- Safeguard your personal information
- Spot and dispute billing inaccuracies
- Learn to read your Medicare statements

Protect

Your defense against healthcare fraud is protecting your personal information.

Ways to protect yourself and your benefits:

- Don't give out your Medicare number to unknown providers.
- Remember, Medicare will never ask for your Medicare number.
- · Carry your Medicare card only when necessary.
- Maintain a record of your medical appointments and save all Medicare statements or sign up for Medicare.gov to keep track of your services and claims.

Detect

Be vigilant and recognize the signs of potential fraud, errors and abuse.

Quick detection tips:

- Regularly review your Medicare statements and cross-check with your medical records.
- Watch out for charges for items never received, double-billed items or services not ordered by your physician.

Report

Your reports can make a difference. If something seems off, report it immediately.

How to take action:

- Don't disclose personal information during unsolicited calls. Report these to your local SMP.
- Contact your healthcare provider or plan with any Medicare statement questions.
- If unsatisfied or unsure, the local SMP offers confidential assistance and support.
