



Shared Planet

Begins Wednesday,
April 29, 10:00 pm

A four-part documentary series displays how people and wildlife are thriving together worldwide, from urban nature projects to Kenyan savannahs, Mexican agave fields and coral reefs, revealing sustainable ways humans and nature coexist. Despite 60% of the world's population living in cities, there's hope for urban wildlife. The first episode, "Cities" travels from Los Angeles to Kolkata, highlighting inspiring stories of people reshaping their communities and sharing space with wildlife. In Los Angeles, a mountain lion unites a community, while in Kolkata, locals clean the urban wetlands, creating incredible wildlife habitat and supporting thousands of jobs. And in futuristic Singapore, reforestation efforts have transformed the city, enhancing life for citizens and attracting birds like hornbills. The series spans dozens of countries and visits people from all walks of life who are interacting with nature in innovative ways. ■


An Invitation to Wonder

Lucy Worsley Investigates: The American Revolution

Could the American Revolution have been avoided?

On the eve of America's 250th anniversary, popular British historian Lucy Worsley investigates the sabotage, espionage, and unrest that led to the birth of a new nation.

In 1776, 13 American colonies declared independence from one of the most powerful empires in the world, igniting a bloody eight-year war that claimed thousands of lives and ended in Britain's humiliating defeat. But how did this historic rupture come to pass, and did it have to happen at all? Over two episodes, Lucy delves deeper into the American Revolution by examining it from the British perspective. Consulting with experts and scouring evidence, she explores this lesser-told and fascinating aspect of the War of Independence. She discovers the human drama, radical ideas, and political missteps behind this seismic split, and reveals how losing America changed Britain forever.
