

# NOVA

## Arctic Sinkholes

Colossal explosions shake a remote corner of the Siberian tundra, leaving behind massive craters. In Alaska, a huge lake erupts with bubbles of inflammable gas. Scientists are discovering that these mystifying phenomena add up to a ticking time bomb, as long-frozen permafrost melts and releases vast amounts of methane, a potent greenhouse gas.



"Arctic Sinkholes" on **Nova** investigates the implications of these dramatic developments in the Arctic.

About 20% of the Arctic's permafrost—a blend of frozen sand, soil and rocks—has a high volume of ground ice, making it prone to rapid thawing. Since frozen water takes up more space than liquid water, when ice-rich permafrost thaws rapidly—whether due to climate change or wildfire or other events—the formerly frozen Arctic ecosystem turns into a marshy mess, prone to floods and soil collapse. This can develop very quickly, turning relatively dry and solid ecosystems like forests into lakes in a matter of months to years.

## Great Mammoth Mystery

In "Great Mammoth Mystery" on **Nova**, Sir David Attenborough drops in for tea at the modest suburban home of Neville and Sally Hollingworth, both fossil collectors in southwest England. A decade ago, Neville and Sally spotted fossils lying in a nearby gravel quarry, which led a team of paleontologists and archaeologists to undertake a major excavation.

They soon discovered that the site not only preserved exceptional traces of the extinct beasts that populated Britain over 200,000 years ago, but even more precious evidence of its early human inhabitants, including impressive stone tools known as hand-axes almost certainly made by Neanderthals.

Featuring photorealistic reconstructions of the site's ancient riverside setting, **Nova** brings the world of prehistoric Britain vividly to life.

## Augmented

"Augmented," a two-hour **Nova**, follows the dramatic personal journey of Hugh Herr, an MIT biophysicist. At age 17, Herr's legs were amputated due to frostbite after he got lost in a snowstorm while mountain climbing. Frustrated by the primitive prosthetic legs he was given, the teenager crafted prosthetic limbs that made him an even more accomplished climber than before the accident.

After training as an engineer, Herr created advanced limbs that use electronics to mimic the body's own systems of muscular and nervous control. Two of these bionic limbs are Hugh's own legs, which he uses for rock-climbing and living his life.

**Nova** follows Herr's moving collaboration with an injured climber and a surgeon as they test a radical new way of performing amputations that allows prosthetic limbs to move and feel like the real thing.

## How the Victorians Built Britain

**How the Victorians Built Britain** reveals the surprising stories and hidden heroes behind the epic constructions and inventions that transformed the face of England. The four-part series shares how incredible advances that came about during the Victorian Era from 1837 to 1901 forged modern life as we know it.

With the inventions of the omnibus, the modern-day bicycle and the London Underground, Victorian engineers revolutionized public transport. During this same period, Victorians created the sewer system, providing clean water for all, but it took the Great Stink of 1858 to convince Parliament to act.

Victorians introduced gas power to the home, transforming the kitchen, lighting, heating, and even home entertainment.

Finally, the series examines cotton's place at the heart of mass production, via the creation of the first inter-city railway and a game-changing loom.

## The Fabulous History of Skiing

**The Fabulous History of Skiing** traces the evolution of locomotion on two slats of wood, revealing surprising insights, unexpected stories and strong and avant-garde people who were not afraid to break with the prevailing social prejudices of their time.

Probably one of the oldest human inventions, skiing appears in prehistoric cave drawings that suggest that man used skis during the last Ice Age in the Palaeolithic period, some 2.85 million years ago. It evolves through the ages from a form of winter transportation to a leisure activity to extreme sports.

**The Fabulous History of Skiing** will be broadcast on 3-2 Tuesday, the 1st at 8:00 p.m. and Sunday, the 6th at 6:00 p.m. It airs on 3-1 Wednesday, the 2nd at 8:00 p.m.



## Aerial Egypt

**Aerial Egypt**, a two-part series, gives a truly unique view into Egypt's rich ancient history and treasures.

Hour one provides a bird's eye view of the country's many pyramids and the Sphinx, as well as sites central to the Christian and Islamic faiths, including the largest mosque and cathedral in Africa. It sheds light on the Nile River, Cairo's iconic squares, the Grand Egyptian Museum, the magical coastal city of Alexandria and its founder Alexander the Great, the beautiful oasis of Siwa, and the New Suez Canal.

In part two, a hot air balloon introduces the treasures of Luxor and its temples: the mortuary temple of Queen Hatshepsut, the Valley of the Kings, Medinet Habu, Karnak and The Temple of Luxor.

## Josephine Baker: The Story of an Awakening

**Josephine Baker: The Story of an Awakening** recounts the fascinating life of the first global Black superstar. The film highlights Baker's awakening as she transforms from the "banana dancer" into a World War II spy and human rights activist. Her costume, a short skirt of artificial bananas and a beaded necklace, became an iconic image of both the Jazz Age and the Roaring Twenties.

