Let's see -- you can call in to Vox Pop, you can comment on social media, or write us a note and many of you do so every day. The beauty of the radio station is that it is built to include you. Each day, the Roundtable debates the issues of the day, week and season. Since we all have a stake in the way things are going, many people choose to write in and let us know what they think about what they are hearing. The regulars on the show are not above duking it out when it comes to some very contentious subjects. Among these are the way in which we human beings treat one another. No matter what one may think of what's happening at a particular time, you can bet that each and every one of opinions will be heard.

I love the characters who appear on the program. Of course, our chief personality is Joe Donahue. Just think of the work he has to do to keep the daily conversation going. When you are on the radio, the conversation can turn on a dime and head off into another direction. The beauty is, you never really know where you might end up but one intuitively knows when it is time to put a halt to a particular discussion. Sometimes you pick it up again and then you feel quite accomplished.

So, as the seasons change, as the leaves emerge and the grass gets greener, we share a sense of well-being and happiness. When you listen to the Roundtable every morning, you tune into the various characters and you begin to feel like you really know them. Do you catch yourself thinking, "Oh boy, I know Alan or Joe isn't going to let that go." You will say that based on all the past conversations that you have heard. You might not always like what you are hearing, but that happens at the family dinner table as well.

I've said it before and I'll say it again -- it IS the dining room table. 🍴

As we were still in shock from January being over, February, the shortest month, quickly passed as well. With spring in mind, we greet the new month of March with open arms and look forward to, possibly, warmer air. This month we'll continue with the drama from "The Met Opera," hear stories about transgenic spider goats in "The Academic Minute," hear all about New York City fires and their history in "Person Place Thing," and enjoy hits from Tom Petty on "Live at the Linda." March is a month to look forward to.

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING:

On the "Met Opera," we'll start the month off with an audience-only win in Donizetti's tragic opera "La Favorita" on March 4; we'll turn to Verdi's "La Traviata," on March 11; hear Wagner's "Lohengrin," on March 18; and end the month with Bellini's scorching bel canto drama "Norma," on March 25. The Met Opera airs Saturdays at 1 p.m.

REGULAR PROGRAMMING

This month on the Academic Minute we'll feature a special week with five SUNY distinguished professors discussing topics ranging from transgenic spider goats to the biogeochemical membrane at the intersection of earth's global systems. Tune in each weekday at 7:30 a.m. and at 3:56 p.m. on WAMC or anytime online at academicminute.org.

On "Person Place Thing" host Randy Simon speaks with writer of "The Book of Goose," Yiyun Li, on March 3; former director of The New York City Fire Museum, Gary Urbanowicz on March 10; gallerists Wendy Olsoff and Brigitte Mulholland on March 17; American interdisciplinary artist and educator Nina Katchadourian on March 24; and the New York City fire commissioner, Laura Kavanagh, on March 31. Person Place Thing airs Fridays at 10:30 p.m.

On "Earth Wise," we continue to explore how climate change and other factors cause many species to face extinction. This month we'll learn how researchers uncovered the best ways to save big cats (lynx, bears, lions). We'll also hear how recent satellite observations

of the sea ice in the Antarctic found the lowest level of ice seen in 40 years; how the shrinking Arctic ice cover is making it easier for ships to travel; and how insects may help with food insecurity. Earth Wise airs weekdays at 11:10 a.m. and 4:04 p.m.

"Live at the Linda" this month brings us tunes from Tom Petty, Daisycutter and Tony Trischka. Join us for "Blues on Tour" on March 1; "Our Roots are Showing" on March 5 and March 8; "Banjo Bonanza" on March 12 and March 15; "The Ultimate Tribute" on March 19 and March 22; and we'll close out the month with local bluegrass favorites from "Head of the Class Bluegrass" on March 26 and March 29.
