THERE'S A NEW DETECTIVE ON THE STREETS of Paris. Benjamin Wainwright stars as Jules Maigret in the upcoming contemporary adaptation of Georges Simenon's beloved novels. The streetwise Parisian Chief Inspector heads the elite police unit known as La Crim, responsible for investigating all serious crimes in and around Paris. Maigret is an unconventional young detective with something to prove, relentless in his investigations, with an uncanny ability to get under the skin of the criminals he

is chasing and a matchless knowledge of Paris and its inhabitants. His unconventional methods and unique sense of justice put him at odds with his superiors and the judicial system he is supposed to represent. ARE YOU READY FOR A HEIST? On November 26, 1983, a group of men dressed in security uniforms broke into a warehouse just outside of London's Heathrow Airport, hoping to find large sums of foreign currency. Instead, they found 6,800 gold bars, diamonds, and cash. What began as a routine armed robbery turned into one of the biggest heists in British history. Inspired by true events, a gripping drama uncovers the Brink's-Mat robbery in London and the decades-long ripple effects that followed. **The Gold**, starring Hugh Bonneville, Jack Lowden, and a stellar ensemble cast, reenacts an extraordinary and epic story of criminal daring and investigators who were determined to solve the case. 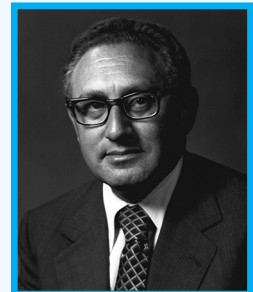

On Maine Public Television, we are pleased to bring you the **2025 Maine Sports Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony** on Thursday, October 2, at 8:00 p.m. The ceremony will honor 10 outstanding athletes and sports figures who have brought distinction to the state of Maine. On Sunday evening, October 5, Hugh Bonneville returns to **Masterpiece** with **The Gold**, a criti-

cally acclaimed crime drama inspired by the true story of one of the largest robberies in British history – the 1983 Brink's-Mat robbery. **American Masters** is back on the 14<sup>th</sup> with **Marlee Matlin: Not Alone Anymore**. In 1987, Marlee Matlin became the first Deaf actor to win an Academy Award and was thrust into the spotlight at 21 years old. Reflecting on her life in her primary language of American Sign Language, Marlee explores the complexities of what it means to be a trailblazer. The new season of **Nature** premieres October 22 on Think Wednesday with **Walrus: Life on Thin Ice**.

On Maine Public Classical, be sure to tune in on Saturday morning, October 4, for a special **Songbook**. Host Sarah Tuttle welcomes autumn with folk music from a variety of traditions, including France, Croatia, Greece, and Slovenia. We'll hear soprano Anna Prohaska performing a Medieval French melody about woodland animals, tenor Nicky Spence as soloist in Bartok's "Village Scenes" arrangements of Slovakian folksongs, and much more!

## Marlee Matlin: Not Alone Anymore on American Masters

Tuesday, October 14, 9:00 pm

The pioneering actress, activist and author shares her story in her native American Sign Language. **Not Alone Anymore** explores Marlee Matlin's life as a groundbreaking performer. Her meteoric and tumultuous rise to fame started at the age of 21 when she was thrust into the national spotlight, becoming for many Americans the first Deaf person they saw on TV, and overnight becoming the de-facto representative of the Deaf community. Included is footage of Matlin behind the scenes on the sets of some of her most iconic roles, including "Children of a Lesser God," "The West Wing" and "Seinfeld."

The film features never-before-seen home video recorded over the course of her 37-year career by her longtime interpreter and producing partner Jack Jason. Also helping to tell her story are interviews with her close friends and family along with colleagues Henry Winkler, Aaron Sorkin, Lauren Ridloff and others.

"Her talent, charisma and resilience have made her a role model for millions around the world," said American Masters Executive Producer Michael Kantor. ■

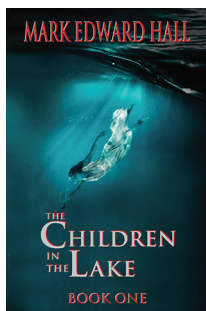