The film follows Baker's rise to fame, from a poor African American girl in Missouri to France, where she became the "Queen of Paris," the most photographed woman in the world and the highest paid entertainer in Europe.

Later, Baker worked for the French Resistance, including smuggling messages hidden in her sheet music or undergarments. For her heroism, Baker received both the Croix de Guerre and the Legion of Honour with the rosette of the Resistance, two of France's highest military honors.

After the war, Baker created her dream family, affectionately known as "The Rainbow Tribe," by adopting 12 ethnically diverse children from around the world and raising them with differing religious views. She wanted to show that people could live happily together regardless of their differences.

Baker made three trips back home in 1936, 1948, and 1951 and, each time, experienced racism firsthand despite her international fame. These experiences played an integral role in her life.

Baker began a lifelong battle for civil rights, becoming the sole woman that spoke during the 1963 March on Washington, alongside Martin Luther King, Jr. "You know, friends," she said, "that I do not lie to you when I tell you I have walked into the palaces of kings and queens and into the houses of presidents. And much more. But I could not walk into a hotel in America and get a cup of coffee..."

After decades of rejection by her countrymen and a lifetime struggle against racism, in 1973, Baker performed at Carnegie Hall and was greeted with a standing ovation. She wept openly on stage.

In April 1975, Baker starred in a retrospective revue in Paris—financed by Prince Rainier, Princess Grace and Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis—celebrating her 50 years in show business. Sophia Loren, Mick Jagger, Diana Ross and Liza Minnelli were among the guests.

Just four days later, Baker, then only 68, died in her sleep. More than 20,000 people lined the streets of Paris to witness her funeral procession. The French government honored her with a 21-gun salute, making Baker the first American woman in history to receive French military honors.

### Riveted: The History of Jeans

"Riveted: The History of Jeans" is the surprising story of the ultimate American garment. Worn by everyone from presidents to supermodels, farmers to rock stars, they're more than just a pair of pants—America's tangled past is woven deeply into the indigo fabric.

The story of jeans usually begins with Levi Strauss, a Bavarian immigrant looking to make his fortune selling garments to the 49ers during the California Gold Rush. But half a century before Strauss, enslaved people in the American South were wearing a precursor of denim made from a coarse textile known as "slave cloth." The blue hue of jeans resulted from an arduous dyeing process using the indigo plant.

Eliza Lucas, daughter of an 18th-century colonial governor, has long been credited with jump-starting the southern economy with indigo production. Left out are the West African enslaved people who brought with them the invaluable expertise for growing, processing and dyeing the plant.

## Owned:

### A Tale of Two Americas

In an effort to boost housing supply and a sluggish post-World War II economy, the U.S. government undertook the most sweeping wealth redistribution project in history. The idea was to subsidize home ownership in order to build a new middle class centered around the 30-year mortgage. But this idea was never meant to help everyone.

From 1945 to 1965, the intentional, government-fueled mass exodus of white families from inner cities took their jobs and their investment potential into the suburbs, leaving behind systematically defunded, segregated communities.

"Owned: A Tale of Two Americas" on **Independent Lens** weaves together the history of the mid-century housing policy in America, which simultaneously created suburbs and wealth for white people and ghettos and poverty for Black people.

The film introduces viewers to the industry self-tasked with protecting the nation's children while generating revenue along the way, as well as with those most deeply impacted by these heightened security measures: students and teachers.

### Apart

Since the beginning of the War on Drugs, the number of women in U.S. prisons has grown over 800 percent, and the majority of those women are mothers. "Apart" on **Independent Lens** examines this staggering statistic through the lens of three young mothers—Lydia, Tomika, and Amanda—imprisoned in the midwest for drug-related charges.

"Apart" depicts their struggles with poverty and addiction as these women strive to mend familial bonds after years of separation and reestablish their lives once released from prison.

To prepare to rejoin their families, they enter an innovative prison program in Cleveland, Ohio, where they lean on each other and on mentors. With the hope of redemption, the women work to regain the trust of their children and combat stigmas associated with people who have been incarcerated.

#### American Reckoning

"American Reckoning" on **Frontline** reveals the truth that today's anti-Black violence is nothing new. Digging into the case of Wharlest Jackson, Sr., an NAACP leader and one of hundreds of unsolved civil rights era murders, we discover not only how the FBI and U.S. Government failed Black families then, but also now by not solving any cases despite the 2007 Emmett Till Act's allocation of money to do so.

Now, **Frontline** tells the in-depth story of one of the cases on the Till Act list in "American Reckoning." Filming in Natchez, Mississippi, where the murder took place, the film discovers a story of Black resistance that was never widely known, and also speaks to the resistance that's always been part of the struggle against white supremacy in America.



Washington and his highly decorated teammates Bubba Smith (Defensive Lineman), George Webster (Rover Back) and Clinton Jones (Running Back) became members of the first fully integrated football team in America, later making history as first round picks in the 1967 Draft, and changing the game forever.




