from his latest album, *Making Memories*, plus greatest hits from across his career.

Jon Stewart is this year's recipient of the Kennedy Center Mark Twain Prize for American Humor. A star-studded lineup, including Stephen Colbert, Bruce Springsteen, Pete Davidson, and

Jimmy Kimmel, pays tribute to Stewart's humor and accomplishments.

Over his 16-year run as host of Comedy Central's *The Daily Show with Jon Stewart*, Stewart redefined political satire in American culture. His efforts in social activism have played an integral role in the passing of legislation such as the 9/11 Victim Compensation Fund Bill, which benefitted thousands of first responders and their families. Stewart also works on behalf of America's wounded veterans through initiatives led by organizations such as the Wounded Warrior Project and Team Rubicon.

Alzheimer's: What You Can Do delves into the research that shows how our social interactions, diet, sleep patterns, exercise, stress levels, and other daily health habits have dramatic effects on our cognitive abilities as we age. With scientific data and personal stories about holistic treatment approaches, the documentary explores the discoveries that are changing the medical profession's view of dementia.

Neurologists around the world now understand the influence of genes on the formation of Alzheimer's and dementia. As a graduate student, Dr. Rudy Tanzi, Vice Chair of Neurology at Harvard, mapped chromosome 21. He correctly speculated the gene helped produce Alzheimer's, and specifically that it was the gene that created amyloid plaques, sticky boulder-like materials that accumulate around nerve cells in the brain of early onset Alzheimer's patients.

Only 2 or 3% of Alzheimer's is due to specific hardwired genes that cause early onset. In 97 to 98% of Alzheimer's cases,

Tanzi points out, "it's the interplay of genetic susceptibility...and your lifestyle."

Dr. Tanzi has developed the acronym S.H.I.E.L.D. (Sleep, Handling Stress, Interact with Others, Exercise, Learning New Things, Diet) to represent deficient areas where anyone using everyday methods can

optimize programmable genes for better cognitive health. Experts discuss the dramatic impact of these six areas on our cognitive abilities as we age, and offer specific strate-

gies for implementing them in our own lives.

The show included aerial performances from the U.S. Air Force Air Demonstration Squadron, known as the Thunderbirds, F-35 Lightning II demonstration team, A-10C Thunderbolt II demonstration team, and several legacy aircraft, including the World War II hero, the P-51 Mustang. On the ground, a wide range of aircraft were set up as static displays and accompanied by aircrew to interact with spectators as they inquired about their jobs and the aircraft itself.

been born. Celestina, like Medeiros, also wanted to know the truth about her father's theft (he died when she was a toddler). That's when the idea for a documentary about the theft was born.

Ever since the Mona Lisa was stolen, there have been myths and misconceptions about the theft and the man who stole her. Mona Lisa is Missing separates fact from fiction to tell the story of the greatest littleknown art theft in history.

ENMU-ROSWELL OPENS NEW DAVID GONZÁLEZ KENW-TV BROADCAST STUDIO

A large crowd gathered in the Instructional Technology Center on Thursday, May 5, as ENMU-Roswell celebrated the grand opening and dedication of the new David González KENW-TV (PBS) satellite studio on campus.

The studio is now named in honor of former local TV anchor and news director, David González, who passed away at the age 63 on May 6, 2019. After receiving approval from the ENMU-Roswell Community College Board and ENMU Board of Regents, Jacob and Angelica Rodriguez made a \$20,000 gift to the ENMU-Roswell Foundation in December of 2021 to name the studio in honor of David González, Angelica's father.

ENMU communication students from Portales conducted interviews and taped the ceremony, utilizing the studio for the first time. The pro-



duced segment aired on May 6 as part of their final KENW-TV broadcast of the semester. *News 3 New Mexico* returns in the Fall on channels 3-1 and 3-2.



ENMU-Roswell collaborated with ENMU and KENW-TV staff in Portales to renovate and equip classroom and office space in the ITC for the new studio. In addition to broadcast programming, the studio space will be uti-

lized by students to prepare them for careers in film technology, journalism, broadcast production, or communications.

González was a Goddard High School graduate and received a degree in broadcast journalism from ENMU. Known in the community as "The Golden



Voice," he helped create and was the original host of the KENW-TV program, *Cultura*, *Orgullo*, *y Herencia*, now called *Cultura*. He was a reporter and anchor with KBIM/KRQE-TV for over 20 years and also served as news director and station manager. When he passed away, González was serving as the branch manager of Cable One, now called Sparklight.
