



Dr. James Hill graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point, NY in May 1981, and has a graduate degree from Stanford University, where he earned a Master's Degree in Operations Research Engineering. He attended the University of Florida College of Medicine, where he earned his Doctorate in Medicine in 1996, and completed OBGYN residency in the military in June 2000. He then completed a three-year fellowship in Maternal-Fetal Medicine at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School, Parkland Hospital in Dallas, Texas in 2003. In 2009, while on active duty in the US Army, he was deployed with the 21st Combat Support Hospital in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

He is currently a member of the OBGYN Department at Baylor College of Medicine in San Antonio, Texas, where he serves as the Medical Director of Labor & Delivery at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Hospital at Westover Hills, Chairman, Department of OBGYN, and the Maternal Fetal-Medicine Division Director.

Dr. Hill actively participates on multiple state committees addressing maternal morbidity and mortality, contributing to case reviews, policy recommendations, and efforts to reduce disparities in maternal health outcomes. He is the former Co-Chair of the Texas Collaborative for Healthy Mothers and Babies Obstetrics Committee, TexasAIM Faculty member for the Hypertension and Sepsis in Pregnancy Bundle, member of the Texas Perinatal Advisory Council, and member of the Texas Maternal Morbidity and Mortality Review Committee. In these roles, he collaborates with multidisciplinary teams to review cases, identify contributing factors and develop actional recommendations to reduce disparities and improve care quality.

Dr. Hill was also named as an Endowed Chair at the Children's Hospital of San Antonio to allow further advancement in education and research in the field of Maternal-Fetal-Medicine. He was recently awarded a National Institute of Health grant Modernizing Perinatal Syphilis Testing to serve as a Principal Co-Investigator at CHRISTUS Children's Hospital. He is also the recent recipient of the Baptist Health Foundation grant and serves as the Co-Principal Investigator for the *Chef's Table: Crafting Meals for Gestational Wellness* project. Dr. Hill is also an exceptional teacher, and has earned numerous teaching awards including the national CREOG Teaching Award, the national APGO Excellence in Teaching Award in Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the Fred T. Given Faculty Teaching Award at Eastern Virginia Medical School. Dr. Hill has received numerous awards and has co-authored a multitude of papers that have been published in peer review journals. His mental health team achieved a major milestone with their first manuscript accepted into a peer-reviewed journal in January 2026, and they're already working on submitting two more papers this year.
