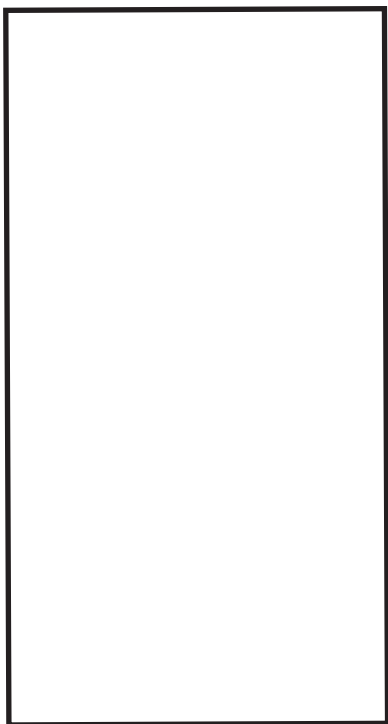

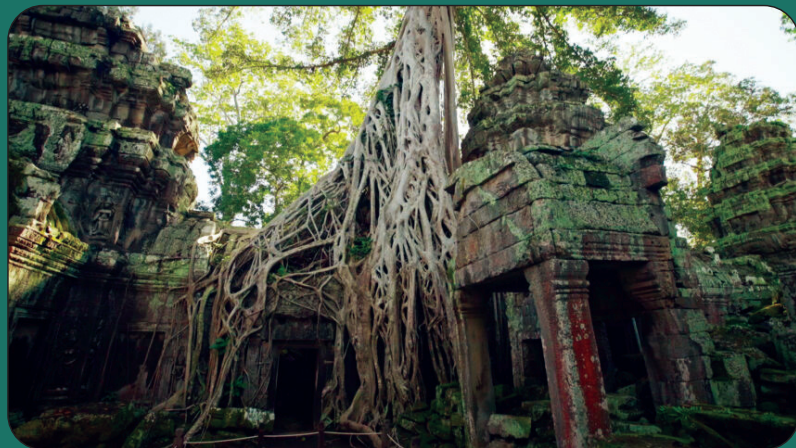

The Stones Are Speaking

The Stones Are Speaking tells the extraordinary story of how archaeologist Michael Collins saved a looted 30-acre parcel of land in Central Texas and transformed it into one of the most important prehistoric sites in the Americas. Through his persistence and personal sacrifice, Collins uncovered the Gault Archaeological Site, where his team discovered over two million artifacts, including tools, stone points, and ancient engravings, and found evidence of human presence dating back nearly 20,000 years.

This documentary is part archaeology, part human drama, following Collins's fight to preserve the site and shed light on early human life in North America. With interviews, excavation footage, and rarely-seen artifacts, The Stones Are Speaking turns forgotten dirt into proof that people lived on this land long before previously believed. It shows how one person's commitment can reshape our understanding of history and why some stones still have stories to tell.

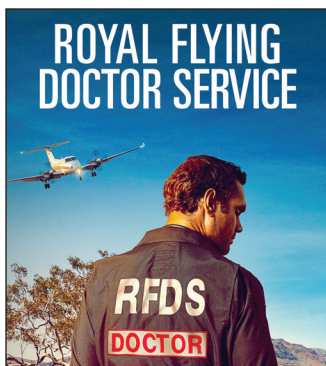

Thomas Paine's To Begin the World Over Again

This one-man play tells the extraordinary story of Thomas Paine, the radical thinker whose words helped ignite revolutions in America and France. Paine lived by one principle above all others: "one must always speak the truth as one sees it, no matter the consequences." A most dangerous commitment that had him nearly hung in England, nearly guillotined in France, jeered, spat at, and refused a mug of beer and the right to vote when he returned to America.

The play traces his journey from a modest English childhood to the upheavals of revolution and his final years in America, highlighting his fearless commitment to reason, equality, and human rights. Through excerpts from his greatest works, the performance brings his ideas vividly to life and shows how one voice can challenge dogma and change the world. To Begin the World Over Again is a stirring portrait of a misunderstood visionary whose ideas remain urgent and inspiring today.

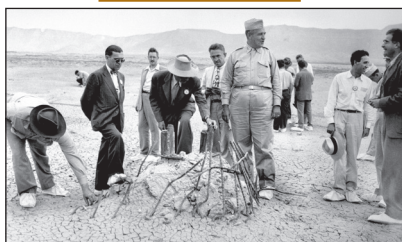

Bombshell

"Bombshell" explores the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and how the U.S. government shaped the story for the public. Through propaganda, censorship, and media control, authorities minimized the human suffering and long-term effects of radiation while presenting a narrative of atomic power as a force for good.

