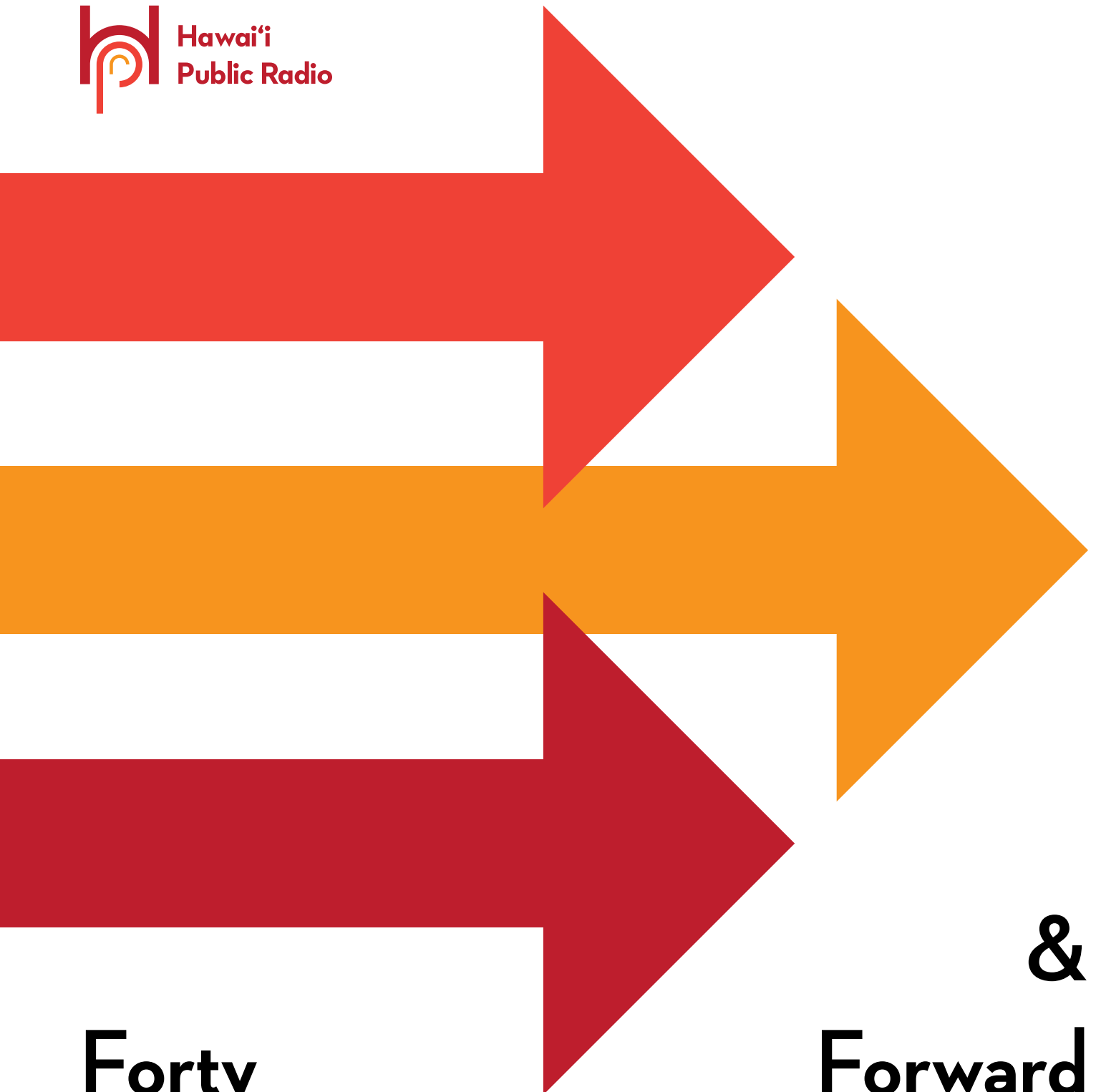

# Reflections

## HPR reaches a milestone, thanks to your support

Dear HPR supporter,

When HPR went live on November 13, 1981, we operated out of loaned space in the Quarry on the UH Mānoa campus, with just three paid staff and a group of dedicated volunteers. Though our beginnings were modest, the original vision for HPR was ambitious: to educate, enlighten, inform, and entertain listeners across the state and beyond. It's a mission that holds true today.

