

This production of Puccini's beloved *Madama Butterfly* is conducted by Carlo Rizzi with performances from Sonya Yoncheva, Adam Smith, Jennifer Johnson Cano, and Quinn Kelsey.

THE HIGH PRIESTESS OF SOUL

The assassination of Medgar Evers in Jackson, Mississippi in June of 1963 and the 16th Street Baptist Church bombing in Birmingham, Alabama that rocked the nation two months later, served as the fiery inspiration for Nina Simone’s [pictured] famous protest song, *Mississippi Goddam*. As she later recalled, “It was my first civil rights song, and it erupted out of me quicker than I could write it down.”

Simone’s searing performance of *Mississippi Goddam* in a live concert at Carnegie Hall 62 years ago this month, was recorded for her debut album on the Philips label. You can listen to that recording [here](#).

The song never became a commercial success, largely because it was boycotted by many radio stations in the South. Nevertheless, it will always serve as one of the great anthems of the Civil Rights movement — written by an iconic woman who earned the moniker, “The High Priestess of Soul.”
