Value: KRWG Public Media serves southwest New Mexico and far west Texas by supporting families looking to supplement early childhood education programs with nearly 50 hours of children's programs every week along with access to PBS Kids anytime.

Serving our community: KRWG Public Media provides in-depth news and information for our borderland region through feature news reporting and interviews for digital, television, and radio. KRWG Public Media's local newscasts for television, radio and digital platforms, and an evening student-produced newscast for television ensure our region stays updated and informed. KRWG Public Media's music and entertainment programs celebrate and preserve the arts, and programs from across the globe share updated news, information and entertainment.

Community impact: Our local programming offers indepth reporting and an open dialogue on important issues facing our region through news magazine programs, talk shows, student broadcasts, special programming and candidate forums. This programming is supported by community engagement and helps keep viewers and listeners informed.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING

KRWG Public Media serves our borderland region with nearly 50 hours of children's programming every week and nearly 2,600 hours per year on our PBS channel along with PBS Kids, available 24-7. KRWG's programming offers additional educational resources for families we serve. KRWG Public Media also hosts engagement events to educate our community members in our service area of this invaluable programming and learning resource.

AREAS OF IMPACT

Education: KRWG Public Media provides an abundance of popular children's television programs like "Sesame Street" and "Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood". PBS Kids offers on-demand programs and resources for families we serve. On television, programs like "Nature" and "Nova" introduce us to new research that helps us better understand our world and universe.

Arts & Culture: "Masterpiece" keeps us in suspense with mystery and drama. "American Masters" and "Austin City Limits" provide an up-close look at artists and concerts that leave us wanting an encore. On KRWG-FM, classical music, jazz, blues and Latin music keep us company throughout the week.

News & Public Affairs: "PBS NewsHour", NPR News, special news coverage, and local and regional news from KRWG Public Media continue to be trusted sources of accurate information. KRWG Public Media produces local election news with in-depth features, candidate interviews, and candidate forums, helping voters learn more about who and what is on the ballot.

LOCAL PROGRAMMING

KRWG-FM Programming

Every weekday, we provide our radio audience with six local newscasts, an hour-long weekend program revisiting recent stories and interviews from the week, 10 hours of a locally hosted and produced bilingual Latin music program, and a call-in program that provides an open platform for dialogue with our community.

This half-hour live television newscast, produced by New Mexico State University students, airs three nights every week during the Fall and Spring semesters.

Trails of Enchantment

This travel television program allows viewers to discover the special places and moments we celebrate in the borderland.

Borderland Storytellers

This television program uses storytelling to preserve history and culture in the region.

Newsmakers

This weekly half-hour news program airs on television from KRWG Public Media on Thursdays at 7 p.m., Saturdays at 5 p.m., and 11 a.m. on Sundays. It features interviews and reporting focused on issues facing our region.

Fronteras: A Changing America

This weekly half-hour television program features conversations about our borderland communities and the people who are changemakers within those communities.

Your Legislators

During New Mexico Legislative sessions, this weekly half-hour program on television features indepth discussions with state office holders from the region to learn more about how they are addressing issues facing their constituents.

Las Cruces Mayor's Top Teens

This program highlights interviews with young scholars and student role models in Las Cruces.

PROVIDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR FUTURE BROADCASTERS

KRWG Public Media is a training ground for the next generation of journalists. New Mexico State University students gain professional experience by participating in News22, a half-hour local television newscast produced by students during the Fall and Spring semesters. Staff members of KRWG Public Media support students as they gain experience that will help open doors to internships and careers. NMSU students also serve as crew members for KRWG's in-studio productions. Students can also participate in the field of sports broadcasting with AggieVision, which produces coverage of NMSU athletic events.

KRWG PUBLIC MEDIA SCHOLAR PROGRAM

KRWG Public Media allows for future broadcast journalists to go beyond a traditional internship and gain real experience through the KRWG Public Media Scholar Program. This program allows a motivated NMSU student to gain real-world broadcast and multimedia journalism experience with the KRWG News team.

In 2024-2025, KRWG Public Media's scholar produced award-winning stories on issues that included access to safe drinking water, housing, and threats against elected officials.
