NEW EYE ON THE UNIVERSE

In July 2022, NASA's James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) released its first images, looking further back in time than ever before to show our universe in stunningly beautiful detail. Within hours of the images' release, *Nova*'s "Ultimate Space Telescope" told the dramatic story of the decades-long development, exciting launch, and successful deployment of the most ambitious telescope ever made.

But that was just the beginning. Instead of orbiting Earth like its predecessor, the Hubble Space Telescope, JWST orbits the sun at a position about 1 million miles farther out than Earth's orbit. The space telescope, a project 30 years in the making, launched in December 2021 and arrived at its destination point in January. After a lengthy "unfolding" process, JWST turned its 21-foot mirror on the stars.

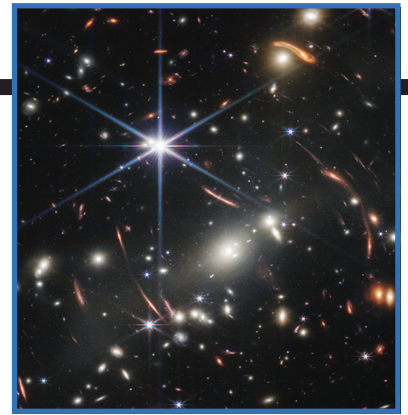
Today we see its first observations. With tons of new data and spectacular images flooding in, *Nova*'s "New Eye on the Universe" follows scientists as they peer deep in time to answer some of astronomy's biggest questions. How did the first stars and galaxies form? What role did supermassive black holes and dark matter play? And can we see the fingerprints of life in the atmospheres of distant exoplanets?

These three dazzling images from JWST are among the deepest and sharpest infrared images of the distant universe to date.

This massive landscape of cosmic mountains and valleys in the Carina Nebula is known as the "Cosmic Cliffs." Here the bubbles, cavities and jets of newborn stars are made visible through the dust in a way that was impossible before JWST. The tallest "peaks" are a staggering seven light years high.



Teeming with thousands of galaxies, this image represents a tiny speck of outer space about the size of a grain of sand held up at arm's length. The image shows a Galaxy Cluster as it appeared some 4.6 billion years ago.



This image shows the compact galaxy group Stephan's Quintet in unprecedented detail, with clusters of young, sparkling stars and starburst regions where new stars are being born.

London Super Tunnel

For over a decade, more than 10,000 engineers and construction workers race to build a brand-new subterranean railroad under London—the Elizabeth Line—London's new Underground. The construction teams confront immense challenges, from building platforms and concourses the size of aircraft carriers hidden under London's busiest shopping venue, Oxford Street, to designing, outfitting, and testing a fleet of 70 new high-speed trains from scratch in just two years.

Drawing on more than 1,500 hours of footage, "London Super Tunnel" on *Nova* provides intimate glimpses of the challenges, setbacks, and ingenious solutions that lead to ultimate success, as the Queen finally opens the Elizabeth Line on May 24, 2022.

Star Chasers of Senegal

In *Nova*'s "Star Chasers of Senegal," a NASA spacecraft named Lucy blasts off from Cape Canaveral on a mission to the Trojans, a group of 4 billion-year-old asteroids over 400 million miles from Earth, that bear witness to everything that has happened in the solar system since the first day.

Just hours before, in Senegal, West Africa, a team of scientists sets out to capture extraordinarily precise observations vital to the success of the Lucy mission—crucial data needed to help NASA navigate Lucy to its asteroid targets.

The team's leader, Senegalese astronomer Maram Kaire, takes viewers on a journey to investigate his nation's deep history of astronomy, reaching back thousands of years—and the promising future ahead.

Ancient Builders of the Amazon

"Ancient Builders of the Amazon" reports on the stunning discoveries that are transforming our understanding of the Amazon as a primeval wilderness. Intricate settlements built by an ancient civilization have been discovered in the Bolivian Amazon where they have laid hidden under the thick tree canopies for centuries. LiDAR 3-D technology has allowed archaeologists to see through the canopy to reveal hundreds of previously unknown settlements from the Casarabe culture of 500-1400 AD.

New research suggests that for more than 2,000 years, the region was home to populations in the millions. Despite lacking vital resources, these ancient builders completely reshaped their surroundings and thrived in a landscape that today would prove difficult.

PASSAGE^{TO} SWEDEN

Why do countries behave so differently toward their religious and ethnic minorities? How much does leadership matter? Why do some ordinary people risk their lives to save others?

Passage to Sweden examines these questions through the prism of the widely differing experiences of Scandinavian Jews during World War II. Between 1940-1945, the sheer luck of where you were living—Sweden, Denmark or Norway—made a world of difference.

Sweden was a neutral country, avoiding attack and occupation because of its rich natural resources that the Germans needed for their war effort. Denmark and Norway were both attacked on April 9, 1940, and the film reveals the contrasting ways in which their respective leaders (and ordinary civilians) behaved.

