

ALAMANCE-BURLINGTON BOARD OF EDUCATION

**RESOLUTION REGARDING**  
**SCHOOL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026-27**

WHEREAS, The Alamance-Burlington Board of Education, having carefully considered the expectations of its citizens, and the needs of the school system, its employees, and most importantly, its students, requested \$61,965,000 in local current expense funds, \$7,010,000 in capital outlay funds, and \$18,302,731 in capital improvement funds from the Alamance County Board of Commissioners for Fiscal Year 2026-2027; and

WHEREAS, the Alamance County Board of Commissioners approved its Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget at its meeting on June 15, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Alamance County Board of Commissioners' budget appropriated \$58,763,376 to the Board of Education's local current expense fund, \$4,820,500 to the capital outlay fund, and \$9,400,000 in capital improvement funds; and


WHEREAS, having considered the amount of funds budgeted by the Alamance County Board of Commissioners for current expense, capital outlay, and capital improvement for the Alamance-Burlington School System for the 2026-27 fiscal year; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ALAMANCE-BURLINGTON BOARD OF EDUCATION:

1. That the amount of money appropriated by the Alamance County Board of Commissioners for the 2026-2027 school year to the Board of Education's local current expense funds, capital outlay funds and capital improvement funds are not sufficient under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 115C-431, or otherwise, to support a system of free public schools; and
2. That the Chairman of the Board of Education, the Superintendent, and Board of Education attorneys are directed to take all appropriate steps under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 115C-431 to arrange for a joint meeting of the Board of Education and the Board of County Commissioners as provided in that statute, and to otherwise implement the procedure for resolving budget disputes between boards of education and county commissioners as to the appropriation to the Board of Education for local current expense, capital outlay, and capital improvement; and
3. That the attorneys for the Board of Education are authorized to jointly select a mediator for this budget dispute in conjunction with the Board of County Commissioners, or in the alternative, to contact the Senior Resident Superior Court Judge to appoint a mediator as provided in N.C.


