Lessons and Carols from King's College, Cambridge, celebrates its one-hundred-and-seventh birthday this year. Its liturgical author, Eric Milner-White, was appointed chaplain at the college in 1912. When the War broke out in 1914, he volunteered on the front as a military chaplain. Decorated for courage under fire in combat, he was released in early 1918 and returned to the college where he was appointed Dean. The first Lessons and Carols was held later that year.

After the end of the war, Milner-White set out to create a special seasonal service "as a gift to the city of Cambridge" that would serve two purposes: First, he wanted to grieve the loss of young men from the city, and especially from his own college. Twenty-three percent of the members of King's College had died during the war, including Milner-White's roommate. Second, he wanted to create a service where the simple beauty of worship would shine through and attract those who had lost their faith amidst the horrors of the war. In his own words, "the main theme is the development of the loving purposes of God" as viewed "through the windows and the words of the Bible."

The Second Lesson

Isaiah 11: 1-9

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge, and the fear of the Lord. His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. The Sixth Lesson

The Seventh Lesson

Matthew II: 1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. Isaiah 65: 17-24
