But faced with Louis’ solitary character, the mission turns out to be more complicated than expected.

Antoinette’s successes provoke jealousy and rivalry, and persistent rumors about her private life undermine her status. Her opponents within the royal family will do everything they can to bring her down.

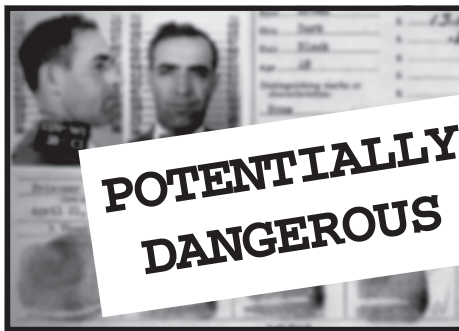
The Movement and the “Madman”

“The Movement and the ‘Madman’” on **American Experience** tells how two antiwar protests in the fall of 1969—the largest the country had ever seen—caused President Nixon to cancel what he called his “madman” plans for a massive escalation of the U.S. war in Vietnam, including his threats to use nuclear weapons. At the time, protestors had no idea what they had prevented and how many lives they had saved.

Airing during the 50th anniversary decade of the Vietnam war, the film focuses on the grassroots October 15th “Moratorium”—a one-day national strike against the war by two million Americans—and on the dramatic November 15th “March Against Death.”

Told as a “political thriller,” the film is a David-and-Goliath tale that engages viewers in a “you-are-there” experience.

When It Was a Crime to be Italian

During World War II, the U.S. Government restricted the actions and freedoms of 600,000 Italian residents of the United States. All were declared “Enemy Aliens,” and many were placed under curfew, banned from their workplaces, evacuated from their homes and communities, and even placed in internment camps. Many of these people had been in the United States for decades, had children born in their adopted country, and had sons serving in the U.S. Military.

Interned Italians were not charged with a crime or allowed legal representation. They were considered “Potentially Dangerous,” subjected to “loyalty hearings” and held for the duration of the war.

Even 80 years later, many Italians have remained silent about what happened to them. Hear their stories for the first time in this film.

Age of Easy Money

As the threat of recession looms around the world and inflation remains high, **Frontline** presents “Age of Easy Money”—a two-hour special that charts the American economy’s tumultuous course since the Great Recession, the current uncertainty and fragility, and the role of the Federal Reserve.

“Age of Easy Money” investigates the Fed’s epic economic experiment to revive the economy with what has been called an “easy money” policy, and the far-reaching and unintended consequences—including a widening gap between Main Street and Wall Street. With the Fed now pulling back on its “easy money” policy, the country and the world may be entering a new economic era.

The film draws on two years of reporting and interviews with prominent financial players, leading economic thinkers, current and former top-level Fed insiders, members of Congress and the Biden administration, and people impacted by the country’s economic policies. It reveals what led to the Fed’s recent decisions to hike interest rates at a historic pace, and shows the ongoing effects—economic anxiety, fears of recession, concerns about public and private debt, and uncertainty about what comes after the age of easy money.

Hidden Letters



In “Hidden Letters” on **Independent Lens**, the parallels of struggles among generations of women in China are drawn together by the once-secret written language of Nüshu, the only script designed and used exclusively by women who were otherwise forbidden to read or write.

Throughout history, women have survived the stifling strictures of patriarchy by using their own codes of communication—be it whisper networks or gestures legible only to other women. Centuries ago in China women went further, inventing an entire language that they used to write songs, poetry and furtive messages to one another.

“Hidden Letters” dwells on the everyday lives of two modern women, capturing the stray misogyny leveled at them by their partners, fathers, bosses, customers and even strangers. Like a totem from their ancestors, Nüshu helps these women reckon with their own lives and ambitions.

Independent Lens “Hidden Letters” airs on Monday, the 27th at 9:00 p.m. It airs on 3-1 Friday, the 31st at 9:00 p.m.
