SECOND MAJOR STRUCTURE FIRE AT HRPC MAIN ADMINISTRATION BUILDING BROUGHT UNDER CONTROL

POUGHKEEPSIE, NY — Early this morning, the Fairview Fire District and its mutual aid partners successfully contained a major structure fire at the HRPC property's Main Administration Building. Fortunately, no injuries have been reported.

At 4:56 a.m. on Monday, June 8, 2026, the Fairview Fire District was dispatched following reports of heavy fire visible in the area of the Main Administration Building. First-arriving units encountered an active and well-involved fire that had already consumed multiple floors of the structure.

Incident Command was immediately established. Given the size and scope of the blaze, mutual aid was requested to the scene to assist with aggressive fire suppression efforts and to provide standby coverage for the district.

To battle the heavy flames, firefighters deployed four elevated master streams and utilized numerous hydrants. Through the coordinated efforts of all responding personnel, the fire was officially declared under control after approximately one hour and 45 minutes.

No civilian or firefighter injuries have been reported in connection with this incident.

Fire suppression units continue to operate at the scene to manage hot spots and ensure the area is safe. The cause and origin of the fire are currently the subject of a joint investigation being conducted by the Dutchess County Fire Investigation Bureau, the Town of Poughkeepsie Police Department, and the New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control.

Further updates will be provided as the investigation progresses.
