Essential Question

What is it like to work as a firefighter?

Vocabulary

- Firehose A strong, flexible tube used by firefighters to spray water on fires.
- Nozzle The part at the end of a firehose that controls the flow and direction of the water.
- Ladder Truck A special fire truck with a long, extendable ladder used to reach high places like windows and roofs.
- **Turnout Gear –** The protective clothing firefighters wear, including coats, pants, boots, and helmets.
- Air Tank (SCBA) A tank filled with clean air that firefighters wear on their backs so
 they can breathe in smoky or dangerous environments.(SCBA stands for Self-Contained
 Breathing Apparatus)
- Hydrant A water source found on the street that firefighters connect their hoses to in order to get water
- Fire Extinguisher A handheld device that sprays chemicals to put out small fires.
- **Dispatch** The communication center that sends firefighters to emergencies and tells them where to go.

Before Viewing

Have students jot down answers to the following questions:

- What does it mean to be a firefighter?
- What are the job duties of a firefighter?
- What is the typical work environment of a firefighter?
- What tools are used by a firefighter to do his/her daily tasks?
- What is the education required to be a firefighter?
- What are the skills necessary for being a firefighter?
