Featuring irreverent interviews with some of the most famous music photographers, musicians, gallerists, music journalists and social commentators, **ICON: Music Through the Lens** captures what it was like on both sides of the camera when the most

recognizable images in history were taken. Via studio portraits, record sleeves, coffee table books, along with magazine photo shoots, fine art, and images taken at live shows and exhibitions, viewers learn about the origins of these enduring, iconic images and the future of music photography.

Each of the riveting episodes unfolds like an exclusive all-access pass that invites viewers behind the curtain and backstage to some of the most well-known concerts and photoshoots in music history.

News Matters

The founders of our country thought that a free press was so important to the protection of the new democracy they created that they put protection of that freedom of the press into the First Amendment to the United States Constitution.



Over the past several years, fact-based news organizations have increasingly been targeted by private equity firms and hedge funds exhibiting the worst of capitalistic behaviors—purchasing the news organizations, stripping the assets, firing newsroom staff and effectively silencing the free press.

News Matters follows the desperate attempts by respected newsrooms to fight off hedge funds and disinformation to save journalism, the people's right to know—and even democracy itself.

The film follows the attempt by Colorado journalists to save the 125-year-old *Denver Post* from slow death at the hands of hedge fund owner Alden Global Capital, while trying to cut through the noise of social media and opinion news outlets. Journalist Chuck Plunkett captures national attention when he leads the revolt, all while the newspaper industry crumbles and while journalists are being called the enemy of the people.

News Matters will be broadcast on 3-2 Sunday, the 11th at 7:00 p.m. and Tuesday, the 27th at 10:00 p.m. It can be seen on 3-1 Wednesday, the 28th at 7:00 p.m.

Downing of a Flag is a two-part documentary that focuses on the Confederate Battle flag and its impact on the people, politics and perceptions of South Carolina, the South and the nation. The film explores the symbol's true meaning and how an unspeakable tragedy served as the catalyst for its long-debated removal.

The story begins with the end of the Civil War and chronicles the flag's more than 150-year journey from the blood-soaked battlefields of Virginia to its use in American popular culture in the 1970s and 1980s, to its final removal from the South Carolina State House grounds in July 2015.

Preceded by the killing of nine black parishioners at Charleston's historic Mother Emanuel AME Church by a white supremacist, the Confederate Battle flag's furling and the days and actions that led to that event could represent the final shots and battles of the American Civil War.

Despite representing an end to a significant chapter in United States history, **Downing of a Flag** shows that the events of 2015 did not complete the story. Today we continue to see the flag used as a symbol, and as a result, it continues to haunt American Democracy.

Slavery by Another Name

Slavery by Another Name: The Re-Enslavement of Black Americans from the Civil War to World War II is the Pulitzer Prize-winning book by *Wall Street Journal* senior writer Douglas A. Blackmon. It serves as the basis for a 90-minute PBS documentary of the same name that tells the little-known history of forced labor.

Slavery by Another Name challenges one of Americans' most cherished assumptions: the belief that slavery in this country ended with the Emancipation Proclamation. The film relates that even as chattel slavery came to an end in the South in 1865, thousands of African Americans were pulled back into forced labor with shocking force and brutality. It was a system in which men, often guilty of no crime at all, were arrested, compelled to work without pay, repeatedly bought and sold, and coerced to do the bidding of masters. Tolerated by both the North and South, forced labor lasted well into the 20th century.

"The Thirteenth Amendment states that slavery was abolished, except as a punishment for a crime," says Blackmon. "So across the South, laws were passed to criminalize everyday African-American life. It was a crime for a black man to walk beside a railroad, to speak loudly in the company of white women, to do someone's laundry without a license, to sell cotton after dark. But the most damag-

ing statutes were around vagrancy. If you couldn't prove your employment at any moment, you were a criminal."

Once convicted, African Americans were leased to coal mines, brick yards, plantations and turpentine farms and forced to work without pay. They were shackled, imprisoned and often tortured. Thousands died. Descendants of forced labor's purveyors are not immune to these practices' "aftershocks."

Susan Tuggle Burnore, whose great-grandfather, a farmer named John Williams, murdered eleven laborers held illegally on his farm, says that he "did it in the most horrific ways that you can imagine, that I really can't talk about. I get so emotional. There was an attitude, a set of beliefs that said this kind of cruelty was somehow acceptable."

Slavery by Another Name will be broadcast on 3-2 Sunday, the 4th at 1:00 p.m. and Friday, the 9th at 10:30 p.m. It airs on 3-1 Tuesday, the 27th at 7:00 p.m.

Neutral Ground

In 2015, comedian and filmmaker C.J. Hunt was filming the New Orleans City Council's vote to remove four confederate monuments. As residents take sides on whether to remove or defend the so-called Lost Cause monuments, city life is marred by death threats and lawsuits.

