Building Provo's award-winning airport terminal was a team effort, with critical funding from the state, the federal government, Utah County, the Mountainland Association of Governments, and the city.

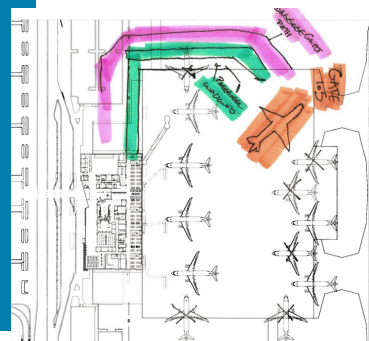

Airlines are getting creative and suggesting expansion ideas!

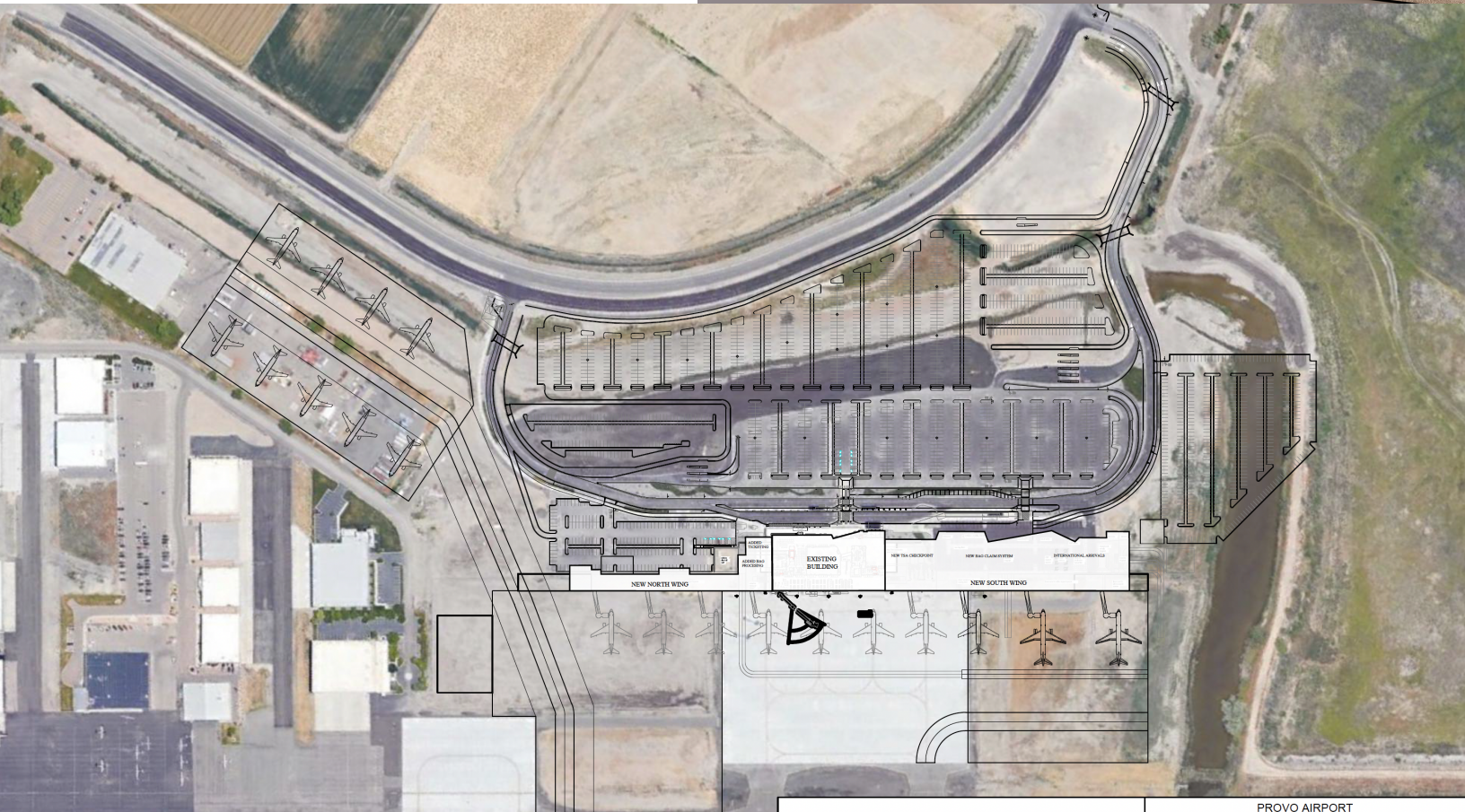
STATEWIDE IMPACT
