



Pizzo K- 8 Reassignment Proposal

2027-2028 School Year

Summary

In order to improve fiscal and operational responsibility Growth Management conducted a Spring 2026 Reassignment Study to address utilization in elementary and middle school sites across the district. Increasing operational efficiency will allow the district to expand opportunities for students by consolidating resources, staff, and programs.

As a result of the study, Pizzo K-8 was identified as a leased facility from the University of South Florida serving an area of 900 Kindergarten to 5th grade students and 6th to 8th grade Choice students.

Stakeholder Outreach

Internal Stakeholder Meeting

Staff held an internal stakeholder’s meeting for the Spring Reassignment Study on January 21, 2026. Growth Management shared the Pizzo K-8 reassignment proposal and gathered feedback from the stakeholders.

Participants included staff from the Deputy Superintendent of Operations, Deputy Superintendent of Academics and Transformation, Chief of Schools, Growth Management t, Transportation, Communications, Choice, Area Superintendents and Principals.

Growth Management shared Pizzo K-8 lease details and adjacent elementary school capacity data.

The University of South Florida 2025-2026 school year Pizzo K-8 lease agreement will be \$613,800, increasing each school year. Over the ten-year lease term, the total cost of the site, excluding maintenance and repairs, would be \$8,088,326.

Capacity is available to serve Pizzo K-5 students in adjacent elementary school sites thereby allowing for the potential termination of the Pizzo K-8 lease. Students in grades 6th to 8th will be reassigned to their zoned middle schools



- Parental feedback also requested, if Pizzo K-8 had to close, please relocate entire student population to another single site
- Feedback presented and received in two languages: English and Spanish

All 2027-2028 KG-5th grades will be reassigned to proposed adjacent elementary schools.

All 2027-2028 6th to 8th grades will return to their zoned middle school.



Graham to Broward Reassignment

2027-2028 School Year

Summary

In order to improve fiscal and operational responsibility, Growth Management conducted a Spring 2026 Reassignment Study to address utilization in elementary and middle school sites across the district. Increasing operational efficiency will allow the district to expand opportunities for students by consolidating resources, staff, and programs.

As a result of the study, Broward and Graham Elementary Schools were identified as under 40% capacity. Therefore, staff recommended merging the attendance boundaries of Graham and Broward and assigning all students in the area to Broward Elementary school.

Stakeholder Outreach

Internal Stakeholder Meeting

Staff held an internal stakeholder's meeting for the Spring Reassignment Study on January 21, 2026. Growth Management staff shared the Graham to Broward reassignment proposal and gathered feedback from the stakeholders.

Participants included staff from the Deputy Superintendent of Operations, Deputy Superintendent of Academics and Transformation, Chief of Schools, Growth Management t, Transportation, Communications, Choice, Area Superintendents and Principals from Graham and Broward Elementary schools.

Between the two elementary sites, Broward has a larger capacity, and 647 students will be assigned to the new Broward boundary

Madison Reassignment Proposal

2027-2028 School Year

Summary

In order to improve fiscal and operational responsibility, Growth Management conducted a Spring 2026 Reassignment Study to address utilization in elementary and middle school sites across the district. Increasing operational efficiency will allow the district to expand opportunities for students by consolidating resources, staff, and programs.

As a result of the study, Madison Middle School was identified as a middle school site operating under 60% capacity.

Stakeholder Outreach

Internal Stakeholder Meeting

Staff held internal stakeholder's meeting for the Spring Reassignment Study on January 21, 2026. Growth Management staff shared the Madison Student Reassignment to Monroe and gathered feedback from the internal stakeholders.

Participants included staff from the Deputy Superintendent of Operations, Deputy Superintendent of Academics and Transformation, Chief of Schools, Growth Management, Transportation, Communications, Choice, Area Superintendents and Principals.

Growth Management shared student data and district facility data in the South Tampa area. The Monroe campus was identified as having a FISH capacity that could serve the zoned students and accommodate growth in the South Tampa area. As a result, district staff was asked to reassign the Madison satellite population. The satellite population for Madison includes students east of Dale Mabry Highway and north of State Road 60. These students will be reassigned to the new Stewart Middle Magnet School.



- Feedback strongly supported the movement of the Satellite Population to the Stewart boundary
- Parents requested to maintain the STEM program at the new Monroe location with enhanced lab spaces
- Many requests from parents and staff to rename the school once the location changes to the new campus in order to rebrand the school and make it a true community middle school

2027-2028 6th to 8th grade students in the Madison Satellite boundary will be reassigned to Stewart Middle Magnet School

2027-2028 6th to 8th students in the remaining Madison boundary will be reassigned to the Monroe campus location.



Sulphur Springs Grades 6th to 8th Reassignment Proposal

2027-2028 School Year

Summary

In order to improve fiscal and operational responsibility, Growth Management conducted a Spring 2026 Reassignment Study to address utilization in elementary and middle school sites across the district. Increasing operational efficiency will allow the district to expand opportunities for students by consolidating resources, staff and programs.

Based on the findings of the study, staff are recommending a grade reconfiguration for the Sulphur Springs K–8 campus, returning it to an elementary school. Students in grades 6–8 would be reassigned to nearby middle schools, while Kindergarten through 5th grade would remain at the Sulphur Springs campus.

Staff held internal stakeholder’s meeting for the Spring Reassignment Study on January 21, 2026. Growth Management shared the Sulphur Springs reconfiguration to an elementary school and gathered feedback from the internal stakeholders.

Participants included staff from the Deputy Superintendent of Operations, Deputy Superintendent of Academics and Transformation, Chief of Schools, Growth Management, Transportation, Communications, Choice, and Area Superintendents and Principals.

Growth Management shared student data for the community surrounding the Sulphur Springs K-8 school.

Capacity is available in adjacent middle schools to serve the 6th -8th grade students of Sulphur Springs K-8.



Middle School V V Proposed Boundary

2027-2028 School Year

Summary

In accordance with the 5 year District Educational Facility Plan, Middle V V is currently under construction and is slated to open during the 2027-2028 school year. The proposed attendance boundary is being created to address the capacity issues in the south county middle schools.

The proposed Middle V V boundary is created by reassigning area students from Barrington, Eisenhower, Shields and Turkey Creek Middle Schools to alleviate any overcrowding with the increased population of south county.

Stakeholder Outreach

Internal Stakeholder Meeting

Staff held an internal stakeholder's attendance boundary meeting on October 6, 2025. Growth Management staff shared two boundary scenarios and gathered feedback from the stakeholders.

Participants included staff from the Deputy Superintendent of Operations, Deputy Superintendent of Academics and Transformation, Chief of Information Technology, Chief of Schools, Growth Management, Transportation, Communications, Choice, and Area Superintendents and Principals.

After reviewing details in the proposal with the Internal Stakeholders , the approved scenario was shared with Senior District staff and community meetings dates were set.



Establishment of Young Boundary Proposal

2027-2028 School Year

Summary

In order to improve fiscal and operational responsibility, Growth Management conducted a Spring 2026 Reassignment Study to address utilization in elementary and middle school sites across the district. Increasing operational efficiency will allow the district to expand opportunities for students by consolidating resources, staff and programs.

As a result of the study, Young Middle Magnet School was identified at 29.23% capacity. Growth Management reviewed the student population in the area and determined that Young Middle Magnet School could be a community middle school by reassigning portions of students from Jennings Middle School and Greco, Sligh, and Stewart Middle Magnet schools. This boundary proposal would eliminate the satellite populations of Greco and Jennings middle schools and create new boundaries for Sligh and Stewart Middle Magnet schools.