In "Neutral Ground" on **POV**, Hunt hits the road, travelling across the South to try and understand why a losing army from 1865 still holds so much political and imaginative power in contemporary America.

Through a mixture of investigative journalism and disarming humor, Hunt unravels a romanticized and distorted interpretation of the war that ex-Confederates inserted into textbooks, films and the popular imagination.

"Neutral Ground" on **POV** will be broadcast on 3-2 Monday, the 5th at 8:30 p.m. It airs on 3-1 Sunday, the 11th at 9:00 p.m.



Landfall

After the fallout of Hurricane Maria in 2017 and an economic crisis, Puerto Ricans prepare to weather a threat of global significance: disaster capitalism. While the country grapples with a devastated infrastructure and multi-billion dollar debt, outside investors descend—not to bail out communities, but to cash in.

Everyday puertorriqueños—subsistence farmers, teachers, activists, and more—meet an incoming wave of cryptocurrency traders, luxury real estate developers, and the politicians leveraging the crisis to recruit their extractive business ventures.

The next generation of Puerto Ricans find themselves at an inflection point between the dream of a socialist utopia and the reality of recolonization.

"Landfall" on **POV** can be seen on 3-2 Monday, the 12th at 9:00 p.m. It airs on 3-1 Sunday, the 18th at 9:00 p.m.

Stateless

"Stateless" on **POV** examines the history of state-sanctioned anti-Black resentment in the Dominican Republic (DR), which saw a new perversion in 2013 when the country's Supreme Court delivered a troubling ruling that stripped the citizenship of anyone with Haitian parents retroactive to 1929.

The film explores the complexity of the issue, focusing on three characters—Rosa

Iris, an attorney and activist; Juan Teofilo Murat, Rosa's cousin and one of 200,000 impacted by the 2013 ruling; and Gladys Feliz, a member of the national movement group blaming Haitians for the DR's ills. Their contemporary narratives carry echoes of the 1937 massacre in which tens of thousands of Haitians and Dominicans of Haitian descent were slaughtered based on the darkness of their skin.

"Stateless" on **POV** will be broadcast on 3-2 Monday, the 19th at 9:00 p.m. It can be seen on 3-1 Sunday, the 25th at 9:00 p.m.

Mayor

Musa Hadid is the Christian mayor of Ramallah, the de facto capital of the Palestinian Authority. As he tries to keep his city running while paving sidewalks, planning holidays and building a new fountain, his job is made increasingly difficult by the Israeli occupation of his home.

In "Mayor" on **POV**, Hadid asks with humor and outrage: how do you run a city if you don't have a country?

Pope Francis

On March 13, 2013, at the age of 76, the Argentinian cardinal Jorge Bergoglio was named the 266th pope of the Roman Catholic Church. Taking the name Francis, he made history by being the first pope from the Americas, the first non-European pope since the 8th century, and the first Jesuit priest to be named to the office.

“Pope Francis” on **In Their Own Words** dives into Pope Francis’s personal story, revealing the experiences and influences that led



him from Buenos Aires to the Vatican and the highest office of the Catholic church—and made him one of the most popular and progressive popes of recent times.

The program features interviews with Austin Ivereigh, author of *The Great Reformer: Francis*

and the Making of a Radical Pope, NBC’s Anne Thompson, Vatican officials and more.

In response to an exponential increase in black bear-human conflicts—including bears breaking into cars and homes, and cubs getting trapped in garages—Colorado Parks and Wildlife commissioned a six-year study to determine the factors behind the statewide trend and to propose solutions to quell it. More than six-hundred bears were tagged, measured, and tracked by radio collar in one of the largest urban black bear studies ever conducted.



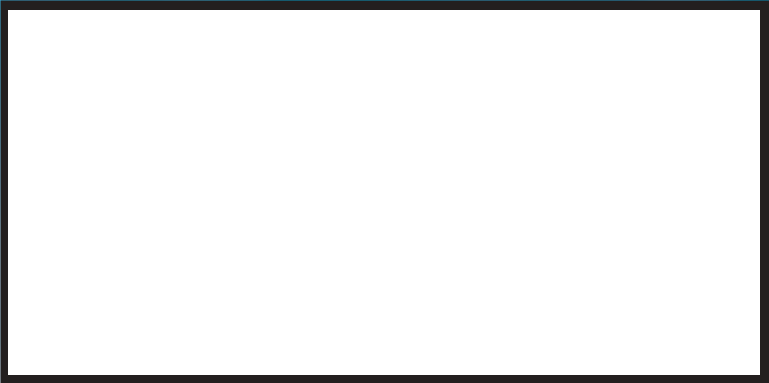
