She also reunites with very special guest Andrew Lloyd Webber for a beautiful new arrangement of "Christmas Dream," a holiday classic written by Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice.

Pearl Harbor – Into the Arizona

Pearl Harbor – Into the Arizona joins a landmark expedition to the *USS Arizona*, one of the most sacred war graves in the world. It follows an expedition team that uses an advanced ROV (remotely operated underwater vehicle) to explore the lower decks of the *USS Arizona* for the first time since it sank. Over a thousand men aboard the ship lost their lives; almost half of the total casualties from Pearl Harbor occurred on the *USS Arizona* alone.

Into the Arizona features interviews with several Pearl Harbor survivors, including Don Stanton, one of the few remaining survivors of the *USS Arizona*. Stanton joins the expedition team and watches a live video feed from the ROV as it explores inside his ship, a sight he never thought he would see again.

Never before seen 8mm movies transport viewers back to the days aboard the *Arizona* prior to the attack and provide the human backstory to the ghostly reminders uncovered by the modern-day exploration.

Pearl Harbor – Into the Arizona airs on 3-2 Tuesday, the 7th at 7:00 p.m. and Thursday, the 16th at 7:00 p.m. Watch it on 3-1 Tuesday, the 7th at 8:00 p.m.

Swamp Ghost

On February 23, 1942, following America's first heavy bomber offensive raid of World War II, a bullet-riddled U.S. B-17E bomber crash landed in a remote swamp in Papua New Guinea. The crew of nine survived, and over the next six weeks battled malaria and heat exhaustion as they made their way to safety. The mostly intact Flying Fortress was left behind and would be subsequently lost for decades.

In 1972, 30 years after the crash, Australian soldiers spotted the partially submerged aircraft from a helicopter. They found the plane "eerily untouched," earning the aircraft the nickname "Swamp Ghost."

Swamp Ghost documents the mission to bring this once-forgotten piece of history home after a half-century in the soggy marsh. The film follows an aircraft recovery expert and his team as they trek through crocodile and insect-infested swamps and overcome logistical challenges to recover the long-lost aircraft and honor the history it represents. The film culminates with scenes of "Swamp Ghost" on permanent display at the Pacific Museum in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

Swamp Ghost airs on 3-2 Tuesday, the 7th at 8:00 p.m. Watch it on 3-1 Tuesday, the 7th at 9:00 p.m.



Royal Flying Doctor Service

Based on extraordinary real-life stories, the **Royal Flying Doctor Service** is a gripping eight-part drama that follows the modern-day heroes—pilots, doctors, nurses and support staff—of the Royal Flying Doctor Service as they navigate private lives as turbulent as the heart-stopping emergencies they attend to across some of the most beautiful and inhospitable places in the Australian outback.

As season one begins, a doctor escaping her past joins the Royal Flying Doctor Service on a day when a catastrophic emergency retrieval hits the team personally. Together they deal with the fallout, all while continuing their highly skilled work, fighting the clock and the elements to save people having the worst day of their lives.

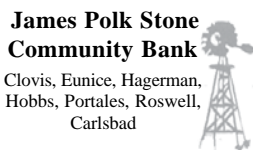

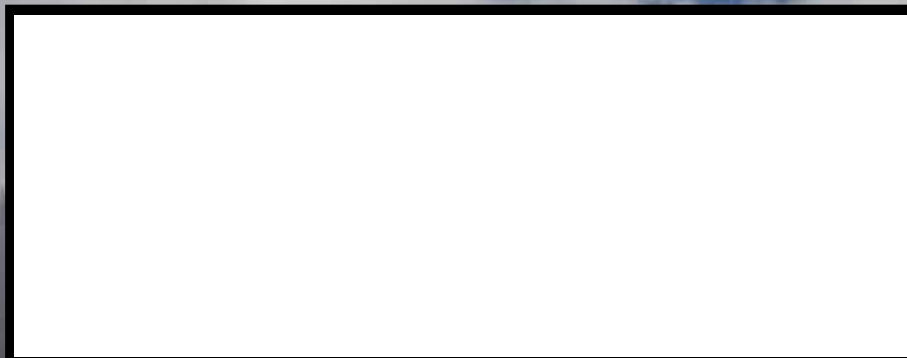