From Day One, news and classical music were the cornerstones of our programming; to this day, they continue to be the hallmarks of HPR's independent, noncommercial service. Even as we've doubled down on local news from our award-winning news team and created the state's only dedicated classical music station, we've rounded out our offerings with a variety of talk, entertainment, and music programming.

Having access to timely, reliable information is always important, more so during times of crisis. Like all businesses and families, HPR has been called on to adapt and sustain its operations during the current pandemic. Daily reporting and broadcast services have continued without interrup-

tion, and there have been no reductions in programming or staffing.

Forty years after the station was founded, before cell phones and the internet were competing for our attention, we are staying connected to our listeners—so they can stay connected to the world—on a variety of digital platforms in addition to broadcast radio: Zoom, FaceTime, streaming audio, podcasts, email, and more.

Now, as we enter our fifth decade, we reflect on how far we've come: We own our facilities on Kāheka street; we have a balanced budget and carry no debt; and our staff of three has grown to nearly 60, with several new positions created in the last year alone.

We have grown as fast as you, our listeners, have wanted us to. As much as you have invested in us, we have invested in serving you.

Every step forward has been made possible by the unwavering community support and generosity of our members, underwriters, volunteers, and supporting foundations. Mahalo for believing in HPR then, now, and into the future.

# News & Talk

HPR keeps you informed as the pandemic's impact evolves

As the COVID-19 pandemic stretched through a second year, HPR delivered critical information to help residents cope, as well as stories of adjustment, transition, and the reemergence of our hard-hit island community.

The pandemic affected not only the health of individuals and communities, but also the outlook for industries and economic centers throughout the state. Stories highlighted topics of particular relevance as Hawai'i endures and emerges from the pandemic.

HPR's "Waikiki Summer" series looked at the bounceback of tourism and the accompanying growing pains, as well as the area's historic, cultural, and environmental significance.

The HPR team also reported on the easing of restrictions, including the expiration of eviction moratoriums, reopening of the state unemployment office and other services, and the workforce's gradual and uneven return to the office.

Other stories highlighted individuals and groups working to solve the community's most pressing problems, from homelessness to climate change.

*The Conversation* (weekdays at 11 am) regularly speaks to state-elected officials, including some call-in shows where listeners may ask questions of their own. Hawai'i U.S. Senator Brian Schatz has discussed our state's share of the new federal infrastructure law and Governor David Ige stops in for periodic updates with host Catherine Cruz. *The Conversation* also stays in touch with mayors from across the state to learn what each is doing to keep their respective communities safe and moving forward.

HPR's local news coverage was recognized in 2021 with three Regional Edward R. Murrow Awards for Excellence in Sound; Investigative Reporting; and News Series. The team also received nine Excellence in Journalism awards from the Hawaii Professional Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists.

Strong support from the listening community allowed HPR to add a second news editor and a dedicated digital news producer to the team. These positions help the station fulfill key aspects of our strategic plan, including expanding local news coverage and investing resources in digital platforms such as the web, social media, and our mobile app.

We debuted Island Insider this year, a weekly email roundup of top local news stories from the HPR team. It launched with 10,000 subscribers, and our following has grown steadily. We also introduced several popular podcasts: *Off the Road* goes behind the scenes with world-renowned musicians, and *Manu Minute* explores the stories and sounds of Hawai'i's birds. These investments were informed by audience feedback and made possible by community support.

## A Loss for Public Radio

HPR and the public radio community lost a beloved member in 2021. Neal Conan, who spent 36 years with National Public Radio and 11 years as the host of *Talk of the Nation*, passed away at the age of 71. From 2017 until 2019, he wrote and produced the *Pacific News Minute* for HPR. HPR Vice President and News Director Bill Dorman said, "Neal believed in what he did and in the potential for an even greater reach. His work makes the rest of us want to do ours better."





# Music & Entertainment

New local and national programs add variety and vibrancy to HPR's listening schedule

As gathering limits stretched over a second year, HPR's music and entertainment programming remained a safe haven for reflection, enrichment, and welcome moments of levity. HPR-2, the State's only dedicated classical music station, continued to serve expertly curated programming from the islands and around the world.

HPR continued to support local performers throughout the pandemic and welcomed the return of in studio guests when it was safe to do so. Tune in for Music Director Gene Schiller's interview with Hawai'i Symphony Orchestra guest conductor Lidiya Yankovskaya when HPR-2 resumes broadcasts of HSO performances in early 2022 (1).

