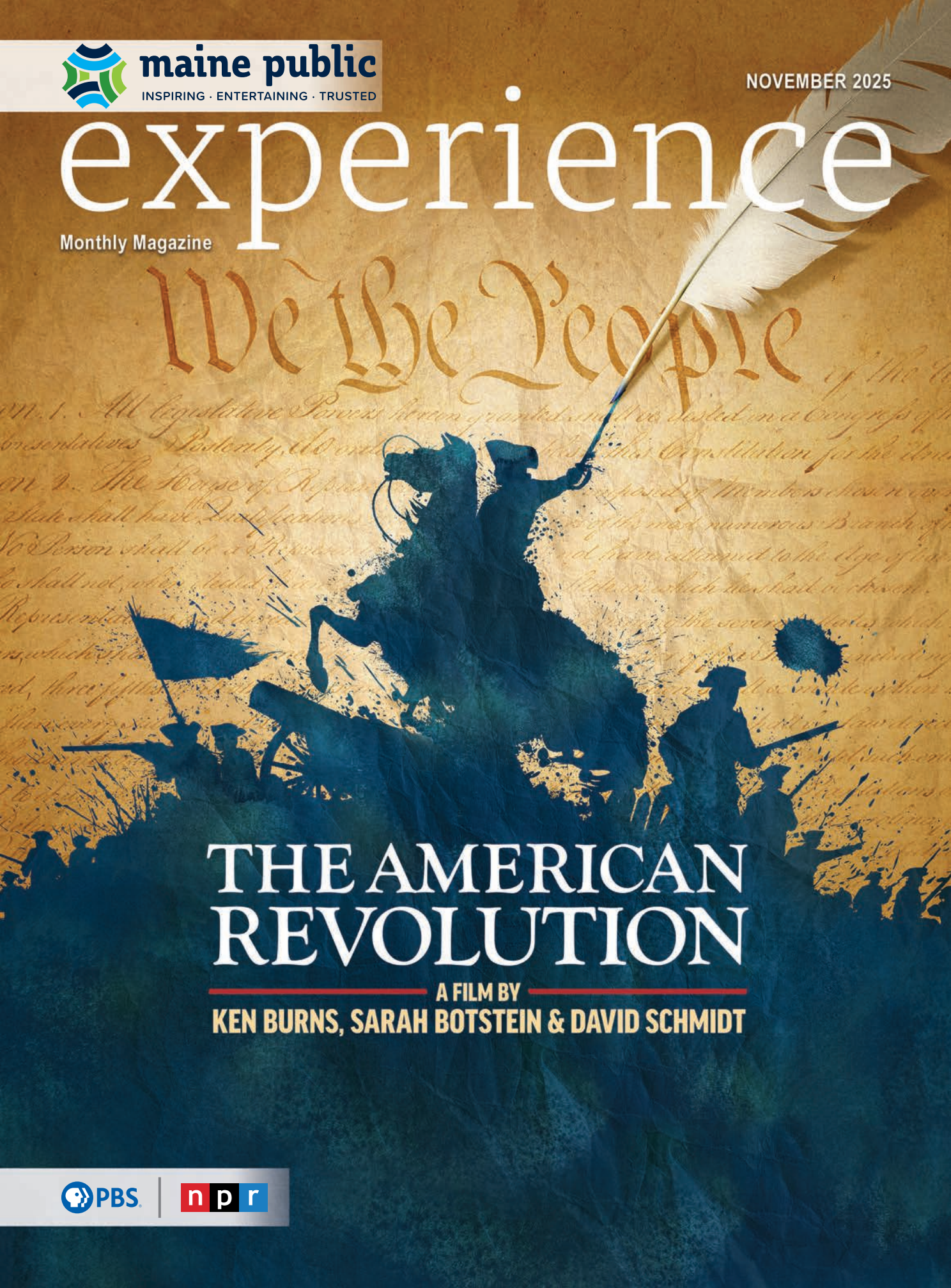

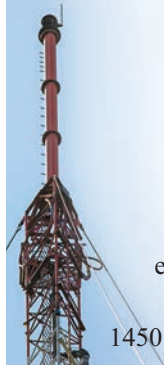

The American Revolution

A New Six-part Series begins Sunday, November 16, at 8:00 and 10:00 pm
Watch the whole series on Maine Public Television



IN THE SPRING OF 1775, thirteen American colonies united in rebellion and began an eight-year war to secure their independence from England. Then, they created a government based on new ideas about liberty, freedom, and democracy. A new six-part, 12-hour documentary directed by Ken Burns, Sarah Botstein and David Schmidt examines how America's founding shook the rest of the world and established a new form of government that radically reshaped the continent and inspired centuries of democratic movements around the globe.

An expansive look at the virtues and contradictions of the war and the birth of the United States of America, **The American Revolution** follows the men and women who experienced it – dozens of figures from a wide variety of backgrounds: the rank-and-file Continental soldiers and American militiamen (some of them teenagers), Patriot political and military leaders, British Army officers, American Loyalists, Native soldiers and civilians, enslaved and free African Americans, German soldiers in the British service, French and Spanish allies, and various civilians living in North America, Loyalist as well as Patriot, including many who were made refugees by the war.

The American Revolution was a war for independence, a civil war, and a world war. It affected millions – from Canada to the Caribbean and beyond. Few escaped its violence. The Revolution began a movement for people around the world to imagine new and better futures for themselves, their nations, and for humanity. It opened the door to advance civil liberties and human rights, and it asked questions that we are still trying to answer today.

“The Revolution was eight years of uncertainty, hope, and terror, a brutal war that engaged millions of people in North America and beyond and left tremendous loss in its wake,” said David Schmidt. “At the same time, the Revolution also changed how Americans thought about themselves, their government, and what they were capable of achieving. The United States that emerged from the war was a nation few could have imagined before the shooting began in April 1775.” ■

Stripped for Parts: American Journalism on the Brink

Tuesday, November 4, 9:00 pm



Who will control the future of America's news ecosystem: Wall Street billionaires concerned only with profit, or those who see journalism as an essential public service? Hedge fund Alden Global

Capital is quietly gobbling up newspapers nationwide and gutting them, but no one knows why – that is, until journalist Julie Reynolds begins to investigate. Her findings trigger rebellions across the country by journalists working at Alden-owned newspapers. Backed by the NewsGuild union, the newsmen and women go toe-to-toe with their “vulture capitalist” owners in a battle to save and rebuild local journalism in America. **Stripped for Parts** tells the story of their fight to protect the press and free speech from censorship in America. It tells the story of a critical battle in the movement to protect freedom of the press, the lifeblood of democracy.