When 100,000 German troops entered Denmark, the country's 20,000-strong army was no match, and the country was overrun within 24 hours. Denmark's King Christian X played a major role in setting the tone of civilian behavior—riding his horse through the streets of Copenhagen calming his people's fears and reassuring the Jewish population that he would protect them.

In September 1943, the Germans ordered that the country's Jews should be deported and mass deportations were scheduled to begin on the eve of Rosh Hashana. But when the Germans arrived to arrest people, they found their homes empty—they had taken refuge with their Christian neighbors. Almost 8,000 Jews (97 percent of the Jewish population of Denmark) were smuggled out of the country by Danish fishermen despite the danger.

In almost every country across Europe, Jewish properties had been ransacked. But when Danish Jews returned, they found their

homes and synagogues intact. As one returning survivor recounts, "there was no vandalism, there was no robbery, there was no stealing, there was no looting. And when we arrived in the harbor of Copenhagen in 1945 and we walked home and my father put the key in the door, there was the table still standing [which] my mother had set a year and a half before [when] we had left."

What happened to the 400 plus Danish Jews who didn't make it out? They were shipped to Theresienstadt—where the Danish government continued to oversee their welfare. Almost all returned home. And this was at Theresienstadt, where more than 90% of others who passed through died or were sent elsewhere to be killed.

Compare and contrast that with the experience of neighboring Jews in Norway. Not long after the invasion, King Haakon VII and the legitimate government of Norway fled to London, and Vidkun Quisling, a notorious Nazi sympathizer and collaborator, was appointed head of state. Following German orders, the civilian authorities instituted increasingly oppressive policies against the small Jewish population of 2,200.

When the Germans decided in November 1942 to start deportations, 100 taxis were deployed around Oslo to pick up one family after another and deliver all 771 of them to the SS *Donau* and then on to Auschwitz. At the end of the war, when a handful of survivors from the camps returned to their homes, everything had been taken from them—their homes, their bank accounts, everything.

Ruthless: Monopoly's Secret History

For generations, Monopoly has been America's favorite board game, a love letter to unbridled capitalism—for better or worse. But behind the myth of the game's creation is an untold tale of theft, obsession and corporate double-dealing. "Ruthless: Monopoly's Secret History" on **American Experience** presents the fascinating true story of the game and those who created it.

In 1904, a left-wing American feminist called Lizzy Magie patented The Landlord's Game, a board game that evolved into what we now know as Monopoly. But 30 years later, when Monopoly was first marketed in the United States during the Great Depression, it was Charles Darrow, a desperate out-of-work salesman from Pennsylvania, who was credited with inventing it. At the time, the game wasn't sold in a box, but passed from friend to friend. Darrow learned about the game by playing it at a friend's house.

Even though much of the true story has been around for 40 years, the Charles Darrow myth persists as an inspirational parable of American innovation. After Darrow sold a version of the game to Parker Brothers and it became a phenomenal success, eventually making him millions, one journalist after another asked him how he had managed to invent Monopoly out of thin air. "It's a freak," Darrow told the *Germantown Bulletin*, a Philadelphia paper. "Entirely unexpected and illogical."

Dogs in the Wild on NATURE

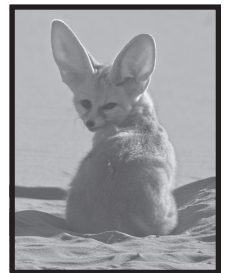
"Dogs in the Wild," on **Nature** is a three-part miniseries that travels the globe with an eye toward revealing the secrets of the most successful carnivore on the planet: the canids (wild dogs). From the recognizable like foxes, wolves, African wild dogs and coyotes to the lesser-known ones like the Japanese raccoon dog, New Guinea singing dog, dholes and dingoes, canids have conquered every continent except Antarctica.

One family, 37 different faces. "Meet the Family" introduces the many species of canids. The formidable Arctic wolf can travel great distances across the tundra, while in Southern India, Dholes have 11 distinct calls to stand out from the pack.

Elvis Presley: '68 Comeback Special

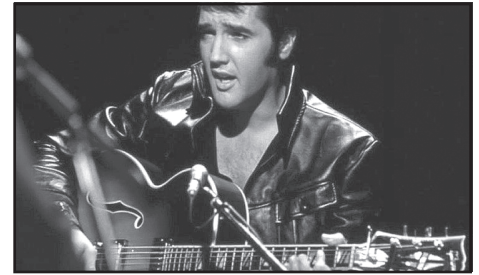

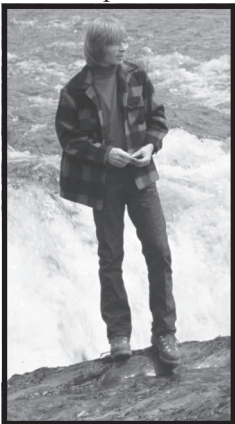

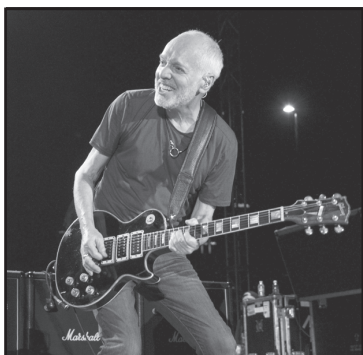

From "The Beverly Hillbillies" to "Thunder Road," moonshiners have been portrayed as lazy, drunk outlaws who are unable to hold a regular job, wear long beards and have longer arrest records with few redeeming qualities except for their entertainment value. **Spirits** re-looks at moonshining in the context of how it allowed farmers to survive difficult circumstances.

