# **WQLN** in the Community

As the fiscal year began, the pandemic was far in the rearview mirror, and WQLN PBS NPR in-person events, combined with our quality programming, became a norm once again.

Our Saturday Night at the Movies program continued to be a favorite among viewers. Glenn Holland, emeritus professor of Philosophy and Religious Studies from Allegheny College, enchants viewers with personal insight into plot, genre, and actors in each film.

WQLN PBS, along with other Pennsylvania stations, produced a weekly high school quiz bowl. Glenn Holland hosted this fierce-but friendly-academic challenge. Twelve local schools participated in "Scholastic Scrimmage," and the Mercyhurst Prep team were the champions of the tournament. They also placed third in the state competition.

The WQLN PBS STREAM Machine's mobile learning classroom featuring science, technology, reading, engineering, art, and math activities, expanded our educational outreach in the community. The STREAM Machine travels to neighborhoods where our hands-on programs can help the most. This year, the education team served more than 2,100 students.


WQLN PBS produced and aired the 2022 Erie Philharmonic Holiday Concert at the historic Warner Theatre. WQLN NPR produced a series of live performances by young musicians and performers from local colleges and universities and members of the Erie Playhouse and Junior Philharmonic. Every Friday at 10 a.m., WQLN's "Live from Studio Q" featured Daniel Meyer, music director of the Erie Philharmonic.

WQLN's Sounds Around Town series gave local singers and bands the opportunity to entertain on the outdoor WQLN pavilion stage. These popular events invite community members to our campus to enjoy free concerts on Friday evenings in July and August.

We completed our first year of a new, immersive local history program called Chronicles. It features a weekly television series, online digital featurettes, and daily history radio spots. Episodes like "Rum Runners," "The Legacy of Charlotte Battles," and "Saving Erie's Character" are films that tell our story and create a community narrative. The Chronicles team is now in the middle of producing season two.

We are proud of what WQLN PBS NPR was able to do for the communities of the Lake Erie region in 2022-2023. As you read the rest of this report, we invite you to share in that sense of accomplishment. #### Chronicles

WQLN PBS premiered *Chronicles*, a weekly history series about the place we call home. This series takes a deep dive into all that makes the Lake Erie region remarkable, both past and present, and allows people to learn about the rich history of this region.

#### **Buckethead KIDZ**

BucketHead Kidz music program introduces fifth-grade students to percussion techniques. This year, music teachers from Erie Public Schools and Millcreek School District taught their students cool grooves and funky beats! Each student received a personalized bucket drum and sticks. The program promotes teamwork, improves focus, encourages friendships, and can reduce disruptive behaviors. Culminating the program was a district-wide jam session, involving all 300 students drumming together in the backyard of WQLN. Here's what some of the students had to say: I get to express how I feel. [Drumming] was very fun. I liked making music with the drums. I like learning the new songs. It was fun and enjoyable to learn a new skill. The beats are the best.





### **Erie Eats Tasting Festival**

In connection with a new show on WQLN PBS called *The Great American Recipe*, WQLN held an Erie Eats Tasting Festival featuring local restaurants. These restaurants were featured on the WQLN PBS digital series *Erie Eats*. In recent years, Erie's dining scene has enjoyed a renaissance, with diverse and creative fare that tempts the palates of a growing population of local foodies. *Erie Eats* showcases the culinary savvy of eateries in and around Erie and introduces local businesses to new audiences.

## **WQLN Education Ambassador Program**
