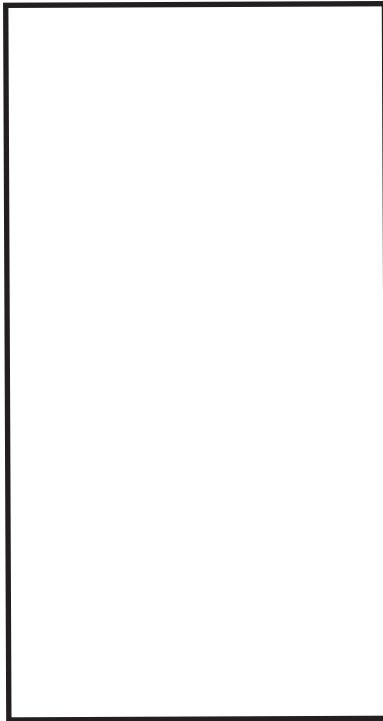

BLACK AND JEWISH AMERICA

AN INTERWOVEN HISTORY



This four-part docuseries explores the complex relationship between Black Americans and Jewish Americans. Hosted by Dr. Henry Louis Gates, Jr., the series traces how the two communities that began on very different footing were drawn together in the early 20th century by entrenched racism and rising antisemitism. These shared experiences led to productive civic partnerships and creative collaborations in music and film that helped shape American popular culture.

The relationship deepened after World War II, as the horrors of the Holocaust reinforced a sense of common struggle. The civil rights era marked a high point, when Jewish Americans worked closely with Black leaders to dismantle Jim Crow segregation. The series also examines how this historic alliance fractured as social and political realities shifted, and as each community turned inward in an increasingly divided America.

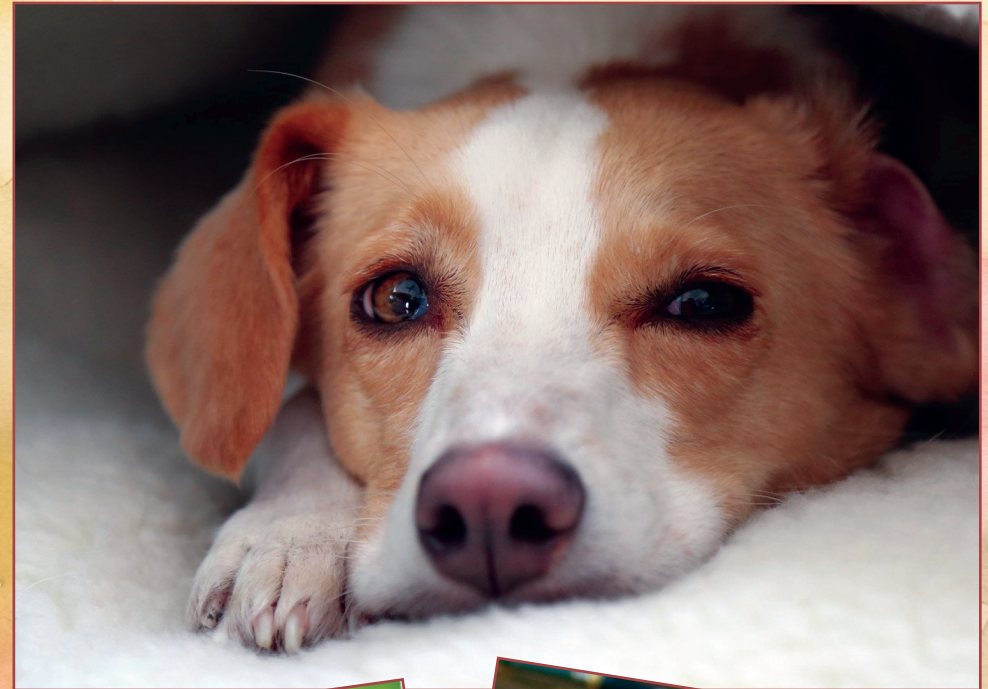

Land with No Rider

In the rugged reaches of southwestern New Mexico, four aging cattle ranchers face a vanishing way of life. Set in the Mimbres River Valley, **Land with No Rider** is a quietly powerful portrait of the last New Mexico cowboys, living between protected wilderness and industrial land as drought, policy, and time reshape their world. Through intimate conversations, the film captures daily rituals such as listening to snow fall, tending cattle at dusk, and singing along to the radio. This poetic 90-minute documentary reimagines cowboy life as an act of resilience, stewardship, and quiet resistance in a fragile land.

LIFE & LEGACY OF MEDGAR EVERS



In celebration of Black History month, **Everlasting**, a two-part series, honors the life, work, and impact of one of Mississippi's most courageous voices, who was assassinated outside his home in 1963. Originally from Decatur, Mississippi, Medgar Evers played a pivotal role in the civil rights movement as the state's first field secretary for the NAACP. He organized voter registration drives, investigated acts of racial violence, and advocated for the desegregation of public institutions. The film traces the lasting impact of his work — and his death — on his family and the nation.

