This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information request I received November 12, 2024. On November 19, 2024, I sent a Notice to Extend Response Time for FOIA. The new date for response was no later than December 05, 2024.

To the extent the records exist and are in the possession and control of the Isabella County Sheriff's Office, your request is granted in part and the records, are enclosed. Please be advised that your request is denied in part and have made the following redactions to the incident report(s):

Names, physical descriptions, dates of birth, street address, telephone numbers and driver license numbers are exempt from disclosure. Being involved in a fatal auto accident is considered personal, intimate or embarrassing in nature. Since this information would have no bearing on the inner workings of government, the release of said information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. MCL 15.243 13 (1)(a)(b)(iii)


This incident is still under active investigation. The report is not complete and remains open pending further evidence analysis. To release photos, videos and portions of our investigation at this time would jeopardize the integrity of the case and interfere with law enforcement proceedings.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (EXCERPT)

Act 442 of 1976

15.240.amended Options by requesting person; appeal; actions by public body; receipt of written appeal; judicial review; civil action; venue; de novo proceeding; burden of proof; private view of public record; contempt; assignment of action or appeal for hearing, trial, or argument; attorneys' fees, costs, and disbursements; assessment of award; damages.

Sec. 10.

(1) If a public body makes a final determination to deny all or a portion of a request, the requesting person may do 1 of the following at his or her option:

(a) Submit to the head of the public body a written appeal that specifically states the word "appeal" and identifies the reason or reasons for reversal of the denial.

(b) Commence a civil action in the circuit court, or if the decision of a state public body is at issue, the court of claims, to compel the public body's disclosure of the public records within 180 days after a public body's final determination to deny a request.

(2) Within 10 business days after receiving a written appeal pursuant to subsection (1)(a), the head of a public body shall do 1 of the following:

(a) Reverse the disclosure denial.

(b) Issue a written notice to the requesting person upholding the disclosure denial.

(c) Reverse the disclosure denial in part and issue a written notice to the requesting person upholding the disclosure denial in part.

(d) Under unusual circumstances, issue a notice extending for not more than 10 business days the period during which the head of the public body shall respond to the written appeal. The head of a public body shall not issue more than 1 notice of extension for a particular written appeal.

(3) A board or commission that is the head of a public body is not considered to have received a written appeal under subsection (2) until the first regularly scheduled meeting of that board or commission following submission of the written appeal under subsection (1)(a). If the head of the public body fails to respond to a written appeal pursuant to subsection (2), or if the head of the public body upholds all or a portion of the disclosure denial that is the subject of the written appeal, the requesting person may seek judicial review of the nondisclosure by commencing a civil action under subsection (1)(b).

(4) In an action commenced under subsection (1)(b), a court that determines a public record is not exempt from disclosure shall order the public body to cease withholding or to produce all or a portion of a public record wrongfully withheld, regardless of the location of the public record. Venue for an action against a local public body is proper in the circuit court for the county in which the public record or an office of the public body is located has venue over the action. The court shall determine the matter de novo and the burden is on the public body to sustain its denial. The court, on its own motion, may view the public record in controversy in private before reaching a decision. Failure to comply with an order of the court may be punished as contempt of court.

(5) An action commenced under this section and an appeal from an action commenced under this section shall be assigned for hearing and trial or for argument at the earliest practicable date and expedited in every way.

(6) If a person asserting the right to inspect, copy, or receive a copy of all or a portion of a public record prevails in an action commenced under this section, the court shall award reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and disbursements. If the person or public body prevails in part, the court may, in its discretion, award all or an appropriate portion of reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and disbursements. The award shall be assessed against the public body liable for damages under subsection (7).

(7) If the court determines in an action commenced under this section that the public body has arbitrarily and capriciously violated this act by refusal or delay in disclosing or providing copies of a public record, the court shall order the public body to pay a civil fine of \$1,000.00, which shall be deposited into the general fund of the state treasury. The court shall award, in addition to any actual or compensatory damages, punitive damages in the amount of \$1,000.00 to the person seeking the right to inspect or receive a copy of a public record. The damages shall not be assessed against an individual, but shall be assessed against the next succeeding public body that is not an individual and that kept or maintained the public record as part of its public function.

INITIAL INCIDENT**Reporting Officer: STEINERT, CLINTON****INFORMATION:**

On 9/13/2024 I was dispatched to the venue for a PIA which was a fatality accident. I arrived on scene, secured the scene and began medical assessment/treatment on the victim along with MPPD firefighters. Shortly after beginning CPR and airway clearing measures, life saving efforts were stopped by firefighters due to the extent of injuries of the victim.

