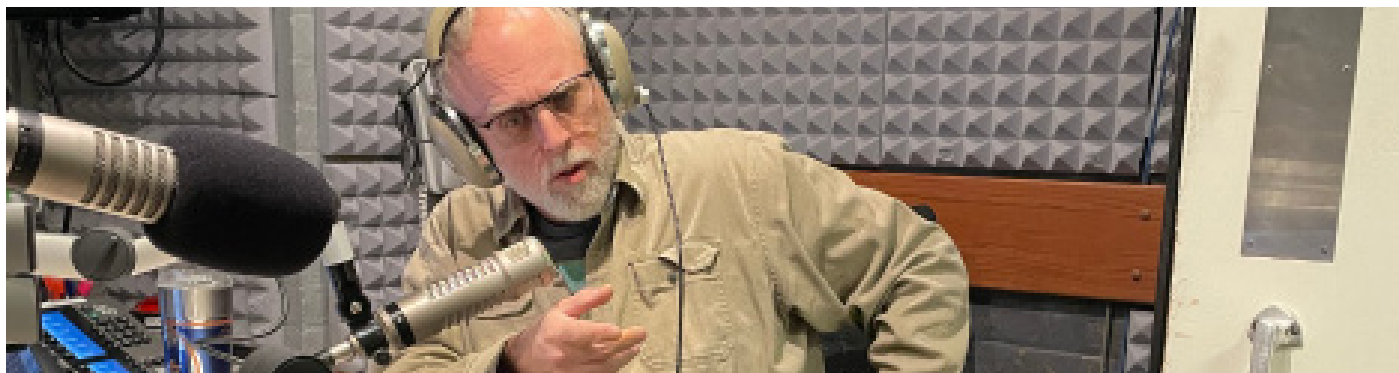

Celebrate Tanglewood on Parade – A Beloved Tradition Since 1940

Join us for "Tanglewood on Parade," one of Tanglewood's most cherished traditions, originating in 1940 as a benefit concert organized by BSO Music Director Serge Koussevitzky. Now an annual summer highlight, this celebration features dazzling performances by the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Boston Pops, and the Tanglewood Music Center Orchestra, culminating in a spectacular gala concert in the Koussevitzky Music Shed. Conducted by an all-star roster—Keith Lockhart, Elim Chan, Thomas Wilkins, Samy Rachid, and Na'Zir McFadden—the evening includes works by Copland, Barber, and Ellington, and concludes with the rousing 1812 Overture, complete with real cannons and fireworks. Don't miss the WAMC live broadcast beginning at 7:00 pm, with the concert at 8. Airing Aug. 5

Also, "Live From Tanglewood" starts this month! The summer WAMC staple has us enjoying the sunshine and picnics that much more. Tune in as we kick off another great season of broadcasts, beginning the weekend of July 5. We'll hear a variety of works from an all-Rachmaninoff program to an all-Beethoven program. We'll hear live performances broadcast by WCRB Boston from the Koussevitzky Music Shed at Tanglewood. The service of WGBH airs Fridays, 8-10:30 p.m.; Saturdays, 8-10:30 p.m.; Sundays, 2:30-5 p.m., Saturday, July 5 through Sunday, August 24.

On "Earth Wise," geothermal energy is emerging as a surprising bright spot in the evolving landscape of renewable power. While the Trump Administration reduced support for solar and wind, geothermal heat—long overlooked due to high costs and limited scalability—is gaining traction thanks to enhanced geothermal systems (EGS). These advanced systems tap into deep underground heat, using water pumped miles below the surface to generate electricity. Backed by tech giants, the U.S. Defense Department, and even fossil fuel companies, EGS is now being developed across the country. And while tax credits for wind and solar have been cut, geothermal still receives federal incentives—signaling renewed confidence in its clean, consistent energy potential. "Earth Wise" airs weekdays at 11:10 a.m. and 4:04 p.m.

"Don't miss new monthly episodes of our award-winning podcast "A New York Minute in History." The latest episode took us to the unveiling of the brand-new Garnet Douglass Baltimore historical marker at the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) in Troy along with Bill Pomeroy himself. Garnet Douglass Baltimore was the first African American graduate of RPI and went on to a long and very successful career as a civil and landscape engineer.
