Julius Caesar: The Making of a Dictator

Tuesdays, April 2-16, 9:00 pm

A NEW THREE-PART HISTORICAL DOCUDRAMA tells the dramatic story of how nearly five centuries of ancient Roman democracy was overthrown in just 16 years – by one man. It's a tale of a brazen, ambitious power-grab that saw Julius Caesar consolidate the vast power of Rome in his own hands.

The series is told through the eyes of an expert cast of British and American historians, scholars, and political operatives (including a former head of MI5). Illustrated with artful dramatic moments and packed with contemporary resonances, the series has all the elements of the best political thrillers, with complex power dynamics playing out for enormous stakes. In the beginning, Caesar (played by Andonis Anthony) entered into dangerous alliances and bent the rules of the Republic in his bid to become Consul: the highest political position in Rome. One man, however, Cato, was hellbent on bringing him down. When events beyond Caesar's control threatened to unravel his plans and leave him isolated, he made a decision that would change the course of the Republic, and Western history, forever. Mr. Bates vs The Post Office

Premieres Sunday, April 7, 9:00 pm

BASED ON A TRUE STORY, **Mr. Bates vs The Post Office** on **Masterpiece** shines a light on a major transgression in the UK justice system. When money started to seemingly disappear from its local branches, the government-owned Post Office wrongly blamed their own managers for its apparent loss. For more than a decade, hundreds were accused of theft and fraud, and many were even sent to prison – leaving lives, marriages, and reputations in ruins. But the issue was actually caused by errors in the Post Office's own computer system – something it denied for years. Revealing a shocking David vs. Goliath fight for justice, this is the story of the decent ordinary people who were relentlessly pursued, coerced and controlled by a powerful corporation, and their ongoing battle, against seemingly insurmountable odds, to right so many horrific wrongs.



Poisoned Ground: The Tragedy at Love Canal

Monday, April 22, 9:00 pm

THE 1970S LOVE CANAL DISASTER was one of the most notorious environmental and public health disasters in US history. The battle for justice, led mostly by women, created the basis for the landmark federal Superfund program. **Poisoned Ground** on **American Experience** tells the dramatic and inspiring story of the ordinary women who fought against overwhelming odds for the health and safety of their families. In the late 1970s, residents of Love Canal, a working-class neighborhood in Niagara Falls, New York, discovered that their homes, schools and playgrounds were built on top of a former chemical waste dump, which was

now leaking toxic substances and wreaking havoc on their health. Through interviews with many of the extraordinary housewives turned activists, the film shows how they effectively challenged those in power, forced America to reckon with the human cost of unregulated industry, and created a grassroots movement that galvanized the landmark Superfund Bill. 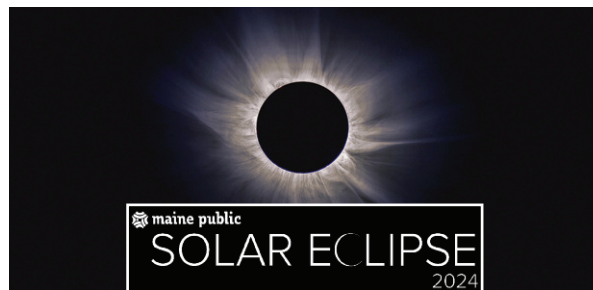

Our Future Driven Student Challenge Results

Maine Public's Future Driven: A Youth Climate Story Challenge wrapped up last month and we were amazed with the creativity and passion in all of the contest submissions. In the Challenge, we had called upon high school students in Maine to tell climate stories surrounding them and their communities. Submissions came in from across the state, ranging from songs, to painting, to essays, and graphics. All of the submissions were insightful and impactful, touching on a multitude of topics including agriculture, flooding, and animal life.

The winner of the Future Driven contest was **Katherine Mitchell**, from The Ecology Learning Center in Unity, who submitted a painting (pictured above) along with a written essay, explaining the thought process behind the painting. In second place was **Thea Dugas**, a freshman from Portland High School, who wrote an essay about her own climate activism. Third place was **Etta Hughes**, again from The Ecology Learning Center, who composed and sang a song about her experience with climate change and watching it affect the world around her. Our fourth and fifth place finalists were from Berwick Academy, **Lucy Manley** and **Ronan McDonald**. Lucy submitted a graphic essay in the style of a newspaper about the sea levels rising in southern Maine and Ronan submitted a graphic essay, also in newspaper style, about flooding and water usage on golf courses in Maine. Thank you to everyone who submitted and to the winning students!

Thursday, April 25, 9:00 pm; Saturday, April 27, 2:00 pm:

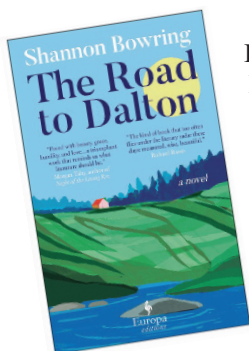
