Sacred Planet with Gulnaz Khan

~ Begins Wednesday, September 10, at 10:00 pm ~



A NEW FOUR-PART SERIES explores how climate change is reshaping sacred spaces and traditions around the world. **Sacred Planet** is hosted by environmental journalist and TED Climate Editor Gulnaz Khan. Truly cinematic in its approach, the series was filmed in Africa (Mauritania, Senegal and Ethiopia), Japan, Colombia and Peru, and is a deeply personal and often troubling examination of how climate change is having an impact on some of the most hallowed places on the planet. At the same time, it's also a powerful account of how faith leaders worldwide are drawing on ancient wisdom and spiritual resilience to confront the crisis with hope and action in this powerful documentary. Both an elegy for what's vanishing and a call to protect what remains, it's rooted in the belief that our connection to the earth is intrinsic to who we are – and to how we survive.

Gulnaz starts her journey in the sacred mountains of Colombia with the Arhuaco people, one of the few Indigenous groups to preserve their spiritual traditions after colonization. Calling themselves the Elder Brothers, they carry a vital message for humanity. In Africa's Sahel, Muslims and Christians join forces with scientists, refining traditional practices that promise to hold back the Sahara and its shifting sands. Global warming is

upending centuries-old Shinto and Buddhist traditions in Japan. As ancient shrines and temples face rising challenges, they also inspire new paths in reforestation and conservation. In Peru, Gulnaz follows the ancient Inca and modern Catholic paths confronting the Andes' deglaciation. These spiritual traditions unite through engineering, pilgrimages, lawsuits, and prayer to face Peru's climate crisis. Human premieres on NOVA

A ROUND 300,000 YEARS AGO, Homo sapiens emerged in Africa – one of at least seven human species alive at the time. Today, we are the only remaining human line, and our impact on the planet is undeniable. In this cinematic five-part series on **NOVA**, paleoanthropologist Ella Al-Shamahi traces the astounding story of human origins. Powered by cutting-edge science and remarkable fossil discoveries, this journey through our ancestors' world reveals great innovations, epic migrations, and pivotal encounters with long-vanished human species.

“For centuries, we have been the most influential animal on Earth, so it would be easy to assume that we were always destined for greatness, but in reality,

we started as just one of many human species and, arguably, the underdog of the group,” said Al-Shamahi. “Our understanding of this remarkable journey is still filled with mystery, but in the last few years, the discovery of new human species and a revolution in DNA technology has drastically changed our understanding of our own history, making this the perfect time to tell the story of our origins.” (Credit: © BBC Studios.) ■

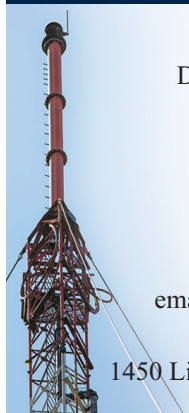

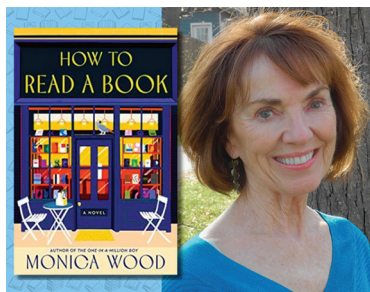

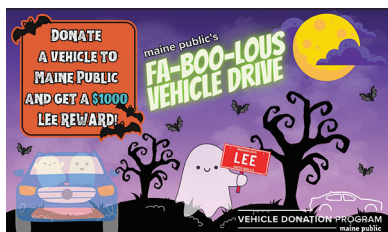
Author **Monica Wood** featured in September's **Maine Public Book Club**

In season one of **Big Cats 24/7**, an international team of filmmakers revealed new insights from the secret world of wild big cats. With unparalleled access in a rarely visited area, the filmmakers have returned to Botswana's Okavango Delta to

follow up on the extraordinary lives of lions, leopards, and cheetahs. Filming day and night in the heart of the wilderness, the team captures the big cats' battle to survive through dramatic changes within their families and their home. Series two continues to follow the stars featured in the first series, as well as introducing some new faces and new challenges. Trouble looms as intruder lions close in on one pride's young cubs. Rising floodwaters cause new tensions, and mothers fight to keep their cubs alive.
