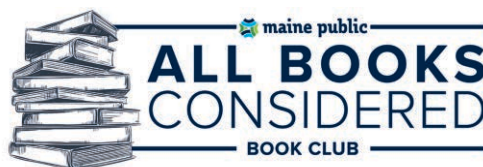

• **Celia Thaxter's Island Garden** – *Sunday, July 11, 4:00 pm*: The 19th century author and artist created a unique garden on Maine's Appledore Island.

• **Arcadia National Bar: From One Year to the Next** – *Sunday, July 11, 4:30 pm*: Video game industry historian John Andersen profiles a Portland arcade bar.

• **Creating Gardiner** – *Sunday, July 18, 4:00 pm*: Creative people and spaces in Gardiner, Maine, reflect a community that is constantly evolving and expanding.

• **Community Conservation: Finding the Balance Between Nature and Culture** – *Sunday, July 25, 4:00 pm*: Four active land trusts work with local communities to provide multi-purpose access to conserved lands.

• **You Can Do It in a Small Boat** – *Thursday, July 1, 10:30 pm; Saturday, July 3, 2:30 pm*: The raw beauty of the Maine coast is captured in a 500-mile small boat solo camping adventure on the Maine Island Trail.

• **Entangled** – *Thursday, July 8, 10:00 pm; Saturday, July 10, 2:00 pm*: A new film chronicles the efforts to protect North Atlantic right whales, the impacts of those efforts on the lobster industry, and the efforts to balance the vying interests.

• **Nakatuenita: Respect** – *Thursday, July 15, 9:55 pm; Saturday, July 17, 1:55 pm*: The Innu Nation in Labrador, Canada, is taking back control of their land, government, schools, social services, and their resources.

• **Maine Outdoor Film Festival** – *Thursday, July 22, 10:00 pm; Saturday, July 24, 2:00 pm*: For 10 years, the Maine Outdoor Film Festival has brought outdoor adventure and conservation films to Maine audiences.

• **Light Spirit: Lighthouses of the Maine Coast** – *Thursday, July 29, 10:00 pm; Saturday, July 31, 2:00 pm*: The 60-plus lighthouses on the coast of Maine are seen by land, by sea and by air.

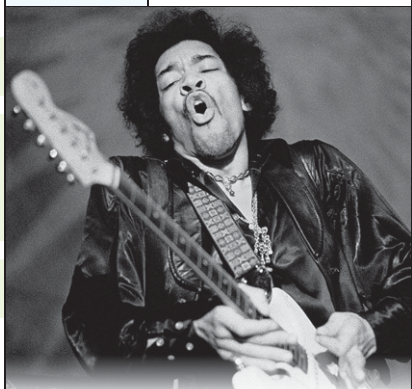

Premieres Sunday, July 11, 9:00 pm

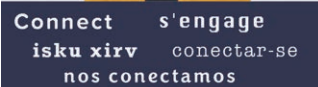

New Mainers across Maine have different levels of access to reliable information about what is taking place in the immediate world around them, whether they be pressing public health issues, school closures, or any variety of important news. This has never been more apparent than during the COVID-19 crisis. This is why Maine Public launched **Maine Public News Connect** – Maine Public news translated each week into Spanish, French, Portuguese, and, as of late June, Somali.

This video series presents important news stories from the Maine Public News team each week, translates them, and then makes them available on Maine Public's website, our YouTube Channel, and our Facebook page. While this is a “test” project running into the fall, it is Maine Public's hope that this series can be funded and continued for the foreseeable future. We encourage all our members to take a look at this vital project and help us spread the word that it is available today to new Mainers across the state. This news initiative was designed with the **Maine Immigrants' Rights Coalition** particularly with the help of **PresentMaine**, **Gateway Community Services Maine**, **Congolese**, and **Angolan** communities of Maine and through a partnership with **Amjambo Africa**. Support for the project has come from the **Stephen and Tabitha King Foundation**, **cPort Credit Union**, **Lee Auto Malls**, and **St. Joseph Healthcare**. Additional support has been provided by the **Maine Health Access Foundation**. ■