Mountaineers were masters of making something out of nothing, whether it's crops from bare soil or liquor from corn and fruit. These are the fascinating, funny, and heart-rendering stories of the moonshiners, who evaded the law (sometimes) and found creative ways to survive.

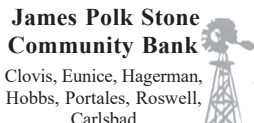

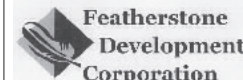

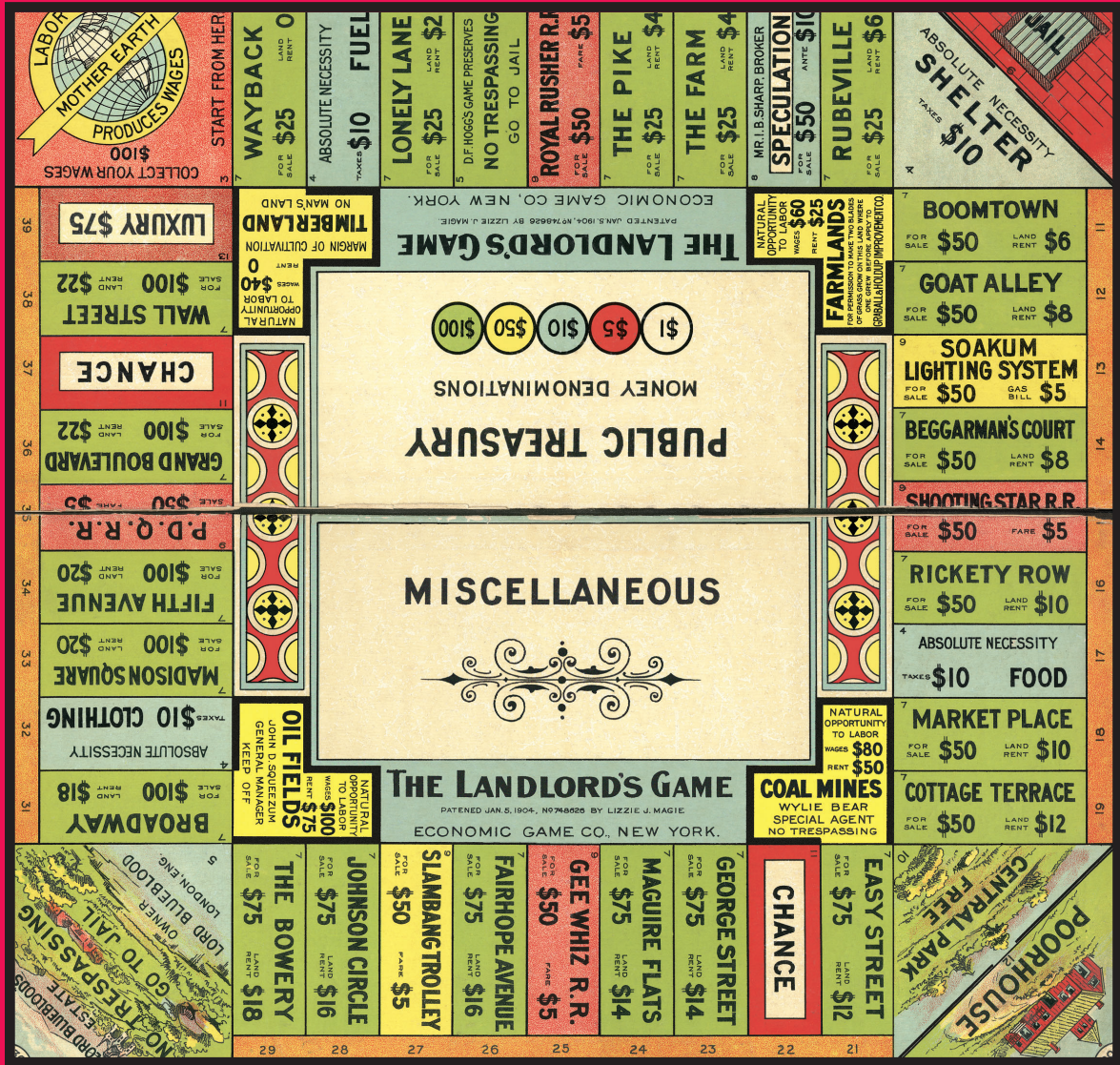
