We are 100% committed to keep Public Radio 90 around for the next generations! We can do this...together.





Throughout the boating season from May through October, Public Radio 90 provides open water marine forecasts beyond 5 nautical miles for the central portion of Lake Superior and the northern half of Lake Michigan.

Marine Forecasts can be heard **weekdays (Mon-Fri) at 8:49 am, 11:59 am and 5:18 pm; and weekends (Sat-Sun) at 8:18 am, 11:59 am and 5:19 pm** (all times Eastern).

Please note that forecasts may be pre-empted during times when WNMU is using computer automated programming.