The film follows brave journalists who risked careers to reveal the devastating reality. Archival footage, eyewitness accounts, and newly uncovered documents bring to light the human toll: an estimated 140,000 people died in Hiroshima and 74,000 in Nagasaki by the end of 1945. "Bombshell" examines how these reporters challenged the official narrative and exposes a story that was long hidden from the world, revealing the full cost of the first use of nuclear weapons in history.

From That Small Island: The Story of the Irish is a sweeping four-part series that traces more than 8,000 years of history, from the island's first settlers to the global Irish diaspora that now numbers over 80 million. Shot on location in 17 countries and narrated by Colin Farrell, the series travels across time and continents to explore what it really means to be Irish.

Viewers meet ancient ancestors like "Rathlin Man," whose reconstructed face reveals details about life in prehistoric times, and hear personal tales of emigration, cultural exchange, and far-flung influence. From Viking invasions and medieval hardships to modern migration and identity, the series connects generations and continents in a rich, human story of belonging, resilience, and global legacy.

Bookish

Step into post-war London, where mysteries unfold between the shelves of a cozy, cluttered antiquarian bookshop. Bookish, a six-episode mystery series, follows sharp-witted bookseller Gabriel Book, whose vast literary knowledge makes him an invaluable asset to the police. Each case plays out over two episodes, blending careful clues, rich atmosphere, and the charm of a classic whodunit.

Gabriel's world centers on the bookshop he shares with his spirited wife, Trottie, on a picture-perfect historic lane. With its mix of suspense, humor, and old-world comfort, Bookish offers a mystery solved one carefully turned page at a time.

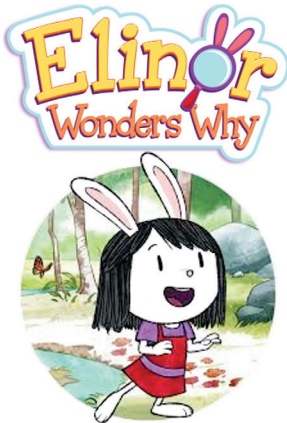

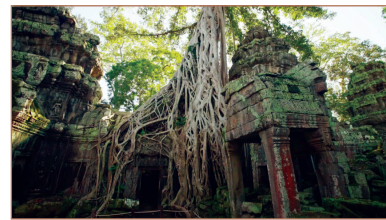

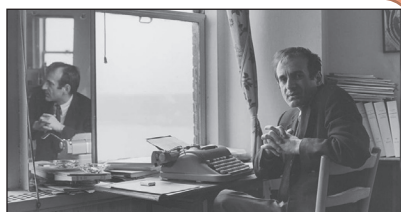

Elie Wiesel: Soul on Fire



"Elie Wiesel: Soul on Fire" presents a moving portrait of Holocaust survivor, Nobel Peace Prize-winning author, and tireless human rights advocate Elie Wiesel. The film traces his journey from a small Jewish town in Romania through the horrors of Auschwitz and Buchenwald, to his life rebuilding in France and finally his emergence in America as a powerful voice against injustice.

Using Wiesel's own words and voice, rare archival photos, personal papers, and hand-painted animation, the documentary explores how he turned suffering into a mission of memory, moral clarity, and hope. Over decades, Wiesel authored more than 50 books, including the seminal memoir *Night*, taught at universities, and spoke out wherever human dignity was threatened. "Soul on Fire" captures the inner life behind the public figure — a man haunted yet unbroken, committed to awakening conscience in a world too often silent.

Queens of Combat

"Queens of Combat" sends viewers on a sweeping journey across Europe to investigate a surprising question: did women ever fight alongside men as gladiators in Ancient Rome? An international team of historians, archaeologists, and forensic experts pieces together a trail of clues, from a marble relief showing two female fighters to skeletal remains discovered in London, arguing that female gladiators, though rare, once stood in the arena.

Through expert analysis, artifacts, and historical records, "Queens of Combat" reveals how these gladiatrices may have fought, lived, and died, not merely as exotic curiosities but as real combatants whose stories have long been erased. It is a powerful reconsideration of gender, power, and spectacle in the Roman world.
