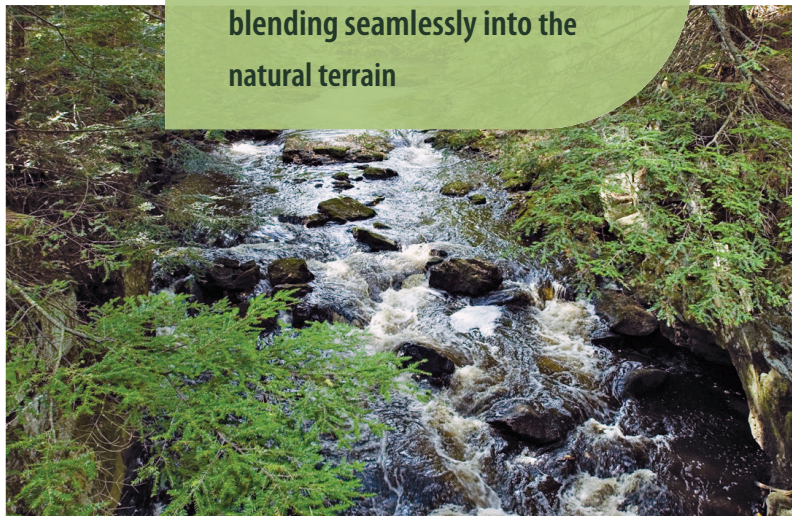

The Celebration

In 2014, 46.1 miles of the Upper Missisquoi and Trout Rivers (UMATR) in northern Vermont were given the Wild and Scenic designation from the United States Congress. The rivers are now managed through a partnership with the National Park Service, state government, and the eight communities that these rivers flow through. In 2024, to celebrate ten years of designation, the UMATR committee and others who made this happen hosted a 10-year Wild and Scenic seven-day paddle to celebrate this accomplishment. Along the way, filmmaker Duane Peterson III captured moments that reveal what it means to be a federally designated Wild and Scenic river.

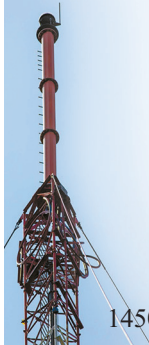

An Evening with Alan Taylor

Wednesday, May 20, 5:00 to 6:30 pm
First Parish Church in Portland

Join the Maine Historical Society for an unforgettable evening with two-time Pulitzer Prize-winning historian Alan Taylor. You may recognize Taylor, a Maine native, as he is featured throughout Ken Burns' popular documentary, **The American Revolution**.

Alan Taylor's live Portland program will be held on May 20 and begins with a lecture at First Parish Church, exploring the challenging experience of a Continental Army soldier through the story of Joseph Plumb Martin of Connecticut. Enlisting at just 15, Martin served nearly the entire war, witnessing Valley Forge and Yorktown.

Following the lecture, Taylor will join Steve Bromage, Executive Director of Maine Historical Society, for a conversation about Maine's role in the Revolution, Taylor's Maine roots, and his participation in **The American Revolution**.

After the program, there will be a reception at the Maine Historical Society featuring light refreshments and the opportunity to explore MHS's 2026 signature exhibition, **Pathways to Freedom: Maine Stories of the American Revolution**, including a rare viewing of their copy of the Dunlap Broadside of the Declaration of Independence. Maine Public is very pleased to be a Media Sponsor of this event, and Maine Public Members can purchase tickets at a reduced price. And on Sunday, May 10, our team will broadcast live from Broadturn Farm in Scarborough for their annual Mother's Day festivities. Maine Public Radio brings us a new monthlong series from **Call to Mind** (Tuesdays at 2:00 p.m.) for Mental Health Awareness Month. The series comprises vivid and thoughtful explorations of vital mental health issues through thought-provoking interviews with top experts and people living with mental illness.

On Maine Public Television, we celebrate Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday with a special broadcast on Wednesday evening, May 6. **Life on Earth: Attenborough's Greatest Adventure** offers rare, behind-the-scenes insight into the making of his groundbreaking series, **Life on Earth**. On Monday, May 11, **Independent Lens** brings us **Natchez**. The film captures an unsettling clash between history and memory in a small Mississippi town. On May 15, **Great Performances** gives us the best seats in the house for Irving Berlin's **Top Hat**. Inspired by the iconic 1935 movie musical starring Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers, this revival features classics such as "Cheek to Cheek" and "Puttin' on the Ritz." And be sure to follow the action throughout May on **High School Quiz Show: Maine!** The academic competition heats up as we head to the Championship Match on June 4.

Life on Earth: Attenborough's Greatest Adventure

Wednesday, May 6, 8:00 pm

In 1976, Sir David Attenborough (who turns 100 on May 8) embarked on an ambitious three-year global odyssey to film an innovative documentary of unprecedented scale. Attenborough

and his team traveled to 40 countries to document over 600 species and faced extraordinary challenges along the way, including a coup in the Comoros, gunshots in Rwanda, and threats from Saddam Hussein's army in Iraq. Written and presented by Attenborough, **Life on Earth** set out to "tell the greatest story in all the world" – how life on our planet evolved.

Fifty years after production began, **Attenborough's Greatest Adventure** captures the triumphs and setbacks of filming the series during a pivotal era in television history. **Life on Earth** became the first worldwide natural history blockbuster, mesmerizing viewers with incredible photography and transforming public perception of the natural world. Its extraordinary success launched five decades of ambitious wildlife storytelling and cemented Attenborough's legacy as the most successful and influential wildlife filmmaker of our time. *(Credit: Anuschka Schofield.)* ■

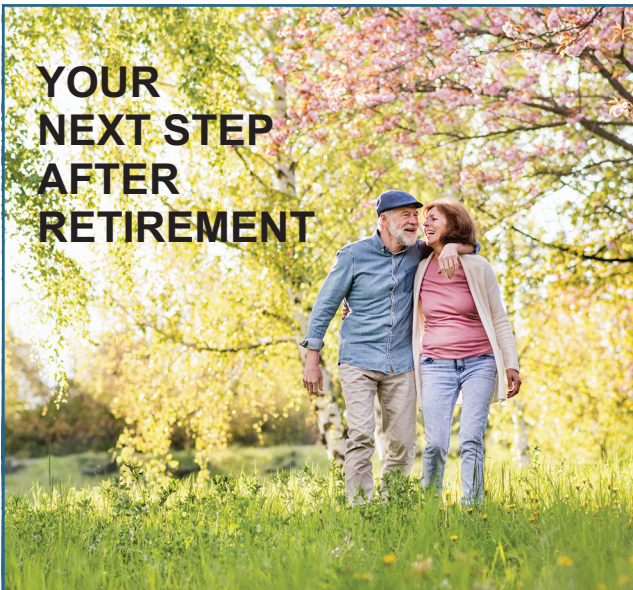


W.E.B. Du Bois: Rebel With a Cause

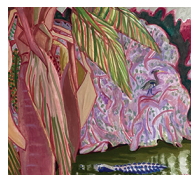