Among our local hosts, Ray Cruz ended his 30 years as program host and con-

cluded the run of *Latin Beat* and Derrick Malama concluded his 19-year run as host of *Kanikapila Sunday*. For his final broadcast as host, Derrick was joined by the program's new host, Louise Keali'iloma King Lanzilotti, and slack key guitarist Jeff Peterson who performed Derrick's favorites live in our studios (2).

In addition, Sharene Lum Taba (3) joins the *Evening Concert* team (weeknights at 6 pm), and *Bridging the Gap* (weeknights at 10 pm) welcomes hosts Marc Ito, Aisha Kadomatsu, and Roger County.

We're expanding our Hawaiian music offerings with: *Hawai'i Kulāiwi* (Sundays at 6 pm), an exploration of past and present expressions of Hawaiian music through the lenses of language and place, hosted by Paige Okamura (DJ Mermaid) (4) and

*Mauka to Makai* (Sundays at 4 pm), hosted by Roger Bong (5), will explore the diverse musical styles of Hawai'i musicians ranging from jazz and soul to folk and rock and more.

Music lovers will also enjoy *Off the Road*, Dave Lawrence's conversations with renowned musicians about their experiences during the pandemic, new projects, and classic stories (6).

Lastly, new national shows joining our lineup include: *Living on Earth* (Thursdays at 6:30 pm); *World Cafe* (Fridays at 8 pm); and *It's Been a Minute* (Saturdays at noon). Collectively, these programs bring fresh perspectives on world events, music, and environmental change.



# The Power Of Community

## Live Music, Livestreamed

A total of 12 concerts were livestreamed from HPR's Atherton Studio to audiences across the state and beyond, and included genres as diverse as ukulele, boogie-woogie piano, and exotica. The year also featured two members-only concerts with Jerry Santos and Jeff Peterson.



## Generation Listen

HPR's Generation Listen continued to offer a variety of events to cultivate and engage younger listeners. Virtual trivia continued to be a popular recurring event, as well as book clubs and podcast listening parties. Some of the most popular events had an interactive element, such as Rosé with José: attendees sipped along at home as HPR's president José A. Fajardo and local sommelier Chris Ramelb led a guided tasting of four rosé wines.

