## Exploring Islam's deep roots in America

Buckle up for a cross-country journey along historic Route 66 with The Great Muslim American Road Trip. The new three-part documentary series follows a young Muslim American couple — rapper Mona Haydar and her husband Sebastian Robins — as they explore America's "Mother Road" and its surrounding Muslim communities on a 2,500-mile drive from Chicago to Los Angeles.

Although they are practicing Muslims — Mona is Syrian American and Sebastian converted after meeting Mona — the couple, like most Americans, are unfamiliar with Islam's deeps roots in America. This road trip is an opportunity for them not only to experience the breathtaking panoramas and iconic roadside attractions that have made Route 66 famous, but also to learn more about the history of their faith and what it means to be Muslim in America today.

Making more than a dozen stops, Mona and Sebastian meet authors, entrepreneurs, students and others. Their conversations uncover the deep roots and impact of Islam and Muslims in American history and culture. By the time they reach the West Coast, the couple have a better understanding of themselves, their relationship, and the centuries-long Muslim experience in America.

and sang in choirs from grade school days through college and long after, including in an international choir in Tokyo.

He came to New England to study at the School for International Training in Brattleboro and has been here ever since. "I enjoy the academic milieu which attracts students, scholars and artists from all around the world," Walter said. "We have access to fabulous musical and theatrical performances right here, and we're close to Boston, New York, Glimmerglass and other great performing venues. And it's a beautiful natural area."

He joined WFCR in 1989 as host of late evening classical music and switched to the afternoon program soon thereafter. He has performed in plays all his life, including years of performing with the Hampshire Shakespeare Company.

What's in store for Walter? He describes a perfect day as beach, with a

seafood dinner. Or in New York City, a day at a museum, a dinner and a performance at the Metropolitan Opera. Or a similar visit to another country. Interestingly, that fits in with his NEPM finale. Walter retires at the end of June, but there will be one more NEPM adventure. In December, Walter will host a magnificent NEPM trip to Germany, France, Switzerland and Austria. 
#### Jazz Safari
