What do you do when the lights go out? There's a power outage and Rosie and Javi have a problem to solve. Rosie finds out that before electricity, people played, prepared food and did all sort of things. After watching the video, what did you notice?

- What happened when the lights went out?
- How did Rosie and her family solve the problem together?
- What kinds of light can be used when electricity is not working?

Do:

It's your turn to explore light and shadows just like Rosie! Create your own shadow theatre with a cellphone flashlight or a battery-powered flashlight. Follow these steps:

- Darken a room by closing curtains or turning off lights.
- Create shadows onto a wall using your hands, toys, or paper cut-out shapes.
- Tell a short shadow story or act out what happened in the Lights Out episode.

Chat:

After you have made your patterns, take a few minutes to talk together:

- What objects made the best shadows?
- How did the shadows change when you moved the light or your hands?