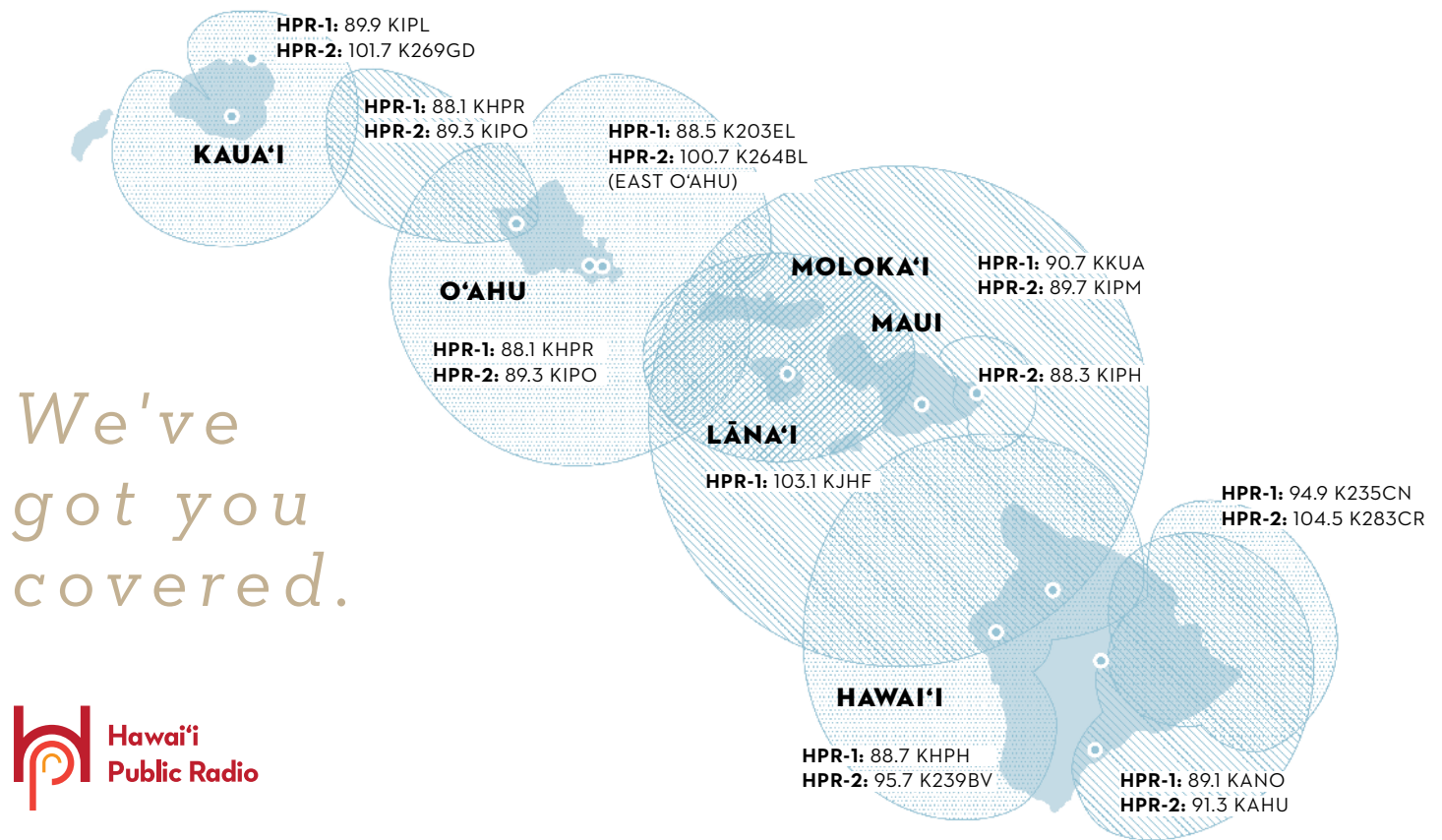


## A National Show "Visit"

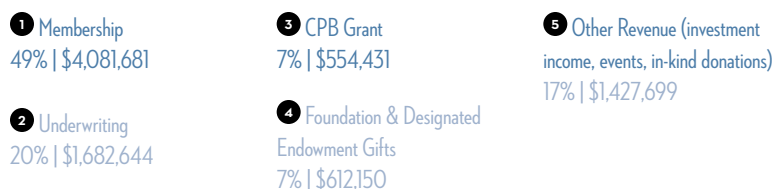

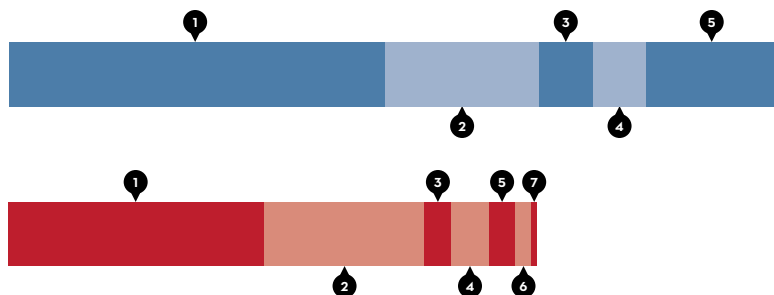
Careful fiscal planning, together with generous community support, keep HPR strong

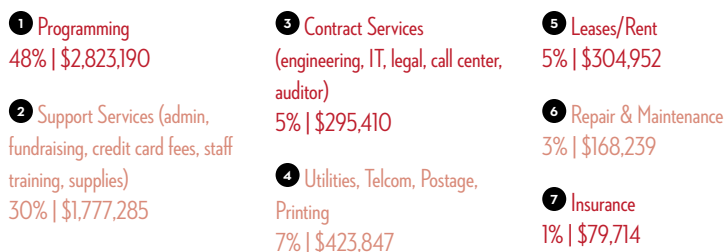
## HPR'S FISCAL YEAR 2020/2021

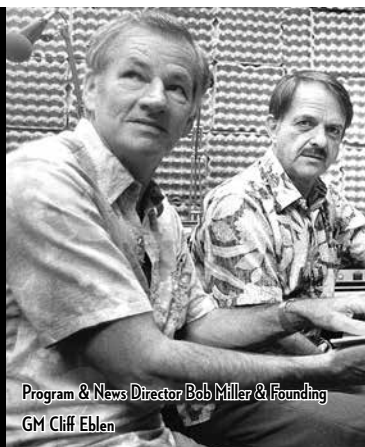