At that time dispatch was informed to notify the Sheriff and radio traffic was taken to 37TAC1. The Medical Examiner Investigator was notified as was the Accident Investigators to all report to the scene. I was in command until the Sheriff arrived and took it over. Deputy Ferrier spoke with other construction workers that were on scene.

I gathered information on the suspect vehicle and the driver, I then interviewed the driver, WAYNE MORRIS WALLACE.

The deceased was identified as GREGORY GEORGE SMITH, a construction worker.

INTERVIEW WAYNE WALLACE:

I spoke to WALLACE away from the vehicle in the median. I had already gathered his drivers license and vehicle information. I asked WALLACE if he wished to speak to me voluntarily and he advised he would. [REDACTED]

WALLACE advised that he had not been drinking or doing drugs.

PBT TEST RIGHTS:

I advised WALLACE of his PBT test rights and he consented to a voluntary PBT.

PBT:

A voluntary PBT was administered from PBT #7 with a result of .000.

INFORMATION:

I, Sergeant Szidik, was contacted by Undersheriff Burns and advised there was a fatal crash on US-127 and he was requesting I respond as an accident investigator. I responded to the scene and spoke with Deputies to gather information of what had been done. Sgt. Chritz who is also an accident investigator was on scene. I am trained in accident investigation and reconstruction.

OBSERVATIONS UPON ARRIVAL:

As I was approaching the crash scene I took out my Department issued Iphone and recorded the road leading up to and past the crash site. [REDACTED]

ROAD SURFACE:

The roadway where the crash occurred is concrete. The roadway is two lanes normally, but was shifted to the outer, east, lane and shoulder for construction in the inner, west, lane. US-127 is a north and south freeway with the crash happening on the northbound side, at the River road overpass. The area the crash occurred in was signed 45mph where workers present. Otherwise the speed was signed at 60 mph, with various construction ahead signs.

SCENE MAPPING:

I used a Mavic Enterprise 3 Thermal to map the scene. Detective Bailey with CMUPD arrived on scene to stand by as pilot for the drone. Checks were made for NOTAM's and TFR's as well as the weather. Due to the close proximity to the airport a traffic control radio was picked up to monitor airport traffic. The drone was inspected prior to flying. I set up the flight route and started it. I kept visual on the drone as it flew the routes. When it was done it flew to the start point and hovered. I then flew it over towards the car and the deceased, taking photos every few feet. I then flew the drone down closer to the car and deceased and circled them, taking photos every few feet. The drone was then landed and put away.

MEASUREMENTS:

The scene was measured using and Emlid Reach RS2+, GNSS receiver. It receives corrections from the State of Michigan CORS system via a hotspot. I started with the Ground control points and then measured the roadway, cars, and marks. The data was exported to my email in a CSV file and the GCP's placed in their own file for import into DJI Terra Pro. A copy of exported file including the GCP's will be placed in the Shared drive complaint photographs under this report number.

3D MAPPING.

Sgt. Kenney will import the mapping points with the following process. He will be using DJI Terra Pro to import and process the photos. The GCP's were also imported and aerotriangulation was done before correction of the the GCP's. The map was then processed and the data exported in Terra b3dms format along with the photos and placed in the complaint photograph folder on the shared drive.

VEHICLE INSPECTION:

Prior to the vehicle being moved I physically looked around it. I looked at the rotors. [REDACTED]

From a visual inspection inside the car it was clear there were other onboard devices recording as this was a Ford test vehicle. There was a cord plugged in under the dash and one running from the glove box. From the glove box the cord was labeled "Engineering OBD"

PHOTOGRAPHS:

I took various photographs of the crash scene to include the roadway, construction zone, skid marks, and the crashed vehicle. Sheriff Main took pictures of the scene along with the deceased. The pictures were saved to the department photographs under this case number.

CONTACT FORD MOTOR COMPANY:

On the morning of 09/16/24 a Ford Motor Co employee called inquiring about the car. [REDACTED] was identified as [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] works in the department that tests vehicles and [REDACTED] is responsible for vehicle recovery after accidents. [REDACTED] was aware there was a hold at Green's Towing but stated the driver of the car had not told them what happened. [REDACTED] stated the driver is a 3rd party employee and does not actually work for Ford Motor Co, he is contracted through another employer. I informed [REDACTED] the vehicle was involved in a fatal crash and we will be examining it for our investigation. [REDACTED] provided me [REDACTED] email, [REDACTED] for further correspondence. [REDACTED] did state they possibly had data from prior to the crash but would have to check with [REDACTED] supervisor. I requested, [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] supervisor get back with me as we would like to get that data to help understand what happened. I said if they need a subpoena or search warrant I would be happy to get one to them. [REDACTED] said someone will be in touch with me. As of the end of the day on 09/16/24 I have not heard back from Ford Motor Co.

My BWC was recording for this conversation. It was tagged with this case number.