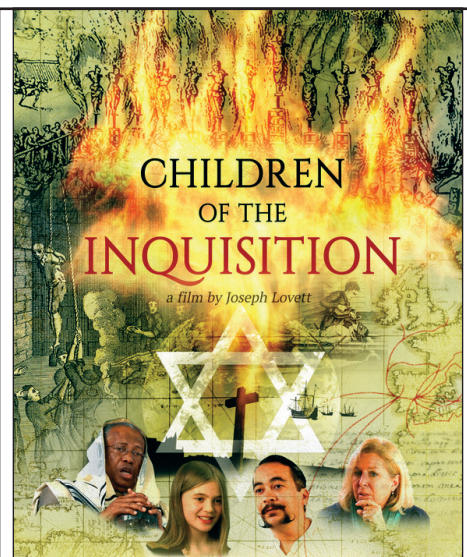

The Quest for Camelot

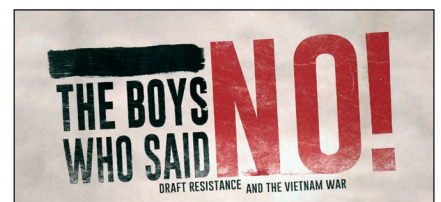

Their complex journeys across continents and oceans with ever-changing names and identities are masterfully described in the film by the leading historians of the Sephardic diaspora. The film spotlights the surprising diversity of the Jewish diaspora.

This documentary tells the story of the youth-led movement of nonviolent resistance to the Vietnam War, sparked when one man publicly burned his draft card in protest. At a time when American men were required to carry their draft card at all times, thousands chose principle over compliance, facing imprisonment for saying no, while countless others served in combat and made profound sacrifices.

The film explores the antiwar movement alongside the broader context of the war and the experiences of veterans. It examines how these acts of civil disobedience helped shape movements for peace and social justice, offering a fuller picture of this pivotal chapter in American history.

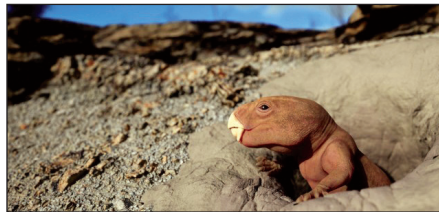

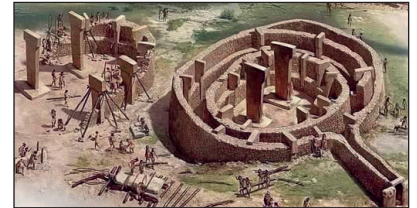

Stone Age Temple Mystery

Göbekli Tepe, the world's oldest known temple complex at 11,000 years old, remains one of archaeology's greatest mysteries. The discovery of Göbekli Tepe rewrites history by showing complex religious structures emerged before settled agriculture. Marked Man: Martin Luther King and the FBI

This documentary explores the fraught relationship between Martin Luther King Jr. and J. Edgar Hoover, the powerful and feared head of the FBI. Throughout the 1960s, Hoover viewed King as a dangerous threat, convinced he was influenced by Communists and determined to undermine America. Under Hoover's direction, the FBI carried out an aggressive campaign of surveillance and intimidation, tracking King's movements and even sending threatening letters that urged him to take his own life. Through this chilling history, the film reveals the depth of Hoover's vendetta, the stark contrast between King's commitment to peaceful change and Hoover's resistance to it, and the lasting consequences of the latter's unchecked power in American society.

Two-hundred and fifty years ago, three powers clashed in an epic struggle for North America. Often overshadowed by the American Revolution, the French and Indian War (1754-1763) determined which great European empire would control the Ohio River Valley, the gateway to the West, and the crucial highway of rivers and lakes connecting New York and Montreal.

Forgotten War focuses on the time period known as the "Five Year War" (1755-1760) and recounts the little-known story of how the Indian nations of the Northeast controlled the outcome of this war. A panel of experts digs beneath the familiar history and sheds new light on this long-ago conflict. The documentary follows the fates of the Abenaki and Iroquois people, separates fact from the myth of Robert Rogers and his legendary Rangers and chronicles the "massacre" at Fort William Henry, the battles of Fort Ticonderoga and Crown Point, the tragic expulsion of the Acadians, and the fall of Quebec and Montreal.

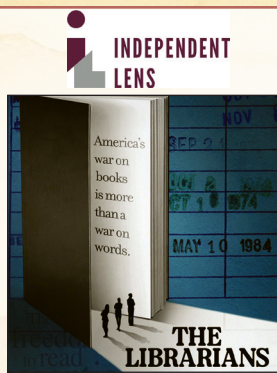
