

MY FUNNY VALENTINE

On February 12, 1964, during the height of the Civil Rights Movement, Miles Davis appeared at New York's recently built Philharmonic Hall at Lincoln Center (now David Geffen Hall) in a concert to benefit the Congress of Racial Equality, the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee and the NAACP Legal Defense Fund.

Joining Miles were George Coleman, Ron Carter, Tony Williams and a young Herbie Hancock. Unbeknownst to them until moments before the concert started, Miles had decided they would all donate their fee to the cause. Despite the consternation that decision caused — or perhaps because of it — they played with a distinctive fire and brilliance.

The unforgettable performance was recorded, ultimately yielding two future releases for Columbia records, ***My Funny Valentine: Miles Davis in Concert*** and ***Four and More***. JazzNEO will feature selections from both on February 12. Don't miss it!
