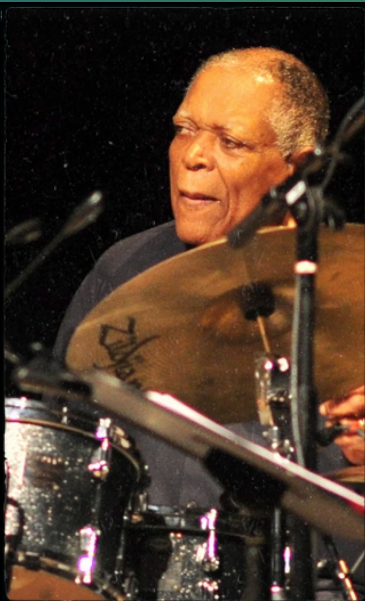

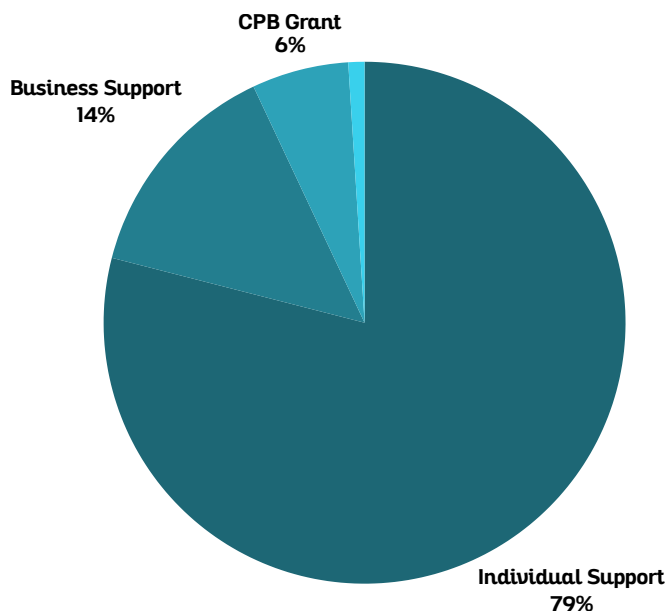
financials
