A Maine Public Vehicle Donation Story

We received over 900 vehicles in 2023! Every car donated helps us keep the programs we all love going strong year after year. Among

the vehicles donated, a very special one came from Margaret Shaw of Penobscot. Her story is a wonderful testament to her love of her family and her appreciation of public media.

"In 1975, I moved to Maine from Antigonish, Nova Scotia, as a graduate student at UMaine. I met my husband, Joe, an American, and settled in the Penobscot Valley. Often homesick, I drove to Antigonish a few times a year to visit my parents and siblings. This is a beautiful eight/nine-hour trip, usually taking Route 9 East, known as the 'Airline' arriving at the Canadian border at St. Stephen, then catching the TransCanada all the way home, each round trip, a 1,000 miles. I drove many great used vehicles during those 32 years, a Chevy Vega, followed by a Ford Mustang, a small Nissan truck, a Plymouth station wagon, a large Ford station wagon, a Toyota Corolla and a Honda sedan.

In the summer of 2009, I was called home to help Mum care for my Dad. He had been diagnosed with brain cancer and we didn't know how long we would have him. I realized that I would be driving back and forth alone for months, so I chose to buy a car that I could trust, a new, shiny, silver Toyota Matrix with a moonroof! Since that time, both Mum and Dad have passed. The Matrix has served me well; it allowed me to confidently drive home to care for, and say goodbye to both of my parents and visit my siblings and friends. So many good memories with my shiny, silver Matrix!

Joe and I depend on Maine Public for all our news coverage and entertainment. As Evergreen Members, we believe in community supported broadcasting; donating the Matrix is our small gesture of support."

Attakapas: The Cajun Story

Thursday, January 4, 9:00 pm;

A moving story traces the lineage of one of America's unique and influential immigrant populations and transports the viewer into the heart of their journey. This dynamic, immersive multi-media concert combines historical stills and moving images with Cajun singer/songwriter Zachary Richard's music. **Attakapas** chronicles the Acadian's departure from France and their expulsion from Nova Scotia to their arrival at the Poste des Attakapas, now St. Martinville, Louisiana. The documentary tells the history of the

Acadian people and addresses three main points: starting a new life, immigration and intolerance. The history and culture of Louisiana's Acadian people is told through 12 of Richard's songs in a mix of French and English-language, archival photography and film, landscape footage of the bayou, and re-enactment of the Acadian's historical emigration from France and Canada.

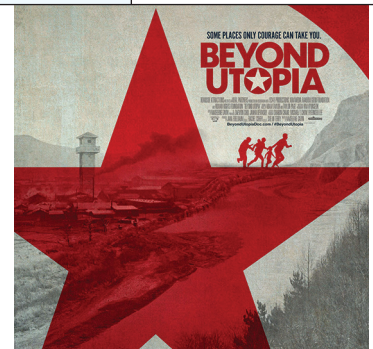

Britain's Secret Islands | Begins Saturday, January 6, 8:45 pm

The United Kingdom comprises over 6,100 islands and rock formations. These fragments of land are Britain's secret islands. Scattered across the British coast, these areas are home to rich cultures, ancient history, unique wildlife, and spectacular landscapes. Explorer Stewart McPherson travels to the most remote British isles to explore five-thousand-year-old ruins and Viking heritage, shipwrecks, and immense seabird colonies, diverse reefs, and wildlife that is found nowhere else on Earth. The four-part series presents an extraordinary side of the United Kingdom that few

know exists. Stewart leads viewers on a journey to some of these least-known islands, exploring their wildlife, meeting the locals, and learning about the history and culture of these areas. He begins in the Farne Islands, home to many seals and seabirds, early Christian communities, and the first attack by Viking raiders. *Credit: Simon Vacher.*

Small animals, even tiny ones, must sometimes make epic journeys to find a home or a mate. While the distances may not seem monumental to us, to these little creatures the journey is monumental. Grasses appear like skyscrapers, mounds become mountains and raindrops fall as big as cars. Some of these heroic little travelers risk it all to complete big journeys against the odds. A new three-part series dives into the worlds of six tiny animals as they embark upon the greatest adventures of their lives, traveling through extraordinary landscapes where every little step counts. Small creatures are followed in Canada, South Africa, Taiwan, Brazil and Scotland. NOVA When Whales Could Walk | Wednesday, January 31, 9:00 pm



In Egypt's Sahara Desert, massive skeletons with strange skulls and gigantic teeth jut out from the sandy ground. This fossil graveyard, millions of years old, is known as Wadi Al-Hitan, the "Valley of the Whales." Now, paleontologists have unearthed a whole new species of ancient whale dating to 43 million years ago, and this predator wasn't just able to swim – it also had four legs and could walk. Scientists search for new clues to the winding evolutionary path of these mammals that moved from the land into the sea to become the largest animals on Earth. Wadi Al-Hitan is the most important site in the world to demonstrate one of the iconic changes that make up the record of life on Earth: the evolution of the whales. *Credit: Ahmed Mosaad.* ■

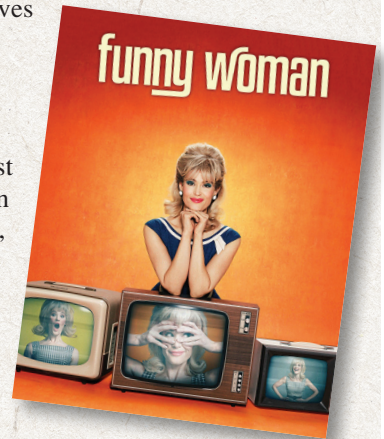
